 - 1. Resolution 3071 A Resolution of the City and Borough of Juneau Declaring a Local Emergency in Response to the August 2024 Glacier Outburst Flood and a Request for State and Federal Assistance.

CBJ <u>Charter 3.12(c)</u> authorizes the Assembly to call a special meeting to declare a disaster emergency. This resolution does that. The flooding from the glacier outburst flood that started yesterday is unprecedented, and a foot higher than last year (15.99' at 3:15 am this morning). It inundated hundreds of homes and displaced countless people. We had at least 43 people seek refuge in Floyd Dryden and countless others evacuated out of the area. Hundreds of vehicles were flooded. We are just starting to assess the damage, but it is more expansive than last year's flood. We anticipate the need for temporary and long term sheltering assistance; financial support to individuals and businesses; environmental clean up support due to fuel oil spills; and resources (people, equipment, supplies, and trash disposal) for flooded structures. As we continue with damage assessments, we will develop a more comprehensive understanding of the private and public damage caused by this natural disaster. Resolution 3071 would declare a local disaster emergency and request State and federal assistance.

The City Manager recommends the Assembly adopt this resolution.

5	RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

7 8 9 10	A Resolution of the City and Borough of Juneau Declaring a Local Emergency in Response to the August 2024 Glacier Outburst Flood and a Request for State and Federal Assistance.
11 12 13	WHEREAS, the City and Borough of Juneau ("CBJ") is a political subdivision of the State of Alaska; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, a side basin (Suicide Basin or K'óox Kaadí Basin) of the Mendenhall Glacier above Juneau, Alaska, has released outburst floods (also known as jökulhlaups) since 2011, with record flood events in August 2023 (14.82' preliminary crest on Mendenhall River) and now August 2024 (15.99' preliminary crest on Mendenhall River); and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, the August 2023 glacier outburst flood caused unprecedented damage (at that time) along the Mendenhall River, resulting in 20 to 150 feet of riverbank erosion in many places, the collapse of residences into the river, and major flooding in multiple areas with some homes inundated by over six feet of water; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, the total damage from the August 2023 glacier outburst flood is still being calculated and is expected to be in the millions of dollars; and
27 28 29	Whereas, after a glacier outburst flood that started on August 5, 2024, the CBJ sustained unprecedented damage to public infrastructure and private property; and
30 31 32	Whereas, the CBJ City Manager is the chief administrative officer, who reports to the Assembly (CBJ Charter 4.1 & 4.5); and
33 34 35	WHEREAS, the governing body of the CBJ is the Assembly, which has the legislative and policy-making powers (CBJ Charter 3.1), and the CBJ Mayor is the presiding officer with special powers in emergencies; and
36 37 38 39	WHEREAS, CBJ Charter 3.12(c) specifically allows the Assembly to call for a Special Assembly Meeting to declare an emergency without the normal 24-hour notice ("A special meeting at which a state of emergency is declared and identified by the assembly shall be a

legal meeting although proper notice may not have been given of the meeting."), see also CBJ Charter 5.4; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to CBJC 03.25.040(a) and A.S. 26.23.140, the declaration of the existence of a local emergency may be made by the CBJ City Manager and confirmed by the CBJ Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the following conditions exist: the extent of flooding is unprecedented; hundreds of homes were severely impacted by flooding, including homes outside anticipated flood areas; hundreds of vehicles were flooded; there were countless hazardous material spills causing portions of the Mendenhall River and floodwaters to smell like petroleum; 43 people sought refuge in an emergency shelter and countless others evacuated to other locations; public utilities and infrastructure were severely damaged; comprehensive damage and condemnation assessments are underway, but the extent and severity of the flooding for a large portion of the CBJ's primary residential area is likely to displace hundreds of people from their homes due to water and subsequent mold damage; and emergency response costs are significant; and

WHEREAS, given the severity and magnitude of the damage caused by the flooding, State and Federal assistance is needed to supplement local efforts to respond to and recover from the August 2024 glacier outburst flood; and

WHEREAS, the CBJ requests the Governor of the State of Alaska declare a disaster emergency and provide State assistance to the City and Borough in its response and recovery from damages and costs resulting from this natural disaster; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly authorizes the Manager to implement any orders necessary to protect the health and safety of the residents of the CBJ, including closing streets, foot bridges, and trails; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly further authorizes the Manager to allow emergency permitting and waivers under Title 19, Title 49, and Title 75 as it is reasonable and necessary to protect life and property, upon balancing the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly requests the Governor of the State of Alaska direct State officials to allow emergency permitting and waivers to State laws for people, businesses, and residences who need to take reasonable actions to protect life and property.

79 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF 80 JUNEAU, ALASKA: 81 82 Section 1. Local Emergency Declaration. The CBJ Manager and Assembly of 83 the City and Borough of Juneau declare a disaster emergency to exist within the City and 84 Borough of Juneau per CBJ Charter 3.12(c), CBJC 03.25.040(a), A.S. 26.23.140. A copy of 85 this Resolution shall be filed promptly with the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and 86 Emergency Management. 87 88 Section 2. Reasonable and Necessary Emergency Orders. Consistent with 89 CBJC 03.25.040(6) and CBJC 03.25.090, the Assembly authorizes the Manager to 90 implement any reasonable emergency orders necessary to protect the health, safety, or 91 welfare of the residents of the CBJ including closing streets, foot bridges, and trails, issuing 92 evacuation orders, and regulating activity on or near Mendenhall River; and to allow 93 emergency permitting and waivers under Title 19 and Title 49 as it is reasonable and 94 necessary to protect life and property, upon balancing the public health, safety, and welfare. 95 96 Section 3. Request for State and Federal Assistance. The City and Borough 97 of Juneau requests that the Governor of the State of Alaska declare a Local Disaster 98 Emergency to exist as provided per A.S. 26.23.140, to provide State public assistance and 99 individual assistance as may be available, assistance with emergency permitting within and 100 near Mendenhall River, and to request additional assistance from the federal government. 101 102 Section 4. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately after 103 its adoption. 104 105 Adopted this 6th day of August 2024. 106 107 108 Beth A.
