2. Discussion Topics.

a. Authorization to seek bids for replacement of Tractor 105.

Street Superintendent Van Gompel stated the Street Department has been using this multipurpose tractor for ten years. The tractor has had multiple problems and is down for long periods of times due to its year-round use and issues with parts being available. MB no longer manufactures a multi service vehicle. All parts need to be manufactured to order. This is a critical piece of equipment for lawn mowing, leaf collection and sidewalk snow removal. Questions from the Board were answered.

b. Authorization to seek bids for replacement of Tractor 24.

Street Superintendent Van Gompel stated Tractor 24 is a year-round tractor used for multiple tasks like snow removal, loading of materials and landscaping projects. The tractor has been in operation for 12 years with the department and showing signs of its use; including decreased power and corrosion to its body. Its back box scraper attachment has been saved and used on multiple tractors in the past and has been repaired several times. Discussion was held and questions answered.

The grant would be for the partial cost of taking down trees affected by the Emerald Ash Borer, replanting of trees and education. Outdoor Alcohol Beverage Area Open Hours - Discussion.

Jason LaChance, owner of JJ's Bottle Room, 173 W. Wisconsin Ave., Kaukauna spoke asking the Council to extend the Outdoor Alcohol area open hours. Mr. LaChance recently invested a considerable amount of money into a back deck on his property and would like to see it utilized longer.

Director of Planning and Community Development Stephenson provided background. The Outdoor Alcohol Beverage Area ordinance has been discussed by both the Plan Commission and the Legislative Committee. The final ordinance is being presented that will allow for a better, more welcoming use of the City's outdoor serve areas. Several business owners reached out and were concerned with the recommended hours of operation. The existing ordinance dictates that the outdoor serve areas stop serving alcohol at 9 PM on weekdays and 10 PM on weekends (Friday and Saturday nights). Business owners pointed out that recreation leagues often get done after 9 PM, and they may want to patron the outdoor serve areas. In addition, it does not get dark until after 9 PM in the summer. After further review, the City's sidewalk café permits prohibit alcohol being served on the sidewalk after 11PM in all cases. Matching this ordinance seems intuitive and would not result in outdoor serve area guests being pushed to the sidewalks when the serve area closes at 9 PM or 10 PM. Discussion was held and questions answered.

Motion by Eggleston, seconded by Kilgas to amend the Outdoor Alcohol Beverage Area Ordinance, Chapter 12.03(11), and have the hours of operation close at 11 PM, for all days of the week. Director of Planning and Community Development Stephenson is instructed to investigate the downtown commercial core district for potential later hours of operation. All Ald. present voted aye.

Staff evaluated current park pavilion rental fees and used comparables from neighboring communities. Our current rental fee is \$25 per day per pavilion. Additionally, there is no security deposit required. The current fee structure has been in place for at least 15 years. Currently, pavilion reservations open the first business day of the year for the upcoming year. Our facility (SPaR Building) reservation opens to Kaukauna-based, not-for-profit organizations 395 days (13 months) in advance of the rentals first booking date. The patron that booked this year may reserve 366 days in advance of the booking date. All other City residents can reserve 365 days in advance of the booking date. Non-resident can reserve 335 (11 months) days in advance of the booking date. Kaukauna Area School District is exempt from rental fees. Staff recommend mirroring the facility rental policy for the park pavilion rentals. Fees from local communities were provided. Discussion was held and questions answered.

1. 5:00 p.m. Call to Order - Roll Call

Acting President Siebers called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM.

2. Public Appearances

No appearances were made.

3. Approval of the Minutes of the August 9, 2022 Regular Meeting

The minutes of the August 9, 2022 Regular Meeting were presented to the Commission. A motion was made by Commissioner Coffey and seconded by Commissioner Sundelius to approve the minutes as written. Motion carried unanimously. The minutes were reviewed and pre-approved by Secretary Hennessey.

4. Correspondence

The Commission received a copy of an article in the Times Villager dated 8/10/2022 regarding "what not to flush". They also received a copy of a letter from Foth, dated 8/29/2022, regarding the Outagamie County Landfill leachate management plan and schedule for ammonia load reductions.

5. Discussion Items

A. MCC Ethernet Communication Upgrade - Kurt Atwood of LW Allen

Item 6.d.

Kurt Atwood of LW Allen supplied information regarding the MCC communications upgradenoting that the current MCC's are 16 years old, nearing their 20 year life expectancy. Failures of equipment are occurring more often and DeviceNet is no longer being applied to new applications. Kurt advised migrating to Ethernet which is the newest generation of protocol and provided a detailed proposal from Altronex Control Systems in the amount of \$1,567,717.00. Kevin Skogman noted that this amount has been included in the 2023 budget as a replacement item, which will be formally adopted on 10/11/2022. Commissioner Sundelius suggested having Donohue review the proposal from Atronex and give an opinion regarding the proposed cost.

B. 2023 Budget Workshop

The Commission and staff reviewed the 2023 proposed budget figures including detailed expense accounts, debt service, rate & income data, and replacement information.

The 2023 budget and rate parameters will be officially adopted at the October 11, 2022 Regular Commission Meeting/Public Hearing.

C. Donohue Professional Services Proposal Task Order 9A – Review & Possible Action

A motion was made by Commissioner Sundelius and seconded by Commissioner Coffey to approve the professional services contract with Donohue, Task Order 9A, for assistance with Landfill Leachate Acceptance, not to exceed \$10,000. All in favor. Motion carried.

D. Effluent Filtration Project – Monthly Activity Report

District Director Helminger noted that the first project meeting went well and demolition and removal has begun. There will be a groundbreaking ceremony on Wednesday, September 28, 2022 at 11:00 AM.

E. Interceptor Rehab Project – Monthly Activity Report

Scott Schramm of Strategic Municipal Services provided a detailed written activity/progress summary for August and noted that bidding is on schedule for fourth quarter of 2022. District Director Helminger stated that the City of Kaukauna has been given a Memorandum of Understanding.

F. FOG Program - Monthly Activity Report

John Stoeger of Stoeger & Associates provided a written fats, oil, and grease update by community, including a grease trap inspection report and site visit correspondence. The Commission also received an itemized copy of the August 2022 invoice.

G. Leonard & Finco - Monthly Activity Report

Leonard & Finco provided a written monthly update of projects completed in August as well as a list of upcoming tasks for September & October.

PLANT REPORTS:

5PR. Flows & Revenues / Operations & Maintenance

The Commission received a copy of the hydraulic & organic loadings data, along with flow & strength projections, which shows the year-to-date surplus/deficit in revenue for the month of August 2022. Revenue received from the WPS-Fox Energy Center for effluent purchased in August = \$16,981.43; Revenue received to date for 2022 = \$112,685.31. WPS-Fox Energy purchased 51% of the effluent produced in August.

Kevin Skogman, Director of Operations & Maintenance, provided a written O & M Report on plant operations for August. Kevin noted that United Liquid Waste finished on September 4th; 3.4 million gallons of biosolids were hauled out and injected.

After a discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Coffey and seconded by Commissioner Hennessey to accept the bid from August Winters for the replacement of the heating/air conditioning unit in the solids building garage with an Aaon unit, at a total cost of \$36,150. This is a replacement eligible cost. Motion carried unanimously.

6. Funds

A. September 2022 Accounts Payable; Action for Approval

After a review of the bills payable, a motion was made by Commissioner Siebers and seconded by Commissioner Hennessey to approve payment of the bills in the amount of \$411,114.44. A roll call vote was taken: Commissioner Sundelius, yes; Commissioner Coffey, yes; Commissioner Siebers, yes; and Commissioner Hennessey, yes. Motion carried unanimously. The Commission signed the check voucher register which includes general, pre-paid, and petty cash checks.

B. Budget Comparison Report

The Commission received a Budget Comparison Report, along with a verbal explanation of exceedances.

7. General Old or New Business

- District Director Helminger and Commission President Casper gave a brief update on the meeting with the City of Kaukauna and legal counsel regarding the cost allocation for the interceptor rehab project. The City of Kaukauna has been clear that they believe the appropriate method to allocate the debt service is to allocate the project costs to the member communities based on the reaches of the interceptor being used. The District informed Kaukauna that no change has been made in the District's plan to allocate project costs based on the flow rate parameter. The City of Kaukauna has the ability to submit a formal complaint in the matter and have it reviewed by the Public Service Commission.
- District Director Helminger informed the Commission that Mike Gerbitz of Donohue will be at the October meeting to discuss the final draft of the biostyr stress test. There appears to be justification to petition the DNR for a capacity re-rate/increase.

8. Adjournment

With no further business before the Commission, a motion was made by Commissioner Sundelius and seconded by Commissioner Coffey to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. (Time: 6:20 PM)

Re: Preliminary Plat Review - Bluesteam Meadows 3

Blue Steam Meadows 3 is a subdivision development south of CTH CE and east of Haas Road. Blue Stem Meadows 3 adds on to the previous 2 phases, platting more homes beyond Antelope Trail and extending Haas Road to the south. This subdivision is a total of 29.4 acres. There are 59 proposed Residential Single-Family Lots. The average lot size is about 13,500 square feet. Lot widths range from 73' to 120' with the average lot width being about 90' wide.

The roads proposed are extensions of existing Haas Rd, Snow Goose Way, Beckett Lane and White Dove Lane. The grid like patter and the future extension of Haas Road will provide adequate traffic flow for the new and existing residents.

The Plan Commission reviewed the plat and recommended approval to the Common Council. Plan Commission also gave staff direction to work with the developer and get clarity on easements, wetland locations, and road extensions for the final plat.





Hurkman Heights is a development South of Highway 41 on the north end of the city. Hurkman Heights is a 24-unit single-family development that has been built out in 4 phases. Plan Commission has reviewed a previous plat for this phase that had a long dead-end road. Plan Commission gave direction to the developer to provide for more traffic circulation and found the long dead-end road to be a safety concern.

Since then, a new plat has been created that provides traffic circulation and a secondary exit to the subdivision. Golden Way has been extended East and will link Boxer Street and Ben's Way. This extension ameliorates the safety and traffic concerns and will provide a joining of the various phases of Hurkman Heights Subdivision.

Plan Commission recommended Approval of the Hurkman Heights Phase 4 Final Plat, and recommend the same to the common council with the following conditions:

- 1. Direct the developer to work with city staff and the DNR to permit the new road extension, Golden Way.
- 2. Prior to construction all applicable permits and approvals are obtained from Public Works and the City Building Inspector.

Seeding will be used on all disturbed areas within seven days of the completion of the activity that will disturb the area. All seeding shall be in accordance with DNR Technical Standard 1059. Seed mixture 40 (per WisDOT Specifications, Section 630) shall be applied at 5 pounds per 1000 square feet for permanent seeding prior to September 15th. If required, temporary seeding shall consist of Oats, Rye, Winter Wheat, and/or Annual Ryegrass applied at rates and during the season specified by the Technical Standard but no later than November 1st. CITY OF KAUKAUNA ORDINANCE 1868-2022

ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 7.02(1)(I) SPEED LIMITS ON LODERBAUER ROAD

WHEREAS, the White Dove Lane intersection has been installed since the creation of the current speed limit on Loderbauer Road; and

WHEREAS, due to the urbanization of the road and the installation of the interestciont at the southern corporate limits, the 35-mph speed limit within the corporate limits is no longer necessary;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Kaukauna, in the State of Wisconsin, as follows:

SECTION 1: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "7.02 Speed Limits" of the City of Kaukauna Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

7.02 Speed Limits

- 1. *City streets*. The following speed limits have been established at the following locations upon the erection of standard traffic signs giving notice thereof:
 - a. Haas Road: 40 miles per hour from a point 1,100 feet north of CTH "CE" to CTH "Z" and 30 miles per hour from CTH "CE" to a point 1,100 feet north of CTH "CE".
 - b. Thilmany Road: 15 miles per hour from the Island Street Bridge to a point 275 feet east on Thilmany Road and from the Heart of the Valley Metropolitan Sewerage District wastewater treatment plant south to the Fox River.
 - c. Badger Road: 30 miles per hour from Delanglade Street to C.T.H. "OO."
 - d. Tower Drive: 30 miles per hour from Prospect Avenue to East Line Road.
 - e. Prospect Lane: 30 miles per hour from Tower Drive to Badger Road.
 - f. East Line Road: 30 miles per hour from Tower Drive to Badger Road.
 - g. Progress Way: 30 miles per hour.
 - h. Gertrude Street: 25 miles per hour.
 - i. Loderbauer Road: 35 miles per hour from the southerly right-of-way of White Wolf Lane southerly to the corporate limits of the City of Kaukauna.
- 2. County trunk highways. The following speeds have been established for certain county trunk highways, subject to approval by the state highway division, and upon the erection of standard traffic signs giving notice thereof:
 - a. C.T.H. "CE": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of S.T.H. "55" westerly to Fieldcrest Drive and 45 miles per hour from Fieldcrest Drive westerly for a

distance of 750 feet.

- b. C.T.H. "CE": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of S.T.H. "55" easterly for a distance of 1,200 feet.
- c. C.T.H. "J," Lawe Street: 30 miles per hour from its intersection with Delanglade Street in the city, northerly and easterly to the north corporate limits of the city.
- d. C.T.H. "OO," Hyland Avenue:
 - (1) 35 miles per hour from its intersection with the west corporate city limits to its intersection with S.T.H. "55."
 - (2) 45 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" easterly to the corporate city limits.
- e. C.T.H. "Q": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of C.T.H. "CE" northerly to a point being 200 feet north of the northernmost leg of Woodhaven Drive and 25 miles per hour within the rest of the city.
- f. C.T.H. "Z":
 - (1) 25 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" westerly to the corporate city limits.
 - (2) 25 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" easterly and northerly to a point 0.1 of a mile east of its intersection with Eagles Court.
 - (3) 35 miles per hour from a point 0.1 of a mile east of its intersection with Eagles Court to the easterly corporate limits of the city.
- 3. *Parks and recreational areas*. No vehicle shall be driven at a speed in excess of ten miles per hour on the streets, roads, and parking areas within all parks and recreational areas.
- 4. S.T.H. "55."
 - a. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" shall be 35 miles per hour from C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" and 45 miles per hour from 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of Morningside Drive.
 - b. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" northbound shall be 45 miles per hour from 0.1 miles north of Hyland Avenue northerly to 0.2 miles north of U.S. "41"; and on S.T.H. "55" southbound from 0.3 miles north of U.S. "41" southerly to 0.1 miles north of Hyland Avenue.
 - c. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" shall be 35 miles per hour from C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE"; and 45 miles per hour from 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of Morningside Drive.

- g. Progress Way: 30 miles per hour.
- h. Gertrude Street: 25 miles per hour.
- i. Loderbauer Road: 35 miles per hour from the southerly right-of-way of White Wolf Lane southerly to the corporate limits of the City of Kaukauna.
- 2. County trunk highways. The following speeds have been established for certain county trunk highways, subject to approval by the state highway division, and upon the erection of standard traffic signs giving notice thereof:
 - a. C.T.H. "CE": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of S.T.H. "55" westerly to Fieldcrest Drive and 45 miles per hour from Fieldcrest Drive westerly for a distance of 750 feet.
 - b. C.T.H. "CE": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of S.T.H. "55" easterly for a distance of 1,200 feet.
 - c. C.T.H. "J," Lawe Street: 30 miles per hour from its intersection with Delanglade Street in the city, northerly and easterly to the north corporate limits of the city.
 - d. C.T.H. "OO," Hyland Avenue:
 - (1) 35 miles per hour from its intersection with the west corporate city limits to its intersection with S.T.H. "55."
 - (2) 45 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" easterly to the corporate city limits.
 - e. C.T.H. "Q": 35 miles per hour from the centerline of C.T.H. "CE" northerly to a point being 200 feet north of the northernmost leg of Woodhaven Drive and 25 miles per hour within the rest of the city.
 - f. C.T.H. "Z":
 - (1) 25 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" westerly to the corporate city limits.
 - (2) 25 miles per hour from its intersection with S.T.H. "55" easterly and northerly to a point 0.1 of a mile east of its intersection with Eagles Court.
 - (3) 35 miles per hour from a point 0.1 of a mile east of its intersection with Eagles Court to the easterly corporate limits of the city.
- 3. *Parks and recreational areas*. No vehicle shall be driven at a speed in excess of ten miles per hour on the streets, roads, and parking areas within all parks and recreational areas.

4. S.T.H. "55."

- a. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" shall be 35 miles per hour from C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" and 45 miles per hour from 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of Morningside Drive.
- b. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" northbound shall be 45 miles per hour from 0.1 miles north of Hyland Avenue northerly to 0.2 miles north of U.S. "41"; and on S.T.H. "55" southbound from 0.3 miles north of U.S. "41" southerly to 0.1 miles north of Hyland Avenue.
- c. The maximum speed limit on S.T.H. "55" shall be 35 miles per hour from C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE"; and 45 miles per hour from 0.2 miles south of C.T.H. "CE" to 0.2 miles south of Morningside Drive.
