SUBJECT: Replace Altitude Valve at Industrial Park Tank

BACKGROUND:

It has become necessary to replace the altitude valve at the Industrial Park Water Tank.
 City personnel have repaired the valve several times over the years, but due to age,
 parts are no longer available. Due to this fact and leakage from the vault that houses it
 going onto Anderson-Dubose/McDonald Distribution Center property, it must be
 replaced.

FISCAL IMPACT:

- The Water Department received a quote of \$12,929.00 from G&C Supply for an 8-inch Watts altitude valve and start up labor. The Water Department also received a quote of \$15,187.00 from MB&R Contractors, Inc. to install the altitude valve and two 8-inch gate valves at the vault at the Industrial Park tank.
- The total for this project is \$28,116.00 and will be paid out of 18178-Water Line Replacement that is budgeted for the current fiscal year.







SUBJECT: Replace Bleach Tanks with Installation at Water Plant

BACKGROUND:

- The City received a quote of \$57,000.00 from Southeastern Tank for two (2) 4,500-gallon HDPE tanks to replace the current tanks which have become brittle over time and now leak. The City has received a quote of \$28,649.00 from MB&R Contractors, Inc. to install the above quoted tanks
- Installation of the new bleach tanks involves removal of part of the back wall of the current area occupied by the old bleach tanks. Water plant personnel have repaired and patched the tanks as much as possible and now must seek a more permanent remedy.

FISCAL IMPACT:

• The total cost of the project is \$85,649.00 and will require a budget amendment to (52113-259) for installation and another to (52113-262) for purchase of the tanks.

REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

I request approval of this expenditure as it is necessary to provide potable water to our customers.

Fee Schedule

BACKGROUND:

- This project involves the repair and partial replacement of the fire sprinkler system at
 the Jefferson City Community Center, specifically focusing on the areas surrounding the
 indoor pool and throughout the building on the existing sprinkler system. The work is
 being performed due to observed corrosion on existing fire sprinkler mains and the agerelated degradation of sprinkler heads throughout the facility.
- This will help with the safety of the building if a fire should ever occur. It will also eliminate the old, corroded piping that could crack or burst at any time.

FISCAL IMPACT:

- This is included in the 2025-2026 budget. The total amount budgeted for the project was \$169,000.00.
- The cost for the completion of this project is \$98,755.00. It comes in \$70,245.00 under budget.

REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

SCOPE OF WORK

Fire Sprinkler System Repair – Jefferson City Community Center Jefferson City, Tennessee

1. Project Overview

This project involves the repair and partial replacement of the fire sprinkler system at the Jefferson City Community Center, specifically focusing on the areas surrounding the indoor pool, and throughout the building on the existing sprinkler system. The work is being performed due to observed corrosion on existing fire sprinkler mains and the age-related degradation of sprinkler heads throughout the facility.

2. Scope of Services

The contractor will perform the following services:

A. Demolition & Removal

- Safely disconnect and remove the existing corroded sprinkler mains located at both ends of the pool area.
- Remove all existing sprinkler heads throughout the facility. B. Installation
- Fire Sprinkler Mains Replacement:
 - Install new fire sprinkler main piping at both ends of the pool, replacing sections that show heavy corrosion. All piping materials will meet applicable NFPA standards and be rated for use in wet environments.
- Connection to Existing Branch Lines:
 New mains will be connected to the existing overhead branch lines using approved union fittings to allow for secure, serviceable joints.
- Sprinkler Head Replacement:
 - Replace all sprinkler heads within the facility. This action is necessary due to the age of the existing heads and the environmental conditions around the indoor pool, which may contribute to corrosion and decreased performance.

C. Equipment Rental

• A 40-foot outreach boom lift will be rented and utilized for a duration of four (4) weeks to allow safe and effective access to overhead piping and sprinkler systems.
