

CBJ Assembly Special Meeting Suicide Basin Release 8.7.23




Jokulhlaup

- Flooding occurs when water levels rise and pressure builds triggering a release from Suicide Basin under the glacier into the lake.
- Traditional flooding is minor; highest level was 11.99. This event was 14.97.
- National Weather Service has developed a model and inundation maps.



 Condo C and D (Riverside) at 8am Sunday morning. 12 units currently condemned.




Meander Section F, Item 3. Way 8.6.23 morning
