KAUKAUNA ALCOHOL, TOBACCO AND OTHER DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION BOARD

A meeting of the KATODA Prevention Board was held January 19, 2022, at 6pm with remote teleconference via Zoom.

Members present: Jack Pautz, Karen Wirth, Jerry Brien, Karleigh Kluever, Laura Lindberg, Chris Wardlow, Ald. Brian Schell, Dr. Paul Russo and Philip Kohne. Absent: Ashley Mayer
Guest Observer: Satia Kavanaugh Vanderloop

Motion by Brien and second by Schell to approve the November KATODA Prevention Board minutes. All members present on teleconference via Zoom voted aye. Motion Carried.

A request was made by Pautz to support 4 scholarships in the amount of \$500 apiece for 4 graduating seniors from Kaukauna High School who have overcome a difficult time in their lives. Kohne made a motion for the KATODA prevention board to support the 4 scholarships in the amount of \$500 apiece. Russo seconded the motion. All members present at the meeting voted aye. Motion carried.

Karleigh Kluever provided the board with an update on the LEAD group at Kaukauna High school. The LEAD group has members who want to live a drug and alcohol-free high school life. The members have the opportunity to participate in alcohol free activities which have included: corn mazes, mall trips, and shows at the PAC. Karleigh also thanked the KATODA board for the monetary donation to help support this club and their activities. The club also participates in community service projects. Approximately 40-50 students are signed up to be in the LEAD club.

A thank you was shared with Lindberg, Wardlow and Wirth for accepting the invitation to serve another term on the board. Satia Kavanaugh-Vanderloop has also expressed an interest in being a member of the group. A motion was made by Wardlow to have Satia as a member of the board (taking the spot of Ellen Koski who recently left). Russo seconded the motion. All members present at the meeting voted aye. Motion was carried. Welcome to Satia.

Discussion was held about the City Ordinance regarding no Alcohol at youth events on City Property. Pautz shared that Chief Graff from the Kaukauna Police Dept. shared that signage for these properties sharing this ordinance are in process and will be posted at the sites. Lindberg, Pautz and Wardlow will be working on creating an information sheet/paragraph that can be included with tournament information explaining the ordinance.

Thank You to Russo who designed and drove the float in the Kaukauna Parade with the theme "Chase is on the Case to be Drug and Alcohol free (Paw Patrol). It was enjoyed by the viewers at the parade.
