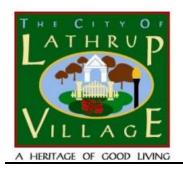

Addressing the City Council

- Your comments shall be made during times set aside for that purpose.
- Stand or raise a hand to indicate that you wish to speak.
- When recognized, state your name, and direct your comments and/or questions to any City official in attendance.
- Each person wishing to address the City Council and/or attending officials shall be afforded one opportunity of up to three (3) minutes duration during the first and last occasion for citizen comments and questions and one opportunity of up to three (3) minutes duration during each public hearing. Comments made during public hearings shall be relevant to the subject for which the public hearings are held.
- In addition to the opportunities described above, a citizen may respond to questions posed to him or her by the Mayor or members of the Council, provided members have been granted the floor to pose such questions.
- No speaker may make personal or impertinent attacks upon any officer, employee, or City Council member or other Elected Official, that is unrelated to the manner in which the officer, employee, or City Council member or other Elected Official, performs his or her duties.
- No person shall use abusive or threatening language toward any individual when addressing the City Council.
- Any person who violates this section shall be directed by the Mayor to be orderly and silent. If a person addressing the Council refuses to become silent when so directed, such person may be deemed by the Mayor to have committed a "breach of the peace" by disrupting and impeding the orderly conduct of the public meeting of the City Council and may be ordered by the Mayor to leave the meeting. If the person refuses to leave as directed, the Mayor may direct any law enforcement officer who is present to escort the violator from the meeting.

1. Call to Order by Mayor Garrett

2. Discussion Items

A. Committee Appointments

The Mayor and Council will need to appoint members to various Boards and commissions. The Recreation Advisory Committee, Planning Commission, Southfield Public School Liaison, Downtown Development Authority, the Election Commission, and the Tree Committee.

Mayor Garrett suggests Councilmember Jennings for Southfield Public School Liaison, Councilmember Barksdale for Recreation Advisory Committee, Planning Commission, Jason Hammond, and Tree Committee Mayor Garrett. The DDA bylaws state that the mayor is a sitting member; Mayor Garrett suggests that the Mayor Pro Tem be the alternate in the mayor's absence. Mayor Pro Tem Kantor was appointed to the Election Commission.

There was a discussion on creating an Equity Inclusion and Accessibility Committee. Mayor Garrett suggests that staff generate an application and recruit members for that committee.

B. Water & Sewer Rates

In the past, the Water Department has not charged Tap Fee (the amount charged to connect to the city water and sewer lines) for new construction. The department surveyed similar-sized cities about the average cost for tap fees, water service, and meter cost. These fees will not be charged through the Building Department, so the funds will not be subject to Building Department contractual fees.

C. Driveway and Concrete

Code Enforcement Officer Harris requests that the Council consider permitting cement for driveways to keep property owners from cementing over too much property for parking and help keep track of the impervious service water issue.

D. Water Service Line Identification

Although the city has been working on this project for almost two years there are still approximately 200 homes that still need to have the lines identified. The deadline has been moved up to October 16, 2024, from the original December 31st deadline. Therefore, the Council needs to press the importance of the remainder of the project to the new Administrator to start to work on this issue as soon as possible.

E. Laundromat Ordinance

There is a commercial property that has proposed to open a laundromat. The current ordinance does not identify a laundromat as a permitted use. The Planning Commission has reviewed the site plan, held a Public Hearing, and recommended the project for Council approval in October. Eric Pietsch of Giffels Webster was in attendance to answer any questions.

F. Separate Water Meters

Residents using sprinkler systems or swimming pools are charged for sewage rates when watering the grass or filling the swimming pool. The request is to have a separate water meter for these households. One possible way to determine the total cost would be to do a survey in the newsletter to see how many households have pool and sprinkler systems.

Regarding cross-training, former Treasurer Bratschi had an accounting and a finance background, and it has been challenging to find someone with both. The Plante Moran contract will cost an additional \$1,500 monthly, divided 80% from the general fund and 20% from the water and sewer fund.

Councilmember Jennings welcomed 44 Burrito to Lathrup Village—the new burrito restaurant at 26780 Southfield Rd.

Mayor Garrett addressed Mr. Wisz's questions, stating there will only be video on the regular council meeting as a cost-saving measure.

Administrator Greene addressed the salary split portion of the question, stating that the DDA controls its expenses. There will be a later discussion with DDA regarding the matter.

C. ZBA Public Hearing - 26710 Meadowbrook Way at 7:42 p.m.

Eric Pietsch of Giffels Webster gave the Zoning Board a brief overview of the five (5) different variances considered in this request.

Section 5.16.2.E States - When an accessory building or structure is located on a corner lot, the side lot line of which is substantially a continuation of the front lot line of the lot to its rear, such building or structure shall not be located within a setback which is equal to the front yard setback required of the lot to the rear of such corner lot. Section 5.16.1.B states – Yard, Front. An open space extending the entire width of the lot, between the front lot line and the front of the main building, and unoccupied from the ground upwards by any structure. The applicant requests a waiver allowing the proposed structure to be partially located in the front yard.

- 2. Section 5.16.1.F states that an accessory building over 100 square feet shall be erected, placed, or installed on a four-inch thick concrete foundation slab at least as large as the building. The applicant requests a waiver of the concrete slab requirement for both an existing and proposed structure.
- 3. Section 5.16.2.C states that no detached accessory structure or building shall exceed 10 feet in height unless adhering to all requirements of a main building. The applicant is requesting a waiver for the existing structure.

- 4. Section 5.16.2.D states In no instance shall the combined floor area of all accessory uses and buildings exceed 160 square feet. The applicant's combined square footage is 400 square feet; he is requesting a waiver.
- 5. Section 5.16.1.B States Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected in any front yard nor in any exterior side yard.

Consideration to Approve/Deny Accessory Structure Variance Application - 26710 Meadowbrook Way

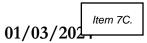

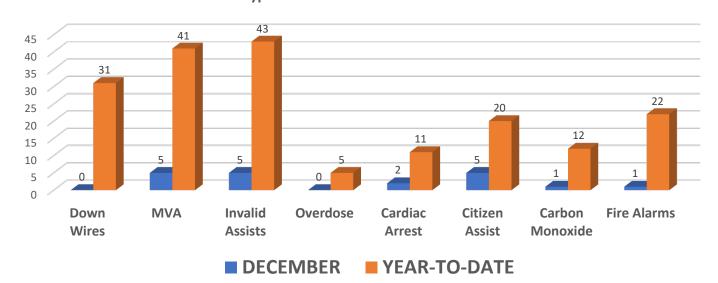
