
Waste Hauling

BARRIERS

CBJ does not own/control the landfill


CBJ does not own/control the waste stream

- Recycling facility
 - The facility is near capacity
 - Diversion is about 10%
 - Approaching max capacity in the recycling/HHW buildings
 - Staffing constraints
 - Rising fuel costs = rising recycling costs
 - Population is too small to take advantage of economies of scale

- Food waste
 - Juneau is lacking food waste/organics composing at a city/borough-wide scale
 - Composting will be limited by the amount of carbon sources we can secure
- Seasonal population
 - Huge surpluses of furniture, mattresses, and other household items every year

OPPORTUNITIES

- EPA Grants
 - Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling (SWIFR) Grant
 - Recycling Education and Outreach (REO) Grant
 - Alaska Municipal League has hired a professional grant reviewer
- Sen. Murkowski's Congressionally Directed Spending
 - \$2.5 million for composting specifically
- Exploring locations for a "Zero Waste Subdivision"
 - City property Lemon Creek near Home Depot, located near Juneau Composts! existing location
- Juneau's only landfill is nearly at capacity
 - WM estimates are 20-25 years life left,
 - We think realistically could be <u>less</u>
- Public buy-in and awareness of waste issues
