- Premium RV site from \$40.00 to \$55.00 per night
- Deluxe RV site from \$45.00 to \$65.00 per night

Chairman Lord proposed that the daily archery range fee also be increased from \$8.00 to \$10.00. Following further discussion, Annette Straughter offered a motion, seconded by Karen Ludley, to make adjustment to the fees as proposed. The motion passed with the following votes:

Mr. Sutton indicated that approximately \$813,000.00 remained as unobligated. Parish Administrator Courtney Hall presented the Committee with several potential projects which included: reducing the amount of the bond obligation for the current sewer improvements project (\$350,000.00); funding a request from the Lincoln Parish Sheriff for crime surveillance equipment (\$175,000.00); making improvements to the existing sewer plant building for office space (\$150,000.00); replacing the lighting at the Expo Center (\$50,000.00); purchasing furniture for the H.E.L.P. Agency facility (\$50,000.00); and funding a spay/neuter program (\$25,000.00). After discussion, Chris Garriga offered a motion, seconded by Matt Pullin, to approve the recommendations. The motion carried with the following votes:
