Re: Kay Drive Extension Proposal

Background information:


The owner of parcel has requested driveway access off the end of Kay Drive. The current alignment and road termination does not lend itself to a safe driveway access. The owner has been working with City staff to extend Kay Drive and to allow for a safe driveway connection and the owner is willing to enter into an easement agreement for the same. See attached sketch showing the proposed extension area. All expenses related to the installation of the extension of Kay Drive within said easement, including but not limited to, design, excavation, grading, base material, pavement and ancillary concrete, and all restoration will be the responsibility of the property owner. A separate watermain re-location will be associated with this work but will be at the discretion of Kaukauna Utilities.

Strategic Plan: NA

Budget: Minor expenses for staff time and regular maintenance.

Staff Recommended Action:

Recommend approval of the Kay Drive Extension and easement agreement to Common Council, pending Plan Commission approval.



Re: State Municipal Agreement (SMA) for Kenneth Avenue Reconstruction

Design, Construction, and Oversight

Background information:

The City of Kaukauna has applied for and has been awarded a Surface Transportation Program (STP) Urban project grant through Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) for Kenneth Avenue Reconstruction. The project design may start in fiscal year 2026 and construction has been tentatively scheduled for 2029. The grant includes up to 80% funding for design, construction, and oversight of participating costs. The City must enter into a State/Municipal Agreement in order to complete the project and receive funding.

Strategic Plan: Finding alternate funding sources, such as WisDOT grants, allows the City to complete more projects with less funding by the municipality and the residents. The project also improves safety and encourages alternative transportation by improving crosswalks, adding new walk, rehabilitation of existing walks, improving bus stop location access points and condition of the bus route, and adding bike lanes to help connect our downtown and Nelson Trail with other trails and bike routes.

Budget: Total project cost including design, construction, and oversight, is estimated at \$5,642,167 with the City/residents covering about 28%, at \$1,552,897. (Previous estimates for this project, not including design or contingencies, were \$2.9M in 2024)

Staff Recommended Action:

Authorize the Director of Public Works to enter into a State Municipal Agreement with the State of Wisconsin for the Kenneth Avenue Reconstruction project design, construction, and oversight.

Re: Authorization to seek proposals for A/E services for library offices redesign

Background information:


The library will be adding a new sorting machine as an innovative solution to help relieve some issues caused by staff shortages. To accommodate the installation of the sorting machine, several office/desk spaces will need to be relocated. In addition, the current office/desk space is less than what is needed when the library is fully staffed. As part of the 2024 Capital Improvement Plan, funds were allocated for the sorting machine upgrade in the current office spaces up to five new/replacement office spaces, and if feasible, a separate meeting room, to be located within the adult fiction area.

Strategic Plan: This combination of innovative improvements will help the library to complete more timely and error free work with the current staffing level. Innovation is one of the foundational elements in our Strategic Plan, as it offers a better way of checking in materials, and improves existing processes with a reduction in errors. It will also help improve workplace culture in offering staff proper places to complete their work. Further, the separate meeting room, if feasible, helps us in creating our community of choice, as gathering spaces are important to thriving communities for engagement.

Budget: Total for all phases was budgeted in in the 2024 Capital Improvement Plan for \$400,000. Estimated engineer/architectural services for this first phase is estimated at \$10,000.

Staff Recommended Action:

Authorize staff to seek proposals for Architectural/Engineering services related to the Library Offices Redesign.

Re: Kaukauna Utilities' Request to Install Flashing Pedestrian

Crossing Signs

Background information:

Kaukauna Utilities has requested to purchase, install, and maintain a set of flashing pedestrian crossing signs for the mid-block crossing on Island Street (See map and image attached) The KU safety committee has recommended enhancements to the crossing which mainly serves KU employees accessing the employee parking area. Prior to this recommendation, standard crossing signs, a centerline pedestrian sign, and enhanced lighting have been implemented. Other options have been considered.

Strategic Plan: The addition of the flashing signs can be a safety enhancement at a crossing with current safety concerns. The main benefit will be to KU employees, but the public may use the lights also.

Budget: NA

Staff Recommended Action:

Permit KU to purchase, install, and maintain flashing pedestrian crossing signs in the Island Street right-of-way.
