13 14	WHEREAS, the intersection of Egan Drive and Yandukin Drive in Juneau, Alaska (known locally as the Fred Meyer intersection) is the scene of many traffic collisions; and
15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) statistics show that from 2013-2022, there were thirteen collisions with suspected minor injuries and four with suspected serious injuries at that intersection; and
	WHEREAS, a recent accident at the intersection resulted in one fatality and multiple other vehicle passengers being medevacked to Seattle with serious injuries; and
20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, the northbound section of Egan Drive leading up to the Fred Meyer intersection is a mile of straight highway and the highway design encourages motorists to exceed the speed limit; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, the northbound lanes of Egan Drive lack horizontal or vertical curvature which may make it very difficult for southbound turning vehicles to judge depth perception and this may lead to an unnecessary number of accidents; and
31	WHEREAS, a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study examining potential safety improvements to this intersection was concluded in August of 2021; and
32 33 34 35 36 37	Whereas, the PEL study identified a partial access signalized intersection with a protected pedestrian crossing and Glacier Lemon Spur extension as the recommended alternative to improve transportation safety for all users; and
38 39 40 41	WHEREAS, because implementing any recommended alternative from the PEL could take several years, the project team identified an immediate need to improve safety as quickly as possible and developed a set of low-cost, effective treatments to improve safety that could be implemented through the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP); and

43 WHEREAS, DOT&PF awarded an HSIP project to SECON in April 2023, with a 44 completion date set for October 31, 2023; and 45 46 WHEREAS, that project would decrease the Egan Drive speed limit to 45 miles per hour 47 during the darkest months of the year and improve delineation at the intersection; and 48 49 WHEREAS, the recent accident occurred in broad daylight in the summer, which makes 50 it clear that the HSIP project can only serve as a temporary fix; and 51 52 WHEREAS, implementation of these near-term improvements does not negate the need 53 for substantial improvements to the intersection. 54 55 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF 56 JUNEAU, ALASKA: 57 58 Section 1. Implementation of Immediate and Substantial Improvements to the 59 Intersection of Egan Drive and Yandukin Drive Intersection. The City and Borough 60 of Juneau Assembly strongly encourages the Alaska Department of Transportation and 61 Public Facilities to identify project funding in the 2024-2027 Statewide Transportation 62 Improvement Plan to design and construct safety improvements identified in the Planning 63 and Environmental Linkages Study including a signalized intersection with a protected 64 pedestrian crossing and Glacier Lemon Spur extension. 65 66 Section 2. This resolution shall be distributed to the Commissioner of the Alaska 67 Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, the Juneau State Legislative 68 Delegation for the State of Alaska, and submitted as public comment on the 2024-2027 69 Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP). 70 71 Section 3.
