Summary: When the City considers setting its millage rate above the rollback rate the Georgia State Law requires three public hearings. The City is proposing to set its millage rate at 2.228, which is 0.64 mils above the calculated roll back rate. The rollback rate is calculated to be 1.864. The City has budgeted \$3,873,320 in property taxes based on the millage rate at 2.228.


Proposed Millage

- Proposed Millage is 2.228
 - Same Millage Rate as FY 2022
 - Property Tax Revenue for FY 2023: \$3,858,000
 - Total additional: \$1,043,000
 - Reduced the need to use Fund Balance from the Electric Fund
 - Helps cover services such as:
 - Adding an additional Community Outreach Officer to work with the City's Co-Responder program
 - Increased costs for supplies such as Fuel for Vehicles, increased costs in vehicle replacement, and utility costs



Proposed Millage

- The Proposed Millage for FY 2023 is 2.228
 - Rollback Rate 1.864
 - FY 2022 Millage increase was the first in over 30 years






