ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOSHUA, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A SPECIAL ELECTION HELD ON SATURDAY, MAY 6, 2023, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ISSUE \$15,000,000 IN TAX-EXEMPT BONDS FOR A CITY HALL COMPLEX, INCLUDING A POLICE STATION; MAKING FINDINGS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Joshua, Texas, is a Texas Home Rule Municipality located in Johnson County, Texas, and created in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Joshua, Texas ("City Council"), issued an order on February 16, 2023, directing that a special election be held on May 6, 2023, for the purpose of authorizing the City to issue \$15,000,000 in tax-exempt bonds for a City Hall Complex, including a Police Station; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was properly given by the City as required by law; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on May 6, 2023, in the City and in full conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of said election have been certified and returned by the proper judge and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the returns of the special election held on May 6, 2023, and the special election returns, duly and legally made, showed that the following number of votes was cast for the bond proposition as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOSHUA, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct factual and legislative determinations of the City of Joshua and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2

It is further found and determined that the election was duly and properly ordered, that proper legal notice of such election was duly given in the English language and the Spanish language (to the extent required by law), that proper election officers were duly appointed prior to the election, that the election was duly and legally held, that all resident, qualified voters of the City were permitted to vote at the election, that due returns of the results of the election had been made and delivered, and that the City Council has duly canvassed such returns, all in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and of the United States of America, and the order calling the election.

SECTION 3

The total number of voters in the Bond Special Election was 334. A majority of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Joshua, Texas, voting in such election, voted AGAINST the authorization and issuance of \$15,000,000 of bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition A and the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition A failed at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law.

SECTION 4

If any word, section, article, phrase, paragraph, sentence, clause, or portion of this ordinance or application thereto to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance; and the City Council hereby declares it would have passed such remaining portions of this ordinance despite such invalidity which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5

It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code, as amended.

SECTION 6

This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOSHUA, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A SPECIAL ELECTION HELD ON SATURDAY, MAY 6, 2023, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY CERTAIN HOME-RULE CHARTER AMENDMENTS TO THE HOME-RULE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JOSHUA, TEXAS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY AND CONFLICTS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Joshua, Texas, is a Home Rule Municipality located in Johnson County, created in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Joshua, Texas, ("City Council"), issued an order on February 16, 2023, directing that a special election be held on May 6, 2023, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of Joshua certain Home-Rule Charter amendments; and

WHEREAS, notice of the special election was properly given by the City as required by law; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on May 6, 2023, in the City and in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of said election have been certified and returned by the proper judge and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the returns of said election held on May 6, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOSHUA, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct factual and legislative determinations of the City of Joshua and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2

A. The returns of the Special Election, including the returns of early voting ballots, held on Saturday, May 6, 2023, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City propositions regarding certain amendments to the City Charter of the

City of Joshua, Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "Charter Amendment Election"), showed that there were the following votes "Yes" and "No" for each of the following propositions:

PROPOSITION A

Shall Section 3.06 of the City Charter, entitled "Vacancies and Forfeiture of Office," be amended to provide that a member of the City Council may forfeit office if the member fails to attend three (3) consecutive regular City Council meetings without being excused by the City Council, and the City Council shall be the final judge in matters involving forfeiture of office by a member of the City Council?

B. Except for Proposition F, the above foregoing amendments to the City of Joshua, Texas, Home-Rule Charter having been approved by a majority of the qualified voters of the City who voted at the Charter Amendment Election, the said amendments are hereby declared adopted, in accordance with Section 9.005(a) of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended, and shall take effect immediately upon the passage of this Ordinance, in accordance with Section 9.005(b) of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended.

C. Except for Proposition F, the above and foregoing amendments having been adopted, it is hereby ordered that such amendments to the City Home-Rule Charter have been and are adopted, so that the provisions of the City Home-Rule Charter which were subject of the Charter Amendment Election shall read as adopted and added to the respective Home-Rule Charter as adopted.

D. The total number of voters in the Charter Amendment Election was 334.

SECTION 4

If any word, section, article, phrase, paragraph, sentence, clause, or portion of this ordinance or application thereto to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance; and the City Council hereby declares it

would have passed such remaining portions of this ordinance despite such invalidity which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5

This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.
