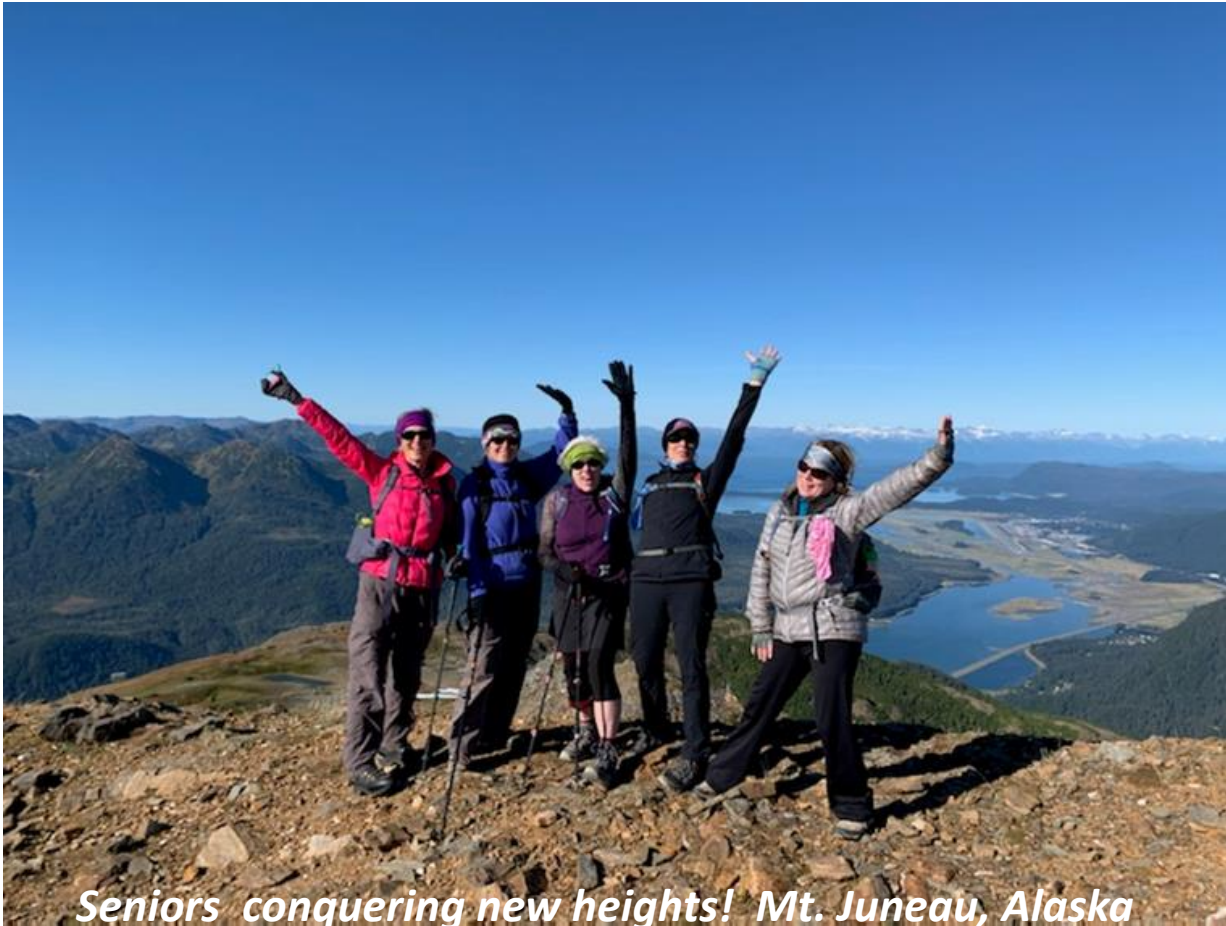

JUNEAU COMMISSION ON AGING PRIORITIES

DID YOU KNOW?

JUNEAU'S DEMOGRAPHIC SHIFT: The senior population in Southeast Alaska continues to grow faster than any other cohort. In 2010, only 11% of our population was 65 and over. By 2022, we had more than doubled and seniors now represents **25%** of our regional population (AKDOL).

FROM GRAY HAIR TO GREENBACKS: Juneau seniors bring “*silver dividends*” to our community: retirement income, home ownership and property tax payment, and a willingness to volunteer and contribute to the community on many levels.

JUNEAU'S FUTURE HINGES ON STRONG SENIOR SUPPORT: CBJ's current 10-year fiscal plan states that a top priority is to “grow the senior economy” and Juneau Commission on Aging asks CBJ to support Juneau seniors' unique needs as we age in this community that we love and many have called home for many years.

BUILDING AGE FRIENDLY COMMUNITY: We advocate for Juneau's aging, healthy and active seniors and for those with additional supportive needs via Juneau's Age Friendly Plan. Age friendly communities serve everyone aged 8 - 80 ensuring age friendly housing, and age friendly social spaces and recreational opportunities.

AGE FRIENDLY HOUSING – ACCESSIBLE FOR THOSE 8-80!



Our first Priority is to promote creation of **JUNEAU'S Age-Friendly Plan** for Juneau using the **AARP Age-Friendly Blueprint** as a springboard for action emphasizing **Age Friendly Housing and Recreation.**

RECREATION & SOCIALIZATION – KEY TO HEALTHY AGING!



Our second priority is to **Develop an Office of Aging Coordinator** within the City and Borough of Juneau to more effectively serve a segment representing **25%** of the population of our borough. This leadership position will focus specifically on issues that are relevant to our senior community such as **facilitating the Juneau's Age Friendly Community Plan, Age Friendly Housing, Senior Focused Recreation and Coordination amongst organizations serving the elder population.**

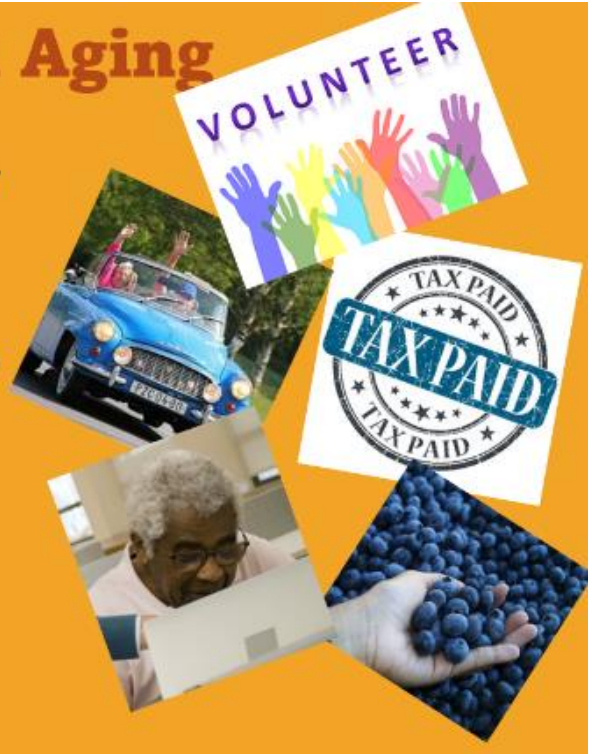


JUNEAU COMMISSION ON AGING SENIOR SURVEY 2020

Juneau Commission On Aging What we learned from 2020 Survey

2020 Seniors are healthier, wealthier and have better insurance than previous survey years

- 28.7% of Juneau residents are 55 and older
- 84% own their own homes and pay taxes
- 80-90% (depending on age) drive their own cars
- 63% volunteer in the community
- 95% over 65 have Medicare Insurance
- 66% over 65 have State of Alaska Retirement
- 40% have Long Term Care Insurance
- 42-46% (depending on age) take continuing education classes (UAS/CS)
- 72 – 84% (depending on age) recreate weekly (walking, hiking, swimming, gyms, skiing)

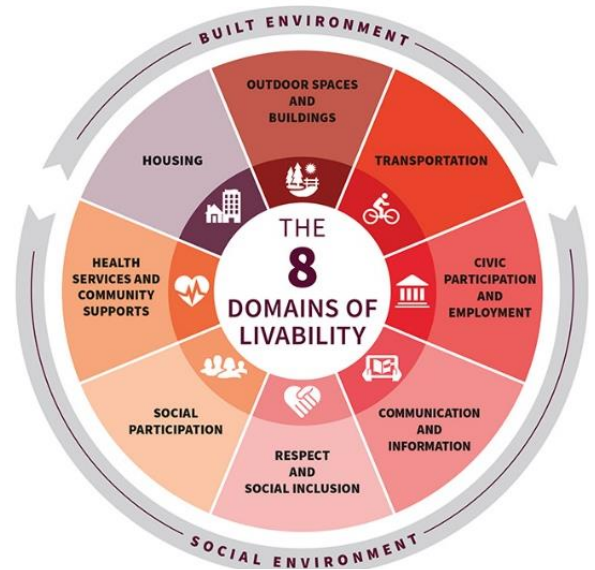

AARP engages with elected officials, partner organizations and local leaders to guide communities through the age-friendly network's assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation processes.

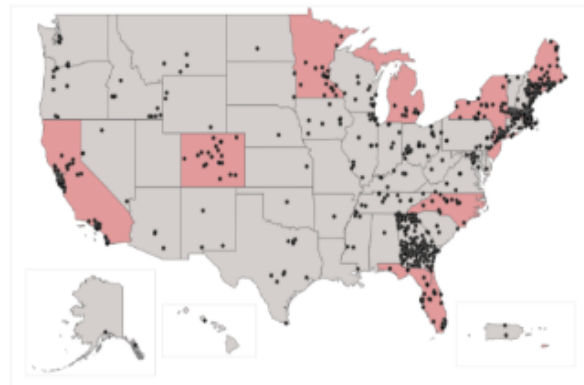
