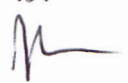

4. Election of CAG Chair

John Hoyt was re-elected as CAG Chair by a unanimous vote.

5. Receive Report from EPA and EPA Contractors:

- **Overview of Site Status Relative to the CERCLA Process**
- **Discuss Remedial Action construction and system startup**
- **Discuss results of most recent sampling event**

Mr. Stephen Tzhone (EPA), Mr. Alex Spiller (EA Engineering) and Mr. Greg Thome (HydroGeoLogic) presented on these topics and answered related questions. The presenters provided the following general information:

- A review of site background information, the Superfund process, the Record of Decision and Remedial Design.
- A review of groundwater monitoring results from 2015, 2016, 2019, and 2022. Of the wells sampled in December 2022, water samples from five wells contained tetrachloroethene (PCE) above EPA's Maximum Contamination Level of 5 µg/L. The December 2022 well sampling results were consistent with historical project data. December 2022 was the last groundwater monitoring event. A groundwater monitoring event will be conducted in December 2023.
- A review of air monitoring results from 2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023. Of the sites where air samples were collected in September 2023, none contained PCE concentrations above EPA's Industrial Air Risk Screening Level of 47µg/m³. PCE concentrations detected in air samples collected in September 2023 were generally less than those detected in December 2022.
- A detailed description of Remedial Action (RA) infrastructure that has been installed. All soil vapor extraction (SVE) and in-situ bioremediation (ISB) infrastructure has been installed. SVE system startup testing is being conducted; the systems should be fully operational in January 2024. Thirteen ISB injection wells have been installed, ISB amendment fluids will be injected in select wells in January 2024 with follow-up injections planned for 2024 and 2026.
- A description of planned RA system operations from early 2023 through summer 2028.
- EPA plans to hold a remediation system ribbon cutting ceremony at Site 2 (former Pilgrim Cleaners) in late January 2024.

1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Determine if Quorum is Present.

Resident Drew Power thanked the Commissioners for letting him sit with them and listen to the meeting.

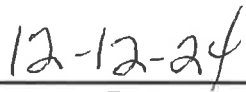

Sec. 1.06.003 Citizen's police advisory committee

- (a) *Committee's charge.* The committee serves as a liaison between the police department and community. The committee serves as an advocate for programs, ideas, and methods to improve the relationship between the police and community and to enhance the quality of life in our community. The committee shall not have independent authority, but shall work in conjunction with the police department.
- (b) *Mission statement.*
 - (1) The committee's mission is to work in partnership with the city police department to assure it maintains the highest standards of integrity and to assist in improving quality of life through the delivery of professional, superior, and compassionate police services to the community. Finally, the committee should apply knowledge, skills, and resources to foster an environment where all people can live safely and without fear. Furthermore, it is designed to assist making recommendations that will enhance the quality of life through delivery of service.
 - (2) The committee's mission is accomplished within the framework of the following set of values:
 - (A) Accountability;
 - (B) Protection;
 - (C) Prevention;
 - (D) Commitment;
 - (E) Compassion;
 - (F) Achievement.
- (c) *Objective.* The committee's objective is to advise the police department through the engagement of interaction with its citizens through friendly community police initiatives in preserving the peace in a manner consistent with the freedoms secured by the Constitution. In doing so, the role of the police department is to enforce the law in a fair and impartial manner, recognizing both the statutory and judicial limitations of law enforcement authority and the constitutional rights of all persons.
- (d) *Committee structure and membership.*
 - (1) Mayor and city council shall appoint not more than 13 voting members. Each member of city council shall appoint two members to the committee. The mayor shall appoint three members to the committee. All committee members that are appointed will serve coterminous with the council member that appointed them. A quorum exists when 50 percent of the appointed voting members are present.
 - (2) The members of the committee shall either be permanent residents of the city, work or maintain a place of business in the city, or be engaged in the community in a serving capacity. Diversity of the committee is essential to its success, i.e., youth, millennials, baby boomers, etc.
 - (3) Committee members shall have good reputations for integrity and community service and shall not have been convicted or received a deferred sentence for a felony crime.
 - (4) No nominee to the committee or any members of the nominee's immediate family shall be currently employed by the city nor be a former sworn employee of the city police department.
 - (5) Each nominee must be prepared and committed to invest the necessary time in enhancing police community relations in a manner that helps reduce crime and enhances relationships between the police and the community.

- (6) One city council member shall be assigned as a non-voting city council member liaison to the committee. The city council liaison shall be rotated at the end of one year of service to the committee, or at the end of his or her term, and may only be extended if there are no other city council members available or desiring to serve.
 - (7) The committee members will elect a chair and vice-chair and a secretary annually at the first meeting following each General Election. Appointments for open positions on the committee, occurring throughout the year, shall be made as soon as possible for the remaining term of the position by the City Council Member or Council Place that the appointed the previous member.
 - (8) All members of the committee shall be considered to be city volunteers. The committee shall function in an advisory capacity only and shall have no authority over city employees.
 - (9) The committee members receive no direct or indirect compensation from the city for their services as members of the committee.
 - (10) The committee may not include any employee of the city, or any vendor or contractor of the city.
 - (11) A committee member serves at the discretion of the mayor and city council. If a committee member resigns, fails to attend two consecutive committee meetings without excused absence (per the chair), or otherwise becomes unable to serve on the committee, the chairperson may declare the position on the committee to be vacant and request that the mayor and city council appoint another qualified person to the committee. Future appointments will follow the process as outlined in this section.
- (e) *Duties and responsibilities.*
- (1) The committee advises and assists the police department to:
 - (A) Create dialog and explore the perceptions of the police department, and the community concerning the inter-relationship with each other regarding public safety issues within the community;
 - (B) Receive information concerning the police department programs and operations;
 - (C) Provide input to the police department regarding service needs within the community;
 - (D) Identify gaps in services and/or communication;
 - (E) Enhance the community understanding of the capabilities of the police department in providing services to the community;
 - (F) Identify potential police-community partnerships to address public safety related issues within the community;
 - (G) Identify community resources and support for public safety activities; and give input concerning perceived effectiveness;
 - (H) Provide input on assisting community police initiatives to awareness.
 - (2) The committee is also responsible for disseminating information to the community and to the government officials of the city. The committee chair shall provide an update to the city council on an annual basis or as requested by the mayor and city council.
- (f) *Committee meetings.*
- (1) The committee shall meet, quarterly; or at the call of the chair.
 - (2) All committee meetings shall be held within the city geographic boundaries.

- (3) All information received by the committee will be available to the public under the terms of the Texas Open Records Act and will be retained pursuant to the rules of the Texas State Archives and Library Commission and the city.
 - (4) A quorum of the committee shall consist of **thirty** fifty percent (50%) of the currently appointed members. A quorum must be present to decide on any action items presented to the committee.
 - (5) Minutes of the previous meeting and agenda of the upcoming meeting should be sent to the committee members no later than three business days before the upcoming meeting. Whenever possible, an explanation of agenda items shall accompany the notification. Members who are absent shall receive all materials distributed at missed meetings.
 - (6) A copy of the agenda must be presented to the city secretary three business days prior to the 72 hours posting requirements pursuant with Texas Local Government Code, § 551.043.
 - (7) A copy of the minutes of the previous meeting must be given to the city secretary within ten days of the approval of the minutes by the committee.
 - (8) The current rules of conduct for the city council shall govern the parliamentary procedures, disciplinary proceedings, and rules for the conduct of meetings, so long as not inconsistent with these bylaws. No action of the committee shall be invalidated, or the legality thereof affected, by the failure or omission to observe or follow the rules of conduct.
 - (9) Annually, the initial meeting of the committee will be conducted in accordance to the city's police department's citizen police academy program.
- (g) *City support.* The city shall provide to the committee necessary technical and administrative assistance as follows:
- (1) Provision of a meeting room, including any necessary audio/visual equipment;
 - (2) Preparation and copying of any documentary meeting materials, such as agendas and reports; and distribution of those materials to the committee in a timely manner;
 - (3) Retention of committee meeting records, and providing public access to such records on an Internet website maintained by the city.
- (4) The City staff will take the minutes for the committee.**
- (h) *Committee termination.* The city will sunset when a majority of the city council, by way of voting, believes the committee's existence shall be terminated.
- (i) *Charter.* This section shall grant the authority and rights to the citizens police advisory committee and this document will be known as the "Citizens Police Advisory Committee Charter."

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEON VALLEY, TX, CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 GENERAL FUND BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$28,790 FOR THE PURPOSE OF INCREASING THE CITY MANAGER & COUNCIL DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SEVERABILITY AND SAVING CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Leon Valley has already passed their FY 2024-2025 Budget on August 20th, 2024; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that funding should be added to the FY 2024-2025 Budget; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to adjust the City Manager & Council Department Budget by a total amount of \$28,790.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEON VALLEY, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City’s General Fund budget is hereby adjusted to the amount of \$28,790 to increase the City Manager & Council Department Budget to fulfill the grant agreement with Haven for Hope signed May 2nd, 2024 for a total amount not to exceed \$40,000 for street outreach staff person.

SECTION 2. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Finance Director. The Finance Director may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager’s designee, correct allocations as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any other remaining phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. The repeal of any Ordinance or part of Ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this Ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such Ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the municipality under any section or provisions at the time of passage of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

City Manager Training Report from Public Funds Investment Training
December 5 -6, 2024.

Per the City Manager employment agreement section 12, the *“Employee agrees to provide and turn in all receipts for such expenses and to provide the City Council with a report of what information was learned or obtained at the next reasonable Council Meeting after attending a conference or training session.”*

The governmental entity identified above (“Texas Political Subdivision”), in order to obtain and in consideration for the benefits provided to the Texas Political Subdivision pursuant to the Kroger Texas Settlement Agreement and Full Release of All Claims dated _____ (“Kroger Texas Settlement”), and acting through the undersigned authorized official, hereby elects to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement, release all Released Claims against all Released Entities, and agrees as follows.

1. The Texas Political Subdivision above is aware of and has reviewed the Kroger Settlement Agreement, understands that all terms in this Participation and Release Form have the meanings defined therein, and agrees that by executing this Participation and Release Form, the Texas Political Subdivision elects to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement and become a Participating Texas Political Subdivision as provided therein.
2. The Texas Political Subdivision shall immediately cease any and all litigation activities as to the Released Entities and Released Claims and, within 14 days of executing this Participation and Release Form, its counsel shall work with Kroger’s counsel to dismiss with prejudice any Released Claims that it has filed.
3. The Texas Political Subdivision agrees to the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement pertaining to Texas Political Subdivisions as provided therein.
4. By agreeing to the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement and becoming a Releasor, the Texas Political Subdivision is entitled to the benefits provided therein, including, if applicable, monetary payments beginning after the Effective Date of the Release.
5. The Texas Political Subdivision agrees to use any monies it received through the Kroger Texas Settlement solely for the purposes provided therein.

6. The Texas Political Subdivision submits to the exclusive jurisdiction and authority of the Texas Consolidated Litigation Court as defined in the Kroger Texas Settlement. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing contained in this Participation and Release Form, or the Kroger Texas Settlement, constitutes consent to jurisdiction, express or implied, over the Texas Political Subdivision or its selected counsel to the jurisdiction of any other court (including without limitation MDL 2804, the MDL 2804 Fee Panel, the MDL 2804 Enforcement Committee, or the Court in which any Texas Consent Judgment is filed) for any purpose whatsoever.
7. The Texas Political Subdivision, as a Participating Texas Subdivision, has the right to enforce the Kroger Texas Settlement in the Texas Consolidated Litigation Court as provided therein.
8. The Texas Political Subdivision, as a Participating Texas Subdivision, hereby becomes a Releasor for all purposes in the Kroger Texas Settlement, including but not limited to all provisions of Section V (Release), and along with all departments, agencies, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind and attorneys, and any person in their official capacity elected or appointed to serve any of the foregoing and any agency, person, or other entity claiming by or through any of the foregoing, and any other entity identified in the definition of Releasor, provides for a release to the fullest extent of its authority. As a Releasor, the Texas Political Subdivision hereby absolutely, unconditionally, and irrevocably covenants not to bring, file, or claim, or to cause, assist or permit to be brought, filed, or claimed, or to otherwise seek to establish liability for any Released Claims against any Released Entities in any forum whatsoever. The releases provided for in the Kroger Texas Settlement are intended by the Parties to be broad and shall be interpreted so as to give the Released Entity the broadest possible bar against any liability relating in any way to Released Claims and extend to the full extent of the power of the Texas Political Subdivision to release claims. The Kroger Texas Settlement shall be a complete bar to any Released Claim.
9. The Texas Political Subdivision hereby takes on all rights and obligations of a Participating Texas Subdivision as set forth in the Kroger Texas Settlement.
10. In connection with the releases provided for in the Kroger Texas Settlement, each Texas Political Subdivision expressly waives, releases, and forever discharges any and all provisions, rights, and benefits conferred by any law of any state or territory of the United States or other jurisdiction, or principle of common law, which is similar, comparable, or equivalent to § 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads:

General Release; extent. A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

A Releasor may hereafter discover facts other than or different from those which it knows, believes, or assumes to be true with respect to the Released Claims, but each Texas Political Subdivision hereby expressly waives and fully, finally, and forever settles, releases and discharges, upon the Effective Date, any and all Released Claims that may exist as of such date but which Releasors do not know or suspect to exist, whether through ignorance, oversight, error, negligence or through no fault whatsoever, and which, if known, would materially affect the Governmental Entities' decision to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement.

- 11. The Texas Political Subdivision acknowledges, agrees, and understands that the Maximum Texas Settlement Amount to be paid under the Kroger Texas Settlement for the benefit of the Participating Texas Political Subdivision, is less than or equal to the amount, in the aggregate, of the Alleged Harms allegedly suffered by the governmental entity, constitutes restitution and remediation for damage or harm allegedly caused by Kroger in order to restore, in whole or part, the governmental entity to the same position or condition that it would be in had it not suffered the Alleged Harms; and constitutes restitution and remediation for damage or harm allegedly caused by the potential violation of a law and/or is an amount paid to come into compliance with the law.
- 12. Nothing herein is intended to modify in any way the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement Agreement, to which the Texas Political Subdivision hereby agrees. To the extent this Participation and Release Form is interpreted differently from the Kroger Texas Settlement, the Kroger Texas Settlement controls.

WHEREAS, these actions, conduct and misconduct have resulted in significant financial costs in the past to the County and will undoubtedly result in significant financial costs in the future; and

WHEREAS, the County brought or has investigated claims against The Kroger Co. ("Kroger"), and certain other defendants related to potentially released claims; and (2) other defendants in the opioid supply chain on behalf of the County in *In Re: Texas Opioid Litigation*, MDL No. 2018-63587, currently pending in the 152nd District Court of Harris County, Texas and/or removed pending remand; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2024, the Kroger Defendant in the opioid litigation brought by the County, the State of Texas, through the Office of the Attorney General, and a negotiation group for Texas political subdivisions entered into an Agreement entitled Kroger Texas Statewide Opioid Settlement Agreement and Release (hereinafter collectively the "Texas Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Special Counsel and the State of Texas have recommended that the _____ County Commissioners Court support the adoption and approval of the

Texas Agreement in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, even though the payments from the settlements reflect partial compensation to _____ County for the past damages it has suffered or the future damages it is likely to incur, given the risks of litigation, the fact that it is to the benefit of Texas and the County and its residents, and that it reduces the risks associated with protracted litigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the Commissioners Court of _____ County:

- 1. Support the adoption and approval the Texas Agreement;
- 2. Authorizes the County to execute the Texas Release for the Texas Subdivision Participation Form and Release; and

ORDER (RESOLUTION) AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF PROPOSED TEXAS STATEWIDE OPIOID SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS

BE IT REMEMBERED, at a regular meeting of the Leon Valley City Council of Bexar County, Texas, held on the 17th day of December, 2024, on motion made by Council Place _____ and seconded by Council Place _____ The Leon Valley City Council , the following Order (Resolution) was adopted on December 17, 2024.

WHEREAS, City of Leon Valley obtained information indicating that certain drug companies and their corporate affiliates, parents, subsidiaries, and such other defendants as may be added to the litigation (collectively, "Defendants") have engaged in fraudulent and/or reckless marketing and/or distribution of opioids that have resulted in addictions and overdoses; and

WHEREAS, these actions, conduct and misconduct have resulted in significant financial costs in the past to the City of Leon Valley and will undoubtedly result in significant financial costs in the future; and

WHEREAS, the City of Leon Valley “City” brought or has investigated claims against The Kroger Co. (“Kroger”), and certain other defendants related to potentially released claims; and (2) other defendants in the opioid supply chain on behalf of the City in *In Re: Texas Opioid Litigation*, MDL No. 2018-63587, currently pending in the 152nd District Court of Harris County, Texas and/or removed pending remand; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2024, the Kroger Defendant in the opioid litigation brought by the County, the State of Texas, through the Office of the Attorney General, and a negotiation group for Texas political subdivisions entered into an Agreement entitled Kroger Texas Statewide Opioid Settlement Agreement and Release (hereinafter collectively the “Texas Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, Special Counsel and the State of Texas have recommended that the Leon Valley City Council support the adoption and approval of the

Texas Agreement in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, even though the payments from the settlements reflect partial compensation to City of Leon Valley for the past damages it has suffered or the future damages it is likely to incur, given the risks of litigation, the fact that it is to the benefit of Texas and the County and its residents, and that it reduces the risks associated with protracted litigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the City of Leon Valley :

- 1. Support the adoption and approval the Texas Agreement;
- 2. Authorizes the County to execute the Texas Release for the Texas Subdivision Participation Form and Release; and
- 3. Finds as follows:
 - a. There is a substantial need for repayment of past opioid-related expenditures and payment to help abate current and future opioid-related harms in and about City of Leon Valley and Bexar County, Texas; and
 - b. The City of Leon Valley supports in its entirety the Texas Agreement. The City of Leon Valley understands that the purpose of each Settlement is to effectuate the resolution of the Opioid Litigation against the Kroger Defendants. We also understand that an additional purpose is to ensure the effective means of distributing any potential settlement funds obtained under settlements in Texas and under the jurisdiction of Texas Courts in a manner and means that would promote an effective and meaningful use of the funds in abating the opioid epidemic in this City and throughout Texas.

The City of Leon Valley is hereby authorized to approve and accept the Texas Agreement as set forth herein.

The City of Leon Valley City Council or designated official is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the settlement documents recommended for approval by Special Counsel in the above referenced case and to approve such terms and provisions for the full and final settlement of all matters set forth therein.

The governmental entity identified above (“Texas Political Subdivision”), in order to obtain and in consideration for the benefits provided to the Texas Political Subdivision pursuant to the Kroger Texas Settlement Agreement and Full Release of All Claims dated 12/17/2024 (“Kroger Texas Settlement”), and acting through the undersigned authorized official, hereby elects to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement, release all Released Claims against all Released Entities, and agrees as follows.

1. The Texas Political Subdivision above is aware of and has reviewed the Kroger Settlement Agreement, understands that all terms in this Participation and Release Form have the meanings defined therein, and agrees that by executing this Participation and Release Form, the Texas Political Subdivision elects to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement and become a Participating Texas Political Subdivision as provided therein.
2. The Texas Political Subdivision shall immediately cease any and all litigation activities as to the Released Entities and Released Claims and, within 14 days of executing this Participation and Release Form, its counsel shall work with Kroger’s counsel to dismiss with prejudice any Released Claims that it has filed.
3. The Texas Political Subdivision agrees to the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement pertaining to Texas Political Subdivisions as provided therein.
4. By agreeing to the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement and becoming a Releasor, the Texas Political Subdivision is entitled to the benefits provided therein, including, if applicable, monetary payments beginning after the Effective Date of the Release.
5. The Texas Political Subdivision agrees to use any monies it received through the Kroger Texas Settlement solely for the purposes provided therein.

6. The Texas Political Subdivision submits to the exclusive jurisdiction and authority of the Texas Consolidated Litigation Court as defined in the Kroger Texas Settlement. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing contained in this Participation and Release Form, or the Kroger Texas Settlement, constitutes consent to jurisdiction, express or implied, over the Texas Political Subdivision or its selected counsel to the jurisdiction of any other court (including without limitation MDL 2804, the MDL 2804 Fee Panel, the MDL 2804 Enforcement Committee, or the Court in which any Texas Consent Judgment is filed) for any purpose whatsoever.
7. The Texas Political Subdivision, as a Participating Texas Subdivision, has the right to enforce the Kroger Texas Settlement in the Texas Consolidated Litigation Court as provided therein.
8. The Texas Political Subdivision, as a Participating Texas Subdivision, hereby becomes a Releasor for all purposes in the Kroger Texas Settlement, including but not limited to all provisions of Section V (Release), and along with all departments, agencies, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind and attorneys, and any person in their official capacity elected or appointed to serve any of the foregoing and any agency, person, or other entity claiming by or through any of the foregoing, and any other entity identified in the definition of Releasor, provides for a release to the fullest extent of its authority. As a Releasor, the Texas Political Subdivision hereby absolutely, unconditionally, and irrevocably covenants not to bring, file, or claim, or to cause, assist or permit to be brought, filed, or claimed, or to otherwise seek to establish liability for any Released Claims against any Released Entities in any forum whatsoever. The releases provided for in the Kroger Texas Settlement are intended by the Parties to be broad and shall be interpreted so as to give the Released Entity the broadest possible bar against any liability relating in any way to Released Claims and extend to the full extent of the power of the Texas Political Subdivision to release claims. The Kroger Texas Settlement shall be a complete bar to any Released Claim.
9. The Texas Political Subdivision hereby takes on all rights and obligations of a Participating Texas Subdivision as set forth in the Kroger Texas Settlement.
10. In connection with the releases provided for in the Kroger Texas Settlement, each Texas Political Subdivision expressly waives, releases, and forever discharges any and all provisions, rights, and benefits conferred by any law of any state or territory of the United States or other jurisdiction, or principle of common law, which is similar, comparable, or equivalent to § 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads:

General Release; extent. A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

A Releasor may hereafter discover facts other than or different from those which it knows, believes, or assumes to be true with respect to the Released Claims, but each Texas Political Subdivision hereby expressly waives and fully, finally, and forever settles, releases and discharges, upon the Effective Date, any and all Released Claims that may exist as of such date but which Releasors do not know or suspect to exist, whether through ignorance, oversight, error, negligence or through no fault whatsoever, and which, if known, would materially affect the Governmental Entities' decision to participate in the Kroger Texas Settlement.

- 11. The Texas Political Subdivision acknowledges, agrees, and understands that the Maximum Texas Settlement Amount to be paid under the Kroger Texas Settlement for the benefit of the Participating Texas Political Subdivision, is less than or equal to the amount, in the aggregate, of the Alleged Harms allegedly suffered by the governmental entity, constitutes restitution and remediation for damage or harm allegedly caused by Kroger in order to restore, in whole or part, the governmental entity to the same position or condition that it would be in had it not suffered the Alleged Harms; and constitutes restitution and remediation for damage or harm allegedly caused by the potential violation of a law and/or is an amount paid to come into compliance with the law.
- 12. Nothing herein is intended to modify in any way the terms of the Kroger Texas Settlement Agreement, to which the Texas Political Subdivision hereby agrees. To the extent this Participation and Release Form is interpreted differently from the Kroger Texas Settlement, the Kroger Texas Settlement controls.

WHEREAS, _____ County obtained information indicating that certain drug companies and their corporate affiliates, parents, subsidiaries, and such other defendants as may be added to the litigation (collectively, "Defendants") have engaged in fraudulent and/or reckless marketing and/or distribution of opioids that have resulted in addictions and overdoses; and

WHEREAS, these actions, conduct and misconduct have resulted in significant financial costs in the past to the County and will undoubtedly result in significant financial costs in the future; and

WHEREAS, the County brought or has investigated claims against The Kroger Co. ("Kroger"), and certain other defendants related to potentially released claims; and (2) other defendants in the opioid supply chain on behalf of the County in *In Re: Texas Opioid Litigation*, MDL No. 2018-63587, currently pending in the 152nd District Court of Harris County, Texas and/or removed pending remand; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2024, the Kroger Defendant in the opioid litigation brought by the County, the State of Texas, through the Office of the Attorney General, and a negotiation group for Texas political subdivisions entered into an Agreement entitled Kroger Texas Statewide Opioid Settlement Agreement and Release (hereinafter collectively the "Texas Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Special Counsel and the State of Texas have recommended that the _____ County Commissioners Court support the adoption and approval of the

Texas Agreement in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, even though the payments from the settlements reflect partial compensation to _____ County for the past damages it has suffered or the future damages it is likely to incur, given the risks of litigation, the fact that it is to the benefit of Texas and the County and its residents, and that it reduces the risks associated with protracted litigation;

PURPOSE

The purpose of this item is to consider approval of an Ordinance amending the Leon Valley Code of Ordinances, Appendix A Fee Schedule, Article A8.000 Building and Construction Related Fees, Section A8.005 Bulk Water Permit, to increase the deposit fee for a bulk water meter. In addition to an increase in the deposit, it is recommended that the Edwards Aquifer Authority (EAA) fee be added, as this is a pass-through fee and must be paid regardless of the use of the water.

Bulk water meters are used by construction companies for site work and building construction, as they provide much more water at a lower price than regular meters. The City has issued nine of these permits in the past twelve months for new construction of subdivisions and other developments.

FISCAL IMPACT

Bulk meters used to cost approximately \$1,000 per meter, but the price has gone up to \$2,500 per meter. If the contractor fails to return the meter or loses the meter, they are required to forfeit the deposit. The current deposit fee will not cover the full cost of the replacement meter.

ORDINANCE No. 2025-__

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEON VALLEY, TEXAS, AMENDING APPENDIX A FEE SCHEDULE, ARTICLE A8 BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION RELATED FEES, SECTION A8.005 BULK WATER FEES OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCREASE THE BULK WATER METER DEPOSIT FEE; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, PENALTY, SEVERABILITY AND SAVINGS CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Leon Valley, as a Home Rule Municipality, derives its powers from its Home Rule Charter and is limited in authority only by express provisions of the Texas Constitution and the State statutes; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with such powers the City Council adopted the Leon Valley Code of Ordinances, Appendix A Fee Schedule to assure that city services and equipment are being adequately reimbursed; and

WHEREAS, City Council determined the fee being charged as a deposit for bulk water meters is not enough to cover replacement costs should a bulk water meter be lost or stolen and that a fee for the Edwards Aquifer Authority (EAA) Habitat Conservation Plan should also be levied to cover costs associated with that plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now determines that in order to be fully reimbursed for costs incurred, the deposit for a bulk water meter must be increased and the EAA fee imposed.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEON VALLEY, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. Amendment. Code of Ordinances, Appendix A Fee Schedule, Article A8.000 Building and Construction Related Fees, Section A8.005 Bulk Water Meter, (b) Deposit is hereby amended to increase the deposit for bulk water meters from \$1,000.00 to \$2,500.00 and a new subsection (e) is added to impose an Edwards Aquifer Authority fee of \$0.62 per 1,000 gallons of water used.

Section 2. Recitals. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Council.

Section 3. Conflicts. All ordinances and codes, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 4. Savings. That all rights and privileges of the City are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provision of any ordinances repealed by this ordinance which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violation and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether

pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City hereby declares that this Ordinance would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. TOMA compliance. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

Section 7. Penalty. A violation of the Leon Valley specific portions of this ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$2,000.00.

Section 8. Effective date. This Ordinance shall be effective upon the date of final adoption hereof and any publication required by law.

PURPOSE

**Applicant/
Property Owner:** Leticia Chapa

Site: The property is located at 7408 Linkwood Street. The owner of the property would like to build a home on the lot.

Staff Comments:

- The site plan indicated the removal of one (1) medium and three (3) large trees from the site to provide for construction of a new custom home and driveway. They will be removing 14 trees from the site of which 10 are dead or dying.
- The applicant will be planting nine (9) trees with a 3” diameter, including six (6) Crape Myrtles, one (1) Mexican Laurel/Mexican Olive and two (2) Mountain Laurels/yaupon/redbud.
- Tree mitigation fees in the amount of \$4,400 would be due to the city. They are requesting a reduction of \$2,900, which would reduce the payment to \$1,500 for a fee-in-lieu.
- City Code mandates that for each medium tree removed, one tree of 6” or more in diameter be planted and for each large tree, one tree of 8” or more in diameter be planted.
- City Code prohibits the removal of any heritage trees, regardless of species.

- The Code further states that up to 25% of all required trees may be mitigated rather than preserved, unless insufficient land area exists on which to plant the required total caliper width of replacement trees, then the “cash in lieu of” amount may be increased up to 50% of the required replacement tree amount.
- City Code states that variances may be granted after consideration and recommendation by the City Council where literal enforcement of the provision of this article will result in unnecessary hardship. No variance may be granted unless:
 - (1) Such variance will not be contrary to the public interest;
 - (2) Such variance will be in harmony with the spirit and purposes of the article;
 - (3) The variance sought is due to unique circumstances existing on the property, and the unique circumstances were not created by the owner of the property and are not merely financial;
 - (4) The variance will not substantially weaken the general purposes of the Tree Preservation Ordinance.

FISCAL IMPACT

The mitigation plan will result in the planting of appropriate tree species and an increase of \$1,500.00 in the Tree Mitigation Fund, which supports additional tree planting at approved sites in Leon Valley. The proposed new home will increase the City’s property tax base.

To Whom It May Concern,

After visiting the property located at 7408 Linkwood St, San Antonio, TX, 78240 on October 7th 2024, I can offer the following findings.

There are roughly 14 trees on the property that I would recommend for removal as they are on very poor health and may cause damage to future construction or construction equipment through failure. Those trees are a mix of Hackberry, Chinaberry and one already half dead Mesquite located on the back side of the property toward the alley.

As it pertains to the Live Oak group in question, I would say that they are in good health. I think that with maintenance pruning, fertilization and ball moss treatments they could be restored to their vibrant health over years of care. I do have some concerns with the trees as there are several wounds on the largest Oak to the left that do need some attention and may not heal the proper way without it. I also have concerns with the root systems in that you can see several large girdling roots which are too big to cut at this point to relieve the pressure which can lead to long term detriment to the trees. There also appears to be minor uplifting on the root systems which could be caused by the lack of nutrients and vitamins over the years as the lot has sat vacant. In my opinion, it is going to take several years of care to restore these trees to their original state.

I would also raise the concern when it comes to future construction the preservation costs that would incur to prevent damage to the root zone as well as the possible damage to any sidewalk to driveway through the activity of the Live Oaks root zones as they can cause significant damage through uplift on any concrete structure poured.

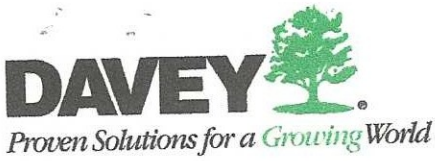

In pursuing the building of a custom home, I knew immediately that building in the Linkwood subdivision of Leon Valley was my goal. I could give you a great explanation as to how I went through several resources to finally settle for the current property. Also, remaining close to family (who currently live in Leon Valley) and church was important to me. This will be my last home and I am eager to become a resident of Leon Valley. Since I had never built a custom home, I was not aware of all the detailed work that was necessary just to break ground..... and here I am! The issue of clearing the trees on the property and pursuing a variance was something of great surprise to me. When my builder and arborist identified the Hackberry, Elm and Mesquite trees, in poor health, as "trash trees". I was optimistic. As a result, the Oaks became an issue. Though I can understand the preservation concern for the Oaks, I feel strongly that in this case, the oaks require significant repair and treatment at a huge expense (i.e. more expensive for the treatment of the trees needed over time than to remove them). The house imposed on the Tree Survey shows the oaks impede on the home layout (driveway). Also, in the arborist report, the "girdling roots" from the oaks over time would infringe on the sidewalk and/or driveway and cause damage to the concrete structure. Again, repair cost. Hence, that is my reason for submitting a request for a variance to remove all the trees. As a result of the tree removal, the submitted landscaping plan reflects a picturesque scope of colorful and healthy trees that would showcase this property in Leon Valley.

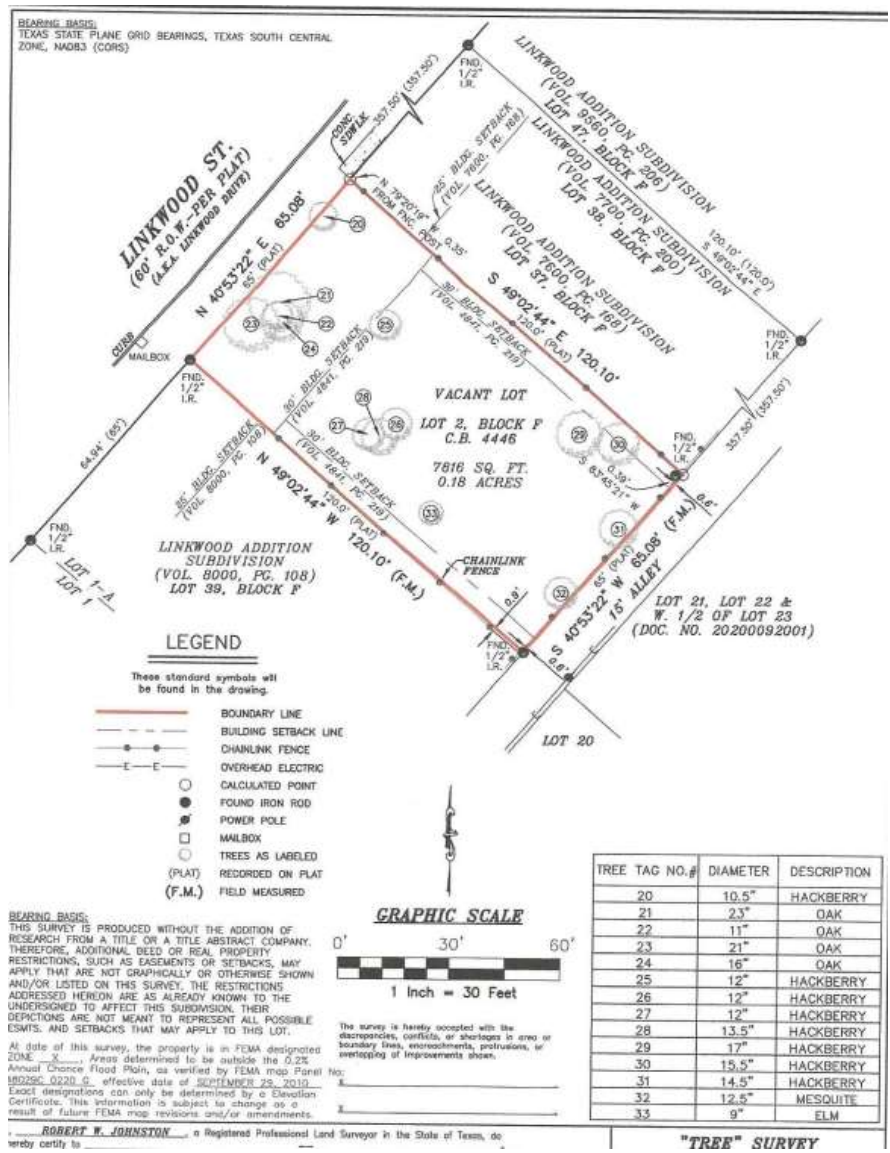

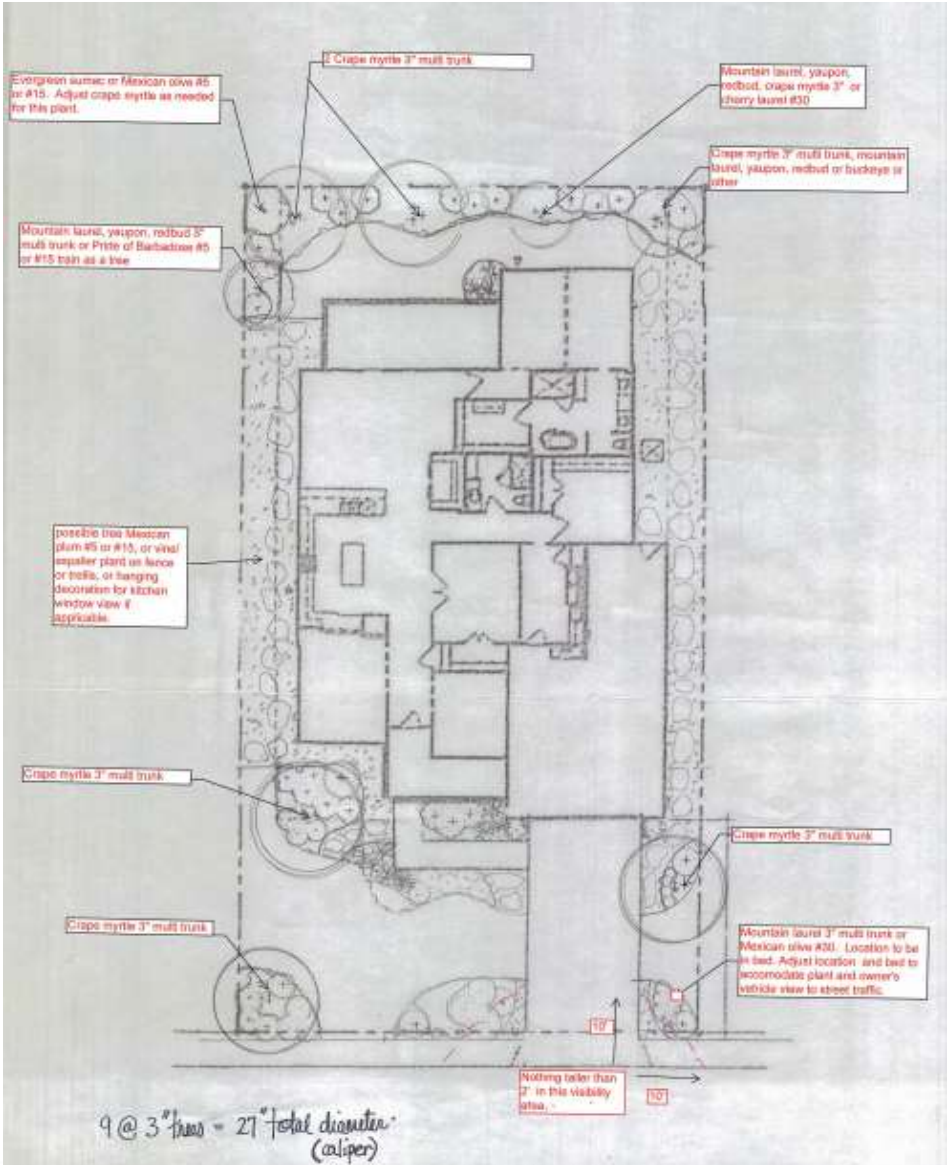

 - On 9/19/2023, the staff took a draft survey to the Council. Staff will amend it and bring it back to the Council at a later time.
 - Will ask for input at the Town Hall meeting. The council decided on the final survey on 12/19/2023.
 - The Council presented the Survey at the Town Hall meeting. The majority of Participants are satisfied with their trash service
 - 02/20/2024- The Council will discuss the distribution of the survey.

- The council decided to mail the survey out to the businesses and residents. The survey was mailed out on 3/19/24. RFP should go out May.
- RFP closes July 18, 2024
- Council will elect a committee on 7/16/2024
 - Council elected the committee
- Staff only received two RFPs
 - Extended the submittal deadline to August 29, 2024, the committee has been contacted, and a meeting will be scheduled after that date.
- Committee met on September 4, 2024

 - Elected a sub-committee
 - Rounded the submittals down to two.
 - Sub-committee met 9/25/2024
 - Interviews with the sub committee 10/2/2024
 - Committee voted on Tiger as their recommendation at 10/16/24 mtg
 - Committee will make their recommendation to council on November 5, 2024 council meeting.
 - Council gave direction to City Manager to negotiate with Tiger
 - The contract will be on 12/3/2024
 - This item passed Unanimously
