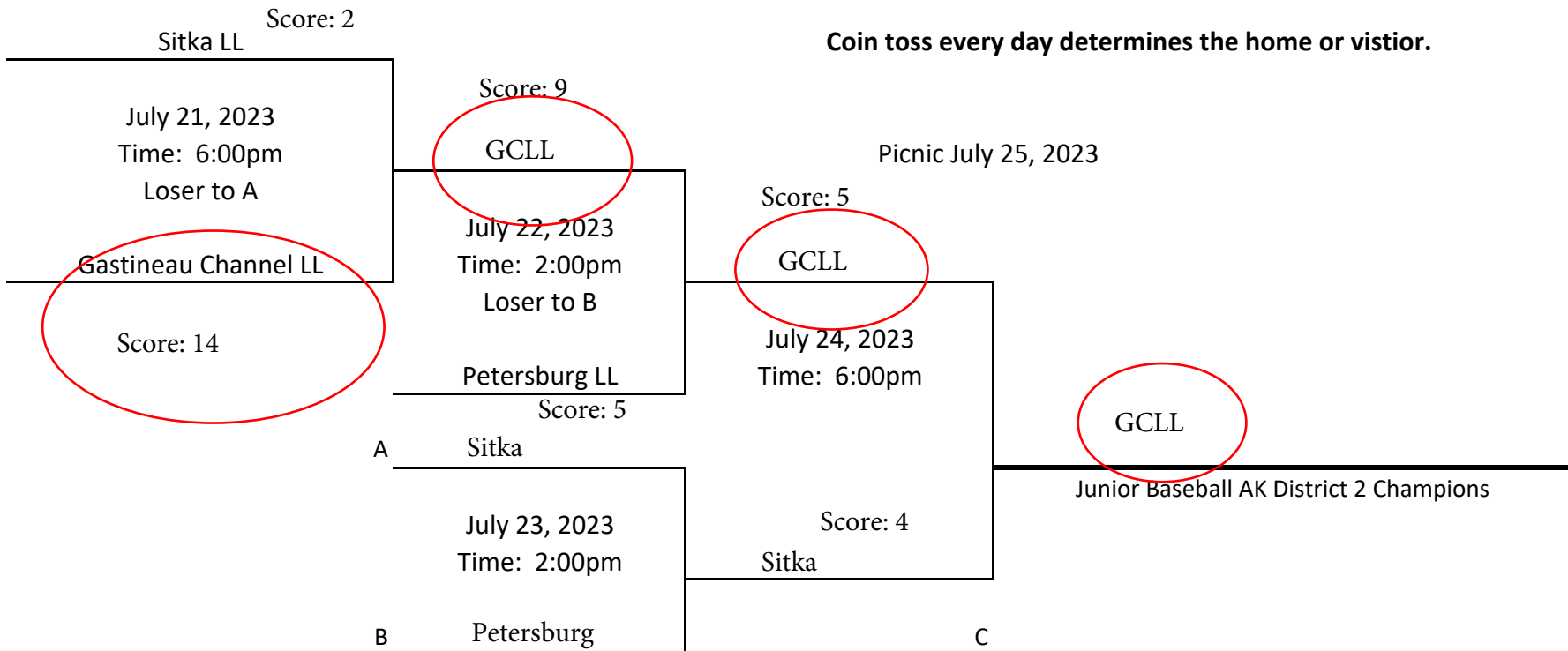

1. Please explain your need for contingency funds and what makes this an unanticipated event.

Thank you for considering this request for contingency funding for Mila Hargrave. We are requesting assistance with funding her travel, tournament and coaching fees, and accommodations for an elite softball tournament in Europe this coming January called The Cup NL 2024.

Mila is a Senior at JDHS. Last year, she was a varsity athlete in 3 sports (basketball, softball, and volleyball), held a 4.0 GPA, and played 2nd violin in the Aurora Strings youth ensemble. She is well-rounded and hard working.

Mila is particularly passionate about softball and is quite talented! She is a starting pitcher and first base player. For the 2023 high school softball season, she had the best ERA (earned run average – a key pitching statistic) of any high school softball player in the State of Alaska at 1.92. In her Senior year, she is trying to continue to develop her skills and gain playing experience to become a Division 1 or Division 2 college athlete.

Her journey to this invitation was quite unexpected. Mila had previously been invited to play on a softball club team from Las Vegas during her off-season, where she has continued to excel in tournaments in California and Colorado. This summer, the coach of that Las Vegas club team had (unbeknownst to us) recommended her to the coach of the European tournament. A copy of that email is attached. In that email, I have highlighted areas describing how she was selected to be included on the team.

The invitation was based on her performance, and the timing unanticipated. We are thrilled about this opportunity, but also recognize this is a significant investment. After careful consideration, we have committed her.

As you know, travel from Alaska to Europe is expensive. It is likely a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to play in this tournament. While there, she will receive expert coaching and the opportunity to play at a very high level against other American and European teams.

The Cup NL charges \$4150 per player to travel from a selected US “departure city” and participate. However, coming from Alaska, we know that her travel will be longer and significantly more expensive. We will need to add the costs of travel from Juneau to the selected departure city (not yet announced by the organization). We are only requesting support for the costs for Mila getting to and from the tournament and playing in the tournament, not additional costs associated with the organization’s events. In addition, an adult chaperone is required, and is not included in this request.

5. Program budget defining/outlining how the request will be used.

As The Cup NL organizational group does not provide a line-item fee sheet, but rather charges a flat rate of \$4150 per person. The Cup NL organization on the US side arranges the travel, fees, uniforms, accommodations, and ground transportation themselves as a group. Our request is not for the full cost of The Cup NL fee to omit potential costs of time spent in France which are after the tournament.

Please excuse the length, I'm out of the country and I wanted to give you as much complete information as I could...so please excuse the length but the info is comprehensive. When I'm back to t my goal is to set up a zoom with you on the 1st week of July.

Coach B shared to send this to you...more on him below..

I'm Kirt Whiteside, the owner of The Cup - a softball event I've been hosting in Europe now for soon to be 29 years. This event has grown from 8 people watching our first event which I started in Lyon, France, to more than 1.2 million people last year watching our opening ceremonies only this past Cup which I now host in the Netherlands. The Netherlands is the heart of Fastpitch Softball in Europe. We assemble 5 teams of 9 from America that are generally High School age athletes to play against National Programs from the Czech Republic, The Netherlands, Sweden, Germany, Great Britain, etc. We have teams from California, Florida, Michigan, Pennsylvania and now working on assembling this team from Virginia.

Michael Bastian is part of our coaching staff and had recommended 9 families of which you were/are one!

A little side note, he knows a lot of European athletes, has been to The Cup before and loves this event and wanted to open up his TFS program to some select athletes. Pretty cool he recommended you.

Some bullet points:

1. We leave on Jan 10 to the Netherlands play and return from Paris, France on Jan 17th
2. In 29 years we have NEVER had a HS say no to allowing an athlete to miss school for this magnitude of a trip
3. We mostly take college bound, high-level academic with most girls in AP or IB curriculum
4. If families are concerned about education, we've been told for many years, this 8 day/7 night adventure is like a semester in Europe with the history locations we visit in the Netherlands and in Paris. Hands-on education is always THE best way to learn!
5. yes, this is about very, high level Softball but it's also about equally high level history as we do go to Anne Frank's home in Amsterdam, and of course, in Paris, we are 10 minutes away from the Louvre, the Mona Lisa, Napoleon's Palace and Notre Dame. This is far, far more about an experience that starts with Softball and ends with some massive, massive education about history, culture, adventure, cuisine, etc
6. Though we bring HS aged athletes, our opponents are in their mid-20's...
7. The Cup tournament - it's been said - could be the most elite talent that our American girls may EVER play, including collegiately.

1. We currently have on our staff what's considered to be one of the top 10 coaches in N. America and quite honestly Michael comes to us with the same regard that we hold all of our staff in
2. We generally take 2 pitchers per team (Michael's choice here) and 1 position player - essentially no subs! That translates to...if you're going to travel 4000 miles - you're going to play.
3. Most athletes at this level love to challenge themselves with competing against the best - this event makes this happen.
4. Yes, you did read that right, when we're done playing on Sunday, we head to Paris and are there until Wednesday - some extend through Thursday to go to London - which is a 'chunnel 80 minute ride away!'
5. Yes, this does cost money, 90% of our athletes go with no family funds invested because they work our strategies that we have put together over all these couple of decades, I would contend to say that if you would put the effort in three or four hours a week for about eight weeks, there should be nothing coming from the family bucket. Using these same fund raising strategies, this past year we had 60% of our athletes mothers/fathers also come with nothing from the family budget.

Michael chose you for me to reach out to as our criteria, firstly, has to do with we want great girls and secondly these girls need to come from great families and THEN as our 3rd criteria, they have to be incredible players. Quite the compliment for you all!

As you are very well aware, anything in life takes a little bit of effort to get to the top, this small bit of effort allows so much growth not only on the Softball front, but on the travel front, the history front, etc. The reward for effort here is incredibly high.

The Youth Activity Board (YAB) had a busy year reviewing and distributing grant money through the Youth Activity Grant and Contingency Grant programs. As budgets get tighter for the non-profit youth programs, these pools of money are becoming more strained.

The YAB is required by ordinance to place a sum equal to five percent of the amount allocated by the City Assembly into a contingency account to fund unanticipated events. \$332,500 minus the five-percent contingency (\$16,625) leaves the general youth activities fund with **\$315,875 to distribute for overall grant funding.**

Grant proposals are divided into three categories: Sports, Arts, and Academic/other for evaluation and ranking. The nine Youth Activity Board members* are each assigned to one of those categories so that three members review all grants in each category. In addition to the many hours spent individually evaluating and scoring each proposal, Board members spend two evenings publicly reviewing the proposals. The second and final meeting consists of the Board reaching an agreement on the groups to be funded and their recommended funding level. Attached are the Fiscal Year 2023 and Fiscal Year 2024 spreadsheets showing the organizations, amounts requested and recommended funding.

Fiscal Year 2023 had 27 proposals totaling \$513,272.50; all 27 of the programs were partially funded. In Fiscal Year 2024 there were 26 proposals totaling \$499,291.00 (down 2.7% from Fiscal Year 2023) in requests; the board recommended partial funding for all 26 of the proposals.

The board was active during Fiscal Year 2023 in which a total of five meetings were conducted to review contingency grant applications and grant documents. In Fiscal Year 2022, the board reviewed 3 contingency grant applications, representing baseball, robotics and bowling, totaling \$11,434.27 (up 57% from Fiscal Year 2021) submitted by three different programs.



During Fiscal Year 2023, the board reviewed 1 contingency grant application, representing robotics, totaling \$1,000 (down 91% from Fiscal Year 2022) submitted by one program.
