DISCUSSION ITEMS

4. ACTION ITEM: Recommendation to approve 20URA-03 for approval of infrastructure funding to the City of Ketchum for sidewalks and lighting.

Executive Director Suzanne Frick explained that if approved, the sidewalks for FY20 would initiate construction in May. If the board chooses not to move forward, we will pull back and make the contractor aware. This is the time for the board to decide how to proceed.

Commissioner Amanda Breen questioned the funding that has already been allocated. Executive Director Suzanne Frick explained that the work would be carried over to another time. She explained that the current bid went out prior to the COVID situation.

Commissioner Casey Dove would like to get another bid next summer. Commissioner Jim Slanetz agrees and would like to look at this again in the future. Commissioner Amanda Breen said this is the time to be conservative and see how this plays out There will be better ideas coming forth on how to spend the \$480,000 this year.

Commissioner Ed Johnson asked about timing. Executive Director Suzanne Frick explained that we do not want to do this level of construction in the peak period. We try to get these types of projects completed by mid-July. She talked about doing these types of projects in the fall and concrete not having a chance to cure. Suzanne Frick explained that bids are good for a 60-day period. If we hold off, we would be outside that time period. Ed Johnson explained that construction will be at a 2008/2009 level next year when we rebid. Suzanne Frick agrees and said construction will change as a result of this crisis. She explained that if we go back out to bid now, we will be looking at a 3-month delay. Ed Johnson asked about rolling over the funding to next year. Treasurer Grant Gager explained that this is not an issue. We could put this in the budget for FY 20/21. Chair Susan Scovell would like to wait another year saying next year's landscape will be very different.

Motion to defer action until FY 20/21 and asked to Executive Director Suzanne Frick to advise the City.

5. Discussion about City Council members serving on the KURA Board

Vice-Chair Ed Johnson explained that he is following up on a point brought up in a previous meeting by Gary Lipton who questioned the composition of the board. Attorney Ryan Armbruster talked about the Ordinance in the packet from 2015. It is the decision of the City Council on who sits on the board. The KURA Commission can approach the council for a change. Currently the board consists of 2 council members and 5 members of the public for a 7-member board. Council can change the Ordinance from 2015 if they would like. The history of the composition was discussed among the commissioners. Commissioner Jim Slanetz thinks the current composition works well. Ed Johnson talked about the voting abilities as well as how funding comes into the KURA. Commissioner Amanda Breen asked about provisions for a none voting members. Ryan Armbruster said having a nonvoting member complicates the board. He said the model that we use in Ketchum is primarily the model that is used throughout the state. Council members recusing from the vote was discussed. Ryan Armbruster suggested somebody approach the council to request a change or just let it go.

Commissioner Ed Johnson asked the other Commissioners for their thoughts on the matter. Commissioner Kristen Spachman does not see a problem with 2 City Council members on the board. Commissioner Casey Dove is fine with the current composition. Commissioner Carson Palmer agrees and does not see any issues. Commissioner Amanda Breen agrees and appreciates Ryan Armbruster's points and if the council is the minority, she is ok with the current outline. Commissioner Jim Slanetz agrees with Amanda Breen. Chair Susan Scovell talked about keeping the lines of communication open and suggested moving forward.

6. Discussion of providing KURA funding to assist local businesses with payroll expenses--Board Member Spachman

Commissioner Kristen Spachman asked if the Board can use funding for anything besides infrastructure. Attorney Ryan Armbruster advised that the board could be creative. These questions are being discussed throughout the state. We may want to see what other URA Districts are doing. Ryan Armbruster advised that the KURA would be unable to give funding directly to an entity. Kristen Spachman asked if the board will have more flexibility if they provide the funding directly to the City. Ryan Armbruster advised that coordinating with a separate entity would be a lot easier. Commissioner Ed Johnson advised that the board would be choosing winners and losers. This is better handled on a federal level. Commissioner Jim Slanetz agrees with Ed Johnson. Kristen Spachman would like to use the funding to help as many people possible in Ketchum.

Vice-Chair Ed Johnson talked about the crowds on the bike path and stated that the sidewalks would be used by the community.

Chair Susan Scovell talked helping with housing. She questioned if we could give rent to some businesses. Commissioner Jim Slanetz advised that would put the KURA in the position of picking and choosing. Attorney Ryan Armbruster agrees that would be problematic and stated we need a broader vision.

Recommendation to Review, Discuss and Provide Direction on Proposed Projects

Vice Chair Johnson and Chair Scovell are proposing the Board discuss and act on KURA funding for the following projects:

- Repair 4th street pavers from Walnut to Washington
- Replace the pavers in the alley behind town square with asphalt or concrete the existing pavers just don't hold up to the snow removal and truck traffic
- Replace the pavers/install snow melt in town square—the existing pavers are not holding up during snow removal and significant dollars are spent to remove the snow in the winter
- Install and improve ADA curb ramps throughout the downtown intersections
- Convert the pedestrian activated light at 4th Street and Main Street to a Hawk system which improves pedestrian and bicycle safety. Once this system is in place, the signal at Sun Valley Road and Main Street can be modified to include a pedestrian scramble crossing system
- Wayfinding Signage
- Closure of 4th Street for improved pedestrian and bicycle access
- Bike infrastructure including education signage on items like the Idaho Stop (unique law to Idaho that confuses tourists and many locals)
