SUBJ: Bid Recommendation for Purchase of Unmanned Aerial System

The Laurel Police Department is requesting permission to sign a five-year contract for the use of two Unmanned Aerial Systems from Skydio with funds allocated in the FY2027 Operating Budget. Skydio is affiliated with Axon and payments and billing will be handled by Axon.

The technology will allow the Laurel Police Department to start its first ever Drone as First Responder (DFR) program. Drones will be housed on city buildings and operated remotely by trained and FAA-certified personnel. The devices will be able to arrive over calls for service before officers arrive, and stream live video to dispatchers, responding officers, and supervisors.

The Skydio drones are fully integrated into our current Axon evidence ecosystem. Footage from the drones is automatically uploaded to Axon's evidence.com website. The Skydio drones can locate an officer's Axon body worn camera and in-car camera.

Procurement:

In selecting a DFR vendor, LPD Commanders spoke with numerous agencies and performed site visits with the Montgomery County PD's UAS team and the Anne Arundel County PD's UAS team. We obtained quotes from three companies: Skydio, Paladin, and Brinc. Ultimately, LPD selected Skydio because of their Axon integration, their use of US manufactured drones that are not subject to federal import restrictions, and their reputation with area law enforcement for ease of use and robust customer support. The Skydio platform was used on a trial basis during the week of Preakness 151 and exceeded our expectations.

Bids:

1. Skydio \$89,649.60 annually for five-year contract, US manufactured
2. Brinc \$120,000 annually, free first year, four-year contract, US manufactured
3. Paladin \$122,000 first year, \$74,000 annually after, Chinese manufactured

SUBJ: Bid Recommendation for Purchase of Peregrine AI

The Laurel Police Department is requesting permission to contract with Peregrine AI to use their application to enhance the Laurel Police Department’s data analytics.

The Peregrine AI system will aggregate and analyze data from a number of existing data sources, including the police department’s Records Management System and Computer Aided Dispatch, as well as transcripts from body worn camera videos and license plate readers. The AI tools can quickly summarize investigations, perform link analysis with persons and vehicles, and allow the agency’s crime analyst to do in minutes what typically takes hours or days to accomplish. Deep crime analysis will no longer be restricted to only the department’s most serious crimes and will become a tool that all officers can deploy in their routine investigations.

The Peregrine product was deployed for a demonstration during the week of Preakness 151 and proved to be a valuable tool during several incidents.

Procurement:

Peregrine AI is a sole source provider who uses a patented technology to handle “de-duplication” of data records. The Prince George’s County Police Department is a current client of Peregrine AI and procured them via sole source. The “de-duplication” technology sold exclusively by Peregrine allows for the identification and consolidation of duplicate database entries. Duplicate entity records are a serious concern in our current police records management software, and this technology solution would be of great value.

Funding:

Funding for this purchase is included in the Adopted FY2027 Operating Budget – Department of Information Technology account 52312-Law Enforcement Intelligence Systems.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF LAUREL, MARYLAND TO DISSOLVE THE NO-KILL COMMUNITY ANIMAL SHELTER CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED BY RESOLUTION NO. 6-2023

Sponsored by the President at the request of the Administration.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Laurel, Maryland adopted Resolution No. 6-2023 on July 10, 2023, establishing the No-Kill Community Animal Shelter Citizens Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Committee was to provide input, guidance, and recommendations regarding the development and implementation of a no-kill community animal shelter initiative; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have reviewed the current structure, effectiveness, and ongoing need for the Committee; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Committee is no longer necessary in its current form, or that its responsibilities may be more effectively managed through existing City operations, partnerships, or administrative processes; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to formally dissolve the No-Kill Community Animal Shelter Citizens Advisory Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 6-2023 originally adopted on July 10, 2023 is hereby repealed in its entirety; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the No-Kill Community Animal Shelter Citizens Advisory Committee established by Resolution No. 6-2023 is hereby dissolved and all appointments to the Committee shall terminate upon the effective date of this Resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all records, documents, and materials associated with the Committee shall be transferred to the Office of the City Clerk for the proper archiving according to the applicable records retention policy.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect on the date of its adoption.
