

The Lincoln Parish Police Jury met in regular session on Tuesday, March 10, 2026 at 6:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, 100 West Texas Avenue, Ruston, Louisiana. Present were: Greg Williams, District One; Karen Ludley, District Two; Dan Lord, District Three; T.J. Cranford, District Four; Logan Hunt, District Five; Glenn Scriber, District Six; Matt Pullin, District Seven; Chris Garriga, District Eight; Lynda Henderson, District Nine; Milton Melton, District Ten; Diane Richards, District Eleven; and Annette Straughter, District Twelve.

President Scriber called the meeting to order, and Logan Hunt delivered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dan Lord offered a motion, seconded by Chris Garriga, to approve the Agenda as presented. The motion was voted upon and carried with the following votes:

2. Authorize advertisement for bids for asphalt materials.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE POLICE JURY PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE AN ENTITY-STATE AGREEMENT WITH THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND DEVELOPMENT (DOTD) FOR THE OFF-SYSTEM BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, Louisiana DOTD has allocated funds necessary to finance the replacement of the bridge located on Spring Creek Road over Wafer Creek, in Lincoln Parish, Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the Project is identified as State Project No. H.015455.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-14

LINCOLN PARISH POLICE JURY

The following Resolution was offered by Annette Straughter who moved for its adoption at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Lincoln Parish Police Jury held this date, March 10, 2026.

"WHEREAS, the Lincoln Parish Police Jury is committed to providing safe potable water to all citizens of Lincoln Parish; and

WHEREAS, the Mt. Zion Water System has an immediate need for the replacement of water mains along LA-563 in the area referred to as the Big Creek bottoms; and

WHEREAS, the replacement of these mains will provide for safer, more reliable potable water to all users of the Mt. Zion Water System; and

WHEREAS, neither the Lincoln Parish Police Jury, nor the Mt. Zion Water System have sufficient unappropriated funds on hand for the required capital improvement project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in accordance with the requirements of the Community Water Enrichment Fund (CWEF) Program, the Lincoln Parish Police Jury does hereby support and cordially request grant authorization to execute and submit an emergency application to the Community Water Enrichment Fund (CWEF) Program.

FURTHER, that Glenn Scriber, President, or Courtney Hall, Parish Administrator, be authorized to sign the application, contract, and all Requests for Payment or other documents required by the Community Water Enrichment Fund (CWEF) Program; and

FURTHER, that Michael Sutton, Parish Treasurer, be and he is hereby authorized to serve as the Certifying Officer to attest to the signatures of Glenn Scriber and Courtney Hall as authorized signatories."

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 42 (TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES) OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN STATE OF LOUISIANA PROVIDING THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN, STATE OF LOUISIANA, BE AMENDED, TO ADD A SECTION TO BE NUMBERED ____ AND TO DEFINE THE OFFENSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF LINCOLN PARISH, LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION CONVENED THIS 10th DAY OF MARCH, 2026:

SECTION 1

That the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Lincoln, State of Louisiana, be amended by adding a section to be number 42.36 to read as follows:

Sec. 42-36 Speed Limits – Water Tank Road

“No motor vehicle, as defined by Louisiana law, shall be operated at a speed in excess of 45 miles per hour on that section of Water Tank Road between La. Hwy 3061 and Fourth Street and at a speed in excess of 35 miles per hour on that section of Water Tank Road between Fourth Street and La. Hwy 146.”

SECTION 2

That the limit of speed referred to hereinabove shall be duly posted and displayed by means of appropriate highway speed limit signs.

SECTION 3

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4

That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its promulgation.
