REGULAR MEETING MINUTES February 3, 2022

#### Call To Order:

The regular meeting of the Lansing City Council was called to order by Mayor McNeill at 7:00 p.m.

#### **Roll Call:**

Mayor McNeill called the roll and indicated which Councilmembers were in attendance.

#### **Councilmembers Present:**

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Approval of Minutes:** Councilmember Buehler moved to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of January 20, 2022, as presented. Councilmember Garvey seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

**Audience Participation:** Mayor McNeill called for audience participation and there was none. **Presentations** 

#### **COUNCIL CONSIDERATION OF AGENDA ITEMS:**

**Waste Management Contract Renewal:** Councilmember Buehler moved to approve the 3-year contract with Waste Management of Kansas, Inc., as presented. Councilmember Garvey seconded the motion.

- City Administrator Tim Vandall stated John Blessing from Waste Management is here in case anyone has any questions or wants to talk to him.
  - Mayor McNeill asked anybody have any questions for John. No.
    - Councilmember Majure stated I think you guys do a great job considering two years of Covid and lack of people showing up to work. I know we had some missed days, you made it up and picked them up. So, from our ward, I appreciate all you've done.
      - John Blessing replied thank you.

The motion was approved with Councilmember Studnicka voting against the motion.

**ARP Sewer Improvements:** Councilmember Brungardt moved to approve the American Rescue Plan Public Private Partnership Policy, as presented. Councilmember Garvey seconded the motion.

- Councilmember Clemons asked in there it said, talking about they have to achieve a benchmark of 50% of the foundation in the initial phase. So, they have to meet a percent of that phase and they just get paid for that phase not the entire project, right.
  - City Administrator Tim Vandall responded once they pour those foundations, they would be entitled to that portion of the sewer up to \$400,000. So, it wouldn't be prorated or anything like that. One of the things that came up in some of our discussions was concerns about inflation, concerns about costs for installing sewers, lumber costs, all of those things. We did feel like there is a little bit of skin in the game on their part. They've got to install hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of sewer lines before we reimburse them. But to your question, it wouldn't be prorated or anything.
    - Councilmember Clemons asked this is just the main. It's not to the house right.
      - City Administrator Tim Vandall replied correct.
        - o Councilmember Clemons asked they're still doing the house.
          - City Administrator Tim Vandall responded correct, yep.
            - Councilmember Clemons asked this is just housing areas, right.

- City Administrator Tim Vandall replied we did have that question.
  - Mayor McNeill stated I guess we didn't specify in the policy. This is to get the developers to build whether its housing or some kind of retail development. It's a development incentive on the sewer side. So, if somebody came up to us and said I'd like to build this, would you help me. They would qualify.
- City Administrator Tim Vandall stated there was someone who had approached the Mayor, Matt Schmitz, and I about an idea. One of our responses was this isn't just free money for sewer. We need to see something being built as a result of it because I think the persons ideas was just do a sewer line and cross your fingers and hope for the best. We had said no. We need to see concrete being poured, dirt work and a foundation before we reimburse you.
- Councilmember Clemons responded thank you.

The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **REPORTS:**

**Department Heads:** Department Heads had nothing to report. **City Attorney:** City Attorney Greg Robinson had nothing to report.

**Mayor:** Mayor McNeill stated staff met with Jamie Miller to address the questions Councilmember had. The Omicron virus has already peaked here in Leavenworth County and as been declining since. Nationally, it is going down as well. We did ask about a mask mandate and Jamie Miller stated the time to do that would have been November for it to have an effect. He did recommend citizens continue to wear a mask, social distance and don't be in large crowds.

**City Administrator:** City Administrator Tim Vandall answered some questions the Council had regarding masks. St. John's does have a Covid ward, and the number of people hospitalized has been fluctuating. A councilmember had asked what we can do to help prevent the spread of the virus. While we don't have a clear answer to that the Health Department has talked about the effectiveness of the vaccine. Another question from the Council was about executive orders. There haven't been any orders from the Governor that affect us. Someone had asked if our mandates would apply to the schools as well and it wouldn't. The school district could opt out of whatever the city put in place. The Health Department did refer us to the CDC guidelines for the effectiveness of masks.

- Councilmember Brungardt asked if Jamie said anything in November about wanting the city to put a mask mandate in place.
  - Mayor McNeill replied Jamie put if you were going to do a mask mandate, it would have only been affective if you had done it in November.
    - City Administrator Tim Vandall added that even if we did want to do a mask mandate, Leavenworth doesn't have one, Basehor and Tonganoxie doesn't have one so it may not do any good if Lansing is the only city that does it.

Overall, it was a positive meeting, and we are really thankful for all the Health Department does. It's been a tough couple of years for them and we are lucky to have Jamie Miller in the County.

He concluded that it was tough when Jeff Focht stepped away, but Kenny has done a great job since taking over. Snow removal is still top notch, and we are really thankful for the all the work the street department does.

**Governing Body:** Councilmember Brungardt agreed with Tim about the street crew getting the roads cleared. He agrees a mask mandate wouldn't serve much a purpose right now and the key is getting vaccinated.

Councilmember Studnicka said he had calls and comments about the street guys being out there early and getting the roads cleaned off.

Councilmember Kirby stated Jamie Miller and his entire department have been through a lot and we are lucky to have him. Jamie is from here and he has always tried to do what is best for the city. He wishes there was something as a city we could do for the Health Department. Whether that be buy them lunch or something like that to show them we are thankful for all they have done.

Councilmember Majure asked when the new trucks will be in.

City Administrator Tim Vandall replied it will still be a while.

He continued by thanking Police Chief Wayman and his first responders for all they do and hopes he doesn't get tired of hearing it.

Councilmember Garvey thanked Mike, Kenny, and the crew for all they do. He sees what other cities streets are like and our look really good. He asked when the employees work overtime with the snow, are they guaranteed to keep that overtime. Or are they capped at the 40 hours. He wants to make sure the employees are getting the benefits they deserve for working after hours. He is not in favor of a mask mandate. People are smart enough to wear a mask if they feel they are safer wearing one Councilmember Buehler stated it shows the work on the streets is a team effort and it shows they are very proud of it. He also provided a fun fact, on this day in 1870, the 15<sup>th</sup> Amendment was ratified guaranteeing voting rights to all citizens of the United States regardless of race or color.

Councilmember Clemons we agreed with all that was already said. We have a good staff; the street department is excellent and our first responders are top notch.

#### **ADJOURNMENT:**

Councilmember Clemons moved to adjourn. Councilmember Buehler seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. The meeting was adjourned at 7:19 p.m.

SUBJECT: Ordinance No. 1079 – Amending Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 104 and 107 of the Code

of the City of Lansing, Kansas.

The necessity of appointing a new Municipal Court Judge to fill the vacancy created by the death of the city's Municipal Court Judge William Pray prompted city staff to review the Lansing City Code and make amendments to Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 104 and 107. The changes align with the requirements stated in K.S.A. 12-4105.

Staff is proposing the following amendments:

#### Sec. 10-104. - Municipal Judge—Appointment; qualifications; power.

The Mayor shall appoint, by and with the consent of the Governing Body, a Municipal Judge of the Municipal Court. The Municipal Judge shall hold an initial term of office of not to exceed one year and until his or her successor is appointed and qualified. If the Municipal Judge is reappointed he or she shall hold the office for a term of one year and until his or her successor is appointed and qualified. be a contract position. The Municipal Judge shall be a citizen of the United States; a graduate of a high school or secondary school or the equivalent thereof; a resident of Leavenworth County, Kansas and an attorney licensed by regularly admitted to practice law in the State of Kansas or certified by the supreme court in the manner prescribed by K.S.A. 12-4114, as qualified to serve as a municipal judge. The Municipal Judge shall have such powers and duties as set forth in the Kansas Code for Municipal Courts and as specifically stated in K.S.A. 12-4106.

#### Sec. 10-107. - Same—Salary.

The Municipal Judge shall receive semi-monthly monthly salary of \$500.00 \$1,500.00 and shall only be modified by ordinance.

**Action:** Approve Ordinance No. 1079, amending Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 104 and 107 of the Code of the City of Lansing, Kansas.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1079**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LANSING, KANSAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE 1, SECTIONS 104 AND 107 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF LANSING, KANSAS, 2022 EDITION, AND AMENDMENTS THERETO, REGARDING THE APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATIONS, AND SALARY OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LANSING, KANSAS:

#### **SECTION 1.**

Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 104 of the Code of the City of Lansing, Kansas, 2022 Edition, shall be amended to read as follows:

## Sec. 10-104. - Municipal Judge—Appointment; qualifications; power.

The Mayor shall appoint, by and with the consent of the Governing Body, a Municipal Judge of the Municipal Court. The Municipal Judge shall be a contract position. The Municipal Judge shall be a citizen of the United States; a graduate of a high school or secondary school or the equivalent thereof; and an attorney regularly admitted to practice law in the state of Kansas or certified by the Supreme Court in the manner prescribed by K.S.A. 12-4114 as qualified to serve as a municipal judge. The Municipal Judge shall have such powers and duties as set forth in the Kansas Code for Municipal Courts and as specifically stated in K.S.A. 12-4106.

#### **SECTION 2.**

Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 107 of the Code of the City of Lansing, Kansas, 2022 Edition, shall be amended to read as follows:

#### Sec. 10-107. - Same—Salary.

The Municipal Judge shall receive a monthly salary of \$1,500.00 and shall only be modified by ordinance.

#### **SECTION 3.**

EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication by summary in the official city newspaper.

SUBJECT: Appointment of Municipal Court Judge

**Explanation:** Per section 10-104 of the Lansing City Code, Mayor McNeill is authorized to appoint the Municipal Court Judge. Mr. Gary L Fuller has practiced law in Leavenworth County since 1989. Mr. Fuller currently serves as Lansing's reserve public defender and is familiar with our law enforcement and municipal court staff. Mr. Fuller was also recently appointed as the Leavenworth Municipal Court Judge. Staff believes Mr. Fuller has the knowledge and experience to perform the duties of Lansing's Municipal Court Judge.

**Policy Consideration:** There is currently a vacancy in the Municipal Court Judge position due to the death of Judge William Pray. This contract would be effective March 1, 2022.

**Financial Consideration:** Compensation for the Municipal Court Judge is covered by line item 010-012-41101 in the Municipal Court Department.

Action: Authorize Mayor McNeill to appoint Gary Fuller as Lansing's Municipal Court Judge.

#### MUNICIPAL JUDGE ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT

This MUNICIPAL JUDGE ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into effective as of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2022, by and between the **City of Lansing, Kansas, a Kansas municipal corporation** (the "City"), and **Gary L. Fuller**, an individual (the "Judge").

In consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises set forth herein, and intending to be legally bound, the parties hereto agree as follows.

1. <u>Engagement.</u> The City hereby engages the Judge to provide and perform, as an independent contractor, the functions and duties of municipal judge as set forth in state statute, city ordinance, and the Lansing City Code, consistent with the Scope of Work attached hereto as exhibit A and incorporated by reference with all duties, rights, and benefits accompanying the specified position. The Judge does not have supervisory authority over City staff.

The Judge hereby accepts the engagement to provide the above-described services to the City on the terms and conditions set forth herein. The Judge must take the oath of office as prescribed by Kansas law, and will be directly and personally responsible for the performance of the duties of such office, as specified in this Agreement, Lansing city ordinances and applicable Kansas statutes. It is expressly understood by the parties hereto that, while acting in the capacity of Municipal Judge and while carrying out the judicial duties thereof, the Judge has by law the power of independent judgment and discretion as to the management and disposition of cases coming before the Court.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement will commence on the date first written above and shall continue until either party provides notice to terminate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated by the City or the Judge upon not less than 60 days prior written notice to the other of them, except in the event of default by the Judge under this Agreement, in which event the City may terminate this Agreement immediately.
- 3. <u>Compensation.</u> In consideration of the services to be performed by the Judge, the City agrees to pay the Judge the sum of \$1500 per calendar month. Payments to the Judge shall be made in accordance with the City's regular schedule for payments to City personnel, and divided by pay periods in such manner as the City may reasonably determine. The Judge shall receive no other benefits from the City, whether health insurance, retirement, or otherwise.

#### 4. **Performance of Services.**

- a. The Judge shall conduct himself/herself in accordance with all applicable City policies while performing services under this Agreement. Such policies may include, but may not be limited to, tobacco, drugs, language, weapons, and sexual harassment policies. Failure of a person to so comply will be cause for his or her immediate dismissal from the work.
- b. In performing his/her duties under this Agreement, the Judge will use the same care and skill ordinarily used by members of his/her profession under the same or similar circumstances. The Judge warrants and agrees that he/she is licensed to practice law in this state without limitation. The Judge must maintain his/her license to practice law in good standing throughout the term of this

Agreement as a condition of this engagement. Should the Judge no longer be authorized to practice law in this state, this Agreement will terminate immediately for just cause.

- c. The Judge acknowledges the proper performance of the duties of the Judge will require him/her to generally observe normal business hours and will also often require the performance of necessary services outside of normal business hours. The Judge agrees to devote such additional time as is necessary for the full and proper performance of the Judge's duties and that the compensation herein provided includes compensation for the performance of all such services.
- 5. **Representations and Warranties.** The Judge represents and warrants that:
  - a. the Judge does not have any obligations, legal or otherwise, inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement or with the Judge's undertaking this relationship with the City,
  - b. the performance of the services called for by this Agreement do not and will not violate any applicable law, rule or regulation or any proprietary or other right of any third party, and
  - c. the Judge has not entered into nor will enter into any agreement (whether oral or written) in conflict with this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Indemnification.</u> To the extent permitted under Kansas law, the Judge hereby indemnifies and agrees to defend and hold harmless the City from and against any and all claims, demands and actions, and any liabilities, damages or expenses resulting therefrom, including court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or relating to the services performed under or pursuant to this Agreement or the representations and warranties made by the Judge. The Judge's obligations under this paragraph 6 shall survive the termination, for any reason, of this Agreement.
- 7. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement between the parties hereto with respect to its subject matter and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous written or oral agreements, representations or warranties between them respecting the subject matter hereof.
- 8. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be amended only by a writing signed by both parties.
- 9. <u>Severability.</u> If any term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person, place or circumstance, shall be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unenforceable or void, the remainder of this Agreement and such term, provision, covenant or condition as applied to other persons, places and circumstances shall remain in full force and effect.
- 10. **Rights Cumulative.** The rights and remedies provided by this Agreement are cumulative, and the exercise of any right or remedy by either party hereto (or by its successors), whether pursuant to this Agreement, to any other agreement, or to law, shall not preclude or waive its right to exercise any or all other rights and remedies.
- 11. **Nonwaiver.** No failure or neglect of either party hereto in any instance to exercise any right, power or privilege hereunder or under law shall constitute a waiver of any other right, power or privilege or of the same right, power or privilege in any other instance. All waivers by either party hereto must be contained in a written instrument signed by the party to be charged.

- 12. Agreement to Perform Necessary Acts. The Judge agrees to perform any further acts and execute and deliver any documents that may be reasonably necessary to carry out the provisions of this Agreement.
- **Assignment.** Neither party shall have the right to assign this Agreement without the prior written consent 13. of the other party.
- 14. Compliance with Law. In connection with the services rendered hereunder, both parties agree to abide by all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations.
- 15. **Independent Contractor.** The relationship between the City and the Judge is that of independent contractors. It is understood and agreed that the Judge is not and shall not be deemed an employee of the City. As such, the Judge shall be responsible for all administrative employment matters for the Judge, if any, such as payment of salaries and wages, withholding and payment of all federal, state and local employment taxes, providing worker compensation insurance coverage, and providing non-obligatory fringe benefits programs. The Judge agrees to hold the City harmless from direct out-of-pocket expenses of the City that may arise from the Judge's failure to withhold taxes or to conduct himself/herself in accordance with applicable law.
- 16. **Absence**. In the event the Judge is temporarily unable to preside due to absence, illness or disqualification, the Judge shall designate an attorney or other qualified person to act as Judge Pro Tempore. In the event the Judge fails to appoint a Judge Pro Tempore, one shall be appointed in accordance with the provisions set forth in the Lansing City Code.
- 17. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with, and all actions arising hereunder shall be governed by, the laws of the State of Kansas.

# CITY OF LANSING, KANSAS MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE – SCOPE OF WORK

The Judge's primary responsibilities shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Presiding over the Court's regularly scheduled dockets;
- 2. Scheduling and presiding over such additional or special dockets or hearings as may from time to time be necessary for expeditious disposition of pending matters;
- 3. Establishing or ratifying a fine schedule applicable to traffic infractions and any other violation for which a scheduled fine is permissible;
- 4. Establishing or ratifying policies and procedures for posting and revoking appearance bonds;
- 5. Adjudging such convictions, acquittals and other dispositions as the evidence and law warrant;
- 6. Imposing authorized punishment upon persons convicted of violating city ordinances;
- 7. Issuing or authorizing the issuance of such subpoenas, bench warrants, arrest warrants and other process as court procedures and the facts and law warrant; and
- 8. Coordinating administrative aspects of his/her performance hereunder with the Municipal Court Clerk or designee to ensure effective and efficient operation of the Court.

SUBJECT: Construction and Inspection Services for the K7 & Eisenhower Project

**Explanation:** Proposals for Construction Engineering & Inspection (CE&I) services for the K7 & Eisenhower Intersection improvement project were sent to five separate firms which provide this service. Of the firms, Benesch provided the one responsive proposal that was able to meet the time and staff commitments for the request. The City of Leavenworth staff was involved in the process, and concur with the selection of Benesch for the CE&I services.

**Policy Considerations:** The Selection of Benesch as the Construction Engineering Consultant is consistent with past projects and is consistent with the Professional Services provisions of the purchasing policy.

**Financial Considerations:** The contract is for Time & Expense with a Not to Exceed of \$109,650. This is considered a construction expense and was specifically identified as such in the three-party agreement, whereas Leavenworth is responsible for 1/3 of this cost.

**Action:** Accept the proposal from Benesch Engineers for the Construction and Inspection Services for an amount not to exceed \$109,650.
