Decision: stretchy or tablecloth fabric, or both? Even if it's extra. (Fabric online was \$125) so won't go much over budget.)

Vote: both. Bill will confirm items. We'll do this quickly. Will finish offline.

Melissa relayed update on Sadaf's population demographics report of Laurel: 29,000 people. 14-16% white, 22% hispanic, black/african 51%, asian/pacific/middle east/india 10%.

- Laurel Town Center Laurel Window Artwork Update (Melissa)
- artwork from Laurel HS students, Melissa sent it on to the town center liaison (who is working with a design firm in R.I.) She'll be using Sign-A-Rama for the wraps. Last year's is still up near Mission BBQ. Teachers were pleased to get the supplies city paid for. Art will go up soon.
- School Engagement, Creative Outlets/Scotchtown Elementary (Melissa)

Angelie (sp?) Anjali Wells got a grant to work on it, PG County has set up some schools to have liaisons to find ways to enrich what the kids are doing.

We funded part of her work, will also display the kid's art at Armory in May (not March 19th/cancelled). Melissa will send date to Bill so he can book the place.

They chose one of Jennifer's poems for this.

Poem in Park - April 26 (Jennifer, Melissa) AND Poetry writing workshop - April 5 by Jennifer. Laurel Municipal Pool mtg room. Volunteers needed. Jennifer will lead the intro exercises and workshop. The attendees will be able to take a booklet home with them. Cheryl Dyer (L4P) will lead attendees in crating the booklet.

Poetry they do on the 5th is going to be set up for the later event. Hopefully will feed into the ceremony on the 26th.

Angie and Melissa agreed to volunteer, setup is low. If City I.T. can provide a projector, will use tech optionally; otherwise she'll read it out-- Bill will look into getting something for her.

Bill picked up notebooks and pens for the writing workshop; Melissa will bring them.

Planning still in progress for Poem in the Park event, basically going to install put the a nature poemtry onto a picnic table via metal overlay, and possibly a different kind of use special paper to hang <u>poems</u> on trees etc. Bill has some info: Cheryl Dyer (sp?) reserved the <u>pavillion pavilion</u> at Sweitzer Park, she's working with <u>the city deptParks & Rec</u> for the metal/plastic <u>poem overlay, that which</u> the city will secure to a picnic table (city will deliver day before/morning of). Cheryl is part of Laurel for the Patuxent (L4P).

Quick Stop Mural (<u>LP4L4P</u>) celebrating birds

New owner (who also owns Olive on Main) is going to hold a fundraiser <u>for mural</u>. Cheryl wants to use <u>a guyartist</u> named Jahru (Baltimore), who offered to do it for half his normal cost (around \$20K for the whole wall, 40' long). Look at Burtonsville Crossing for an example. Original idea was a bird mural for the <u>naiontallynationally</u> known <u>ornothologistornithologist</u> who lived in Laurel, Chandler Robbins. LAC does not have to put any money into it, we (LAC) just have to review the final design.

Budget planning

We have not used much. Most of our activities have become recurrent events, or partners like L4P or companies. This is good.

Farmer's Market music tbd. Starts May 1st. Only \$180 left for this year; we could move money to fund this. Market will be every week but music only every other week. We need two for May, two for June = $4 \times 180 = 720$.

We are not doing crosswalk or traffic wraps this year. Vote agreed: shift money to cover music.

We have money for art supplies for Main St, etc.
