Report from Council Liaison – Commissioner Dave DiOrio

Commissioner DiOrio offered guidance on the next step for the LAB approved draft of the Lake Use Regulations (LUR) suggested edits. The document should go before the Town's attorney. Once the attorney has approved the document, the final, clean version can be presented to the Marine Commission. In addition, the document, once approved by the Town Attorney and still with the edits, be put out to the public on the town's website. A video explaining the reasons for the edits would accompany the document. Mr. DiOrio encouraged the members of the LAB to attend the next Marine Commission meeting in representation of the LAB.

Chairman Helms made a motion for approval of this plan with Ms. Hatfield seconding the motion, all were in favor.

Report from Lake Operations - Dana Bradley

Ms. Bradley was able to report another great month on the Lake with lots of visitors.

<u>Fishery & Ecosystem – Mr. Gary Hasenfus</u>

Mr. Givens stated that he had been approached by visitors with pictures of bass with spots. Mr. Hasenfus has heard the same reports but has not seen this himself. He reported that in District A there have been no other reports. Mr. Hasenfus stated that he had seen columnaris in fish years before as he reported on last month. Columnaris is heat related and it goes away when the temperature of the water goes down.

Emergency Preparedness & Response – Mr. David Lusk

Mr. Lusk reported that buoys are being replaced as needed around the lake. The current dredging project is causing some movement of the buoys in surrounding areas.

Dredging & Watershed Stabilization

Mr. Givens reported that the dredging project is ongoing. Thus far, this project has resulted in the removal of an estimated 1,000 cubic yards from the dredging site. The project will continue on into next year.

Regulations & Law Enforcement - Ms. Sonya Ledford

Ms. Ledford was absent.

Continued Discussion of Lake Use Regulation suggestions for Marine Commission

The Lake Advisory Board discussed making a recommendation to the Marine Commission for the installation of barrier access systems to be installed at all approved ramps/launch sites. Ms. Hatfield made a motion to accept and Mr. Lemmons seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Further discussion on verbiage of suggested changes and additions to the LUR was held. A motion was made by Mr. Lusk to accept the Draft of Suggested Edits as discussed and Mr. Lemmons seconded. All were in favor.

The Board welcomed the newest member, Richard Sayles.

Mr. Hasenfus made a motion to adjourn the meeting of the Lake Advisory Board at 5:15 p.m. Ms. Hatfield seconded the motion and all members were in favor.
