System will introduce bacteria into existing drainfield lines to remove bio mat build up and prolong the life of the septic system. Add SludgeHammer Floating Matrix before effluent filter. The following is the proposal for the operation, leasing, maintenance, and caring for said hall by the Laurel Lions Club. In the following steps the Laurel Lions Club aims to show their commitment to the stewardship of the former JC hall at Riverside Park.

Seeing the success that we as Laurel Lions along with the community have accomplished to date with our primary 'Legacy Project' at South Pond Park, we, the Laurel Lions have a desire to see the former JC Hall brought back to a community event center that it has not seen in many years. The Laurel Lions Club would like to make the stewardship of the former JC Hall to become our new 'Legacy Project'.

- 1. The stewardship of JC Hall will include the rental, scheduling, and final cleaning of said property. The Laurel Lions Club intends to keep the prices for rental that have been set by the city of Laurel. - 4.
