The Sparta Groundwater Commission continues to work for the north Louisiana parishes with the primary goal of the preservation of the Sparta Aquifer for generations to come. The consistent support that Lincoln Parish has provided has aided our efforts in regional education programs, community and leadership outreach, and continued quest for current and future planning data.

The Sparta Commission's persistent efforts to fund an updated groundwater study and the development of a water budgeting database have proved successful. Thanks to the support of our region, including the Lincoln Parish Police Jury, we were selected as a recipient of the EDA's 2019 Disaster Relief grant funds. Our progress on this project continues to move forward as we now have in place a four-year CEA with USGS for annual data collection. In addition, we implemented a contract with Burns & McDonnell which will result in an updated groundwater model and water budget in the Spring of 2024. This water management tool, upon completion, will be made available to the region's stakeholders including Lincoln Parish leadership.

Lincoln Parish has proved to be a strong advocate for the preservation of the Sparta Aquifer for many years. The 2023 contribution of \$2,500 has been greatly appreciated. As you are preparing your 2024 budget the Sparta Groundwater Conservation District Commission respectfully asks for your continued active support and consideration of a financial contribution equal to or greater than previous years. Dear Mr. Durrett and Mr. Hall:

We respectfully request the following be considered for funding in the budget of 2024 of the Lincoln Parish Police Jury, to-wit:

- 1. Funding be continued for the court reporters, Monique Guidroz and Weita Gaskin for 2024; if there is a cost of living raise given to employees of the Lincoln Parish Police Jury that they also be given that cost of living raise. We request also that the court reporter's retirement and insurance benefits be paid. We also request that when a court reporter is ill or all court reporters are in court with their judge and we have to hire a court reporter to fill in on an Ad Hoc/Pro Tempore case that their contract amounts be paid by the Police Jury.
- 2. A reminder that the Court Reporter equipment needs continual repairing and updating for the future and possibly replaced in all three courtrooms when needed.
- 3. We request that video conferencing equipment be placed in Courtroom Number 1 and Courtroom Number 2, in that order, so that we can better utilize video conference capabilities, be more efficient and save expenses of transportation of incarcerated individuals.
- 4. We request that the Police Jury repair the ceiling in our kitchen and the floor from the flooding that occurred a few months back. The kitchen is not usable at this time.
- 5. We are requesting that our office receive funds from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 that has been sent to your office for distribution. The Treasury is launching this much-needed relief to:
 - Replace lost public sector revenue to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs. (this section qualifies the Judges' Office)

Please see attached formula that was given to us to determine how much our office could receive. That total amount \$75,539.50 which is what we request. Documentation is also attached.

As always, we appreciate the services furnished to us by the Police Jury and our relationship with you. We look forward to serving with you to meet the needs of the citizens of this parish in the future.

BREAKDOWN OF REQUEST

The Third Judicial District Judges Office is requesting money from the COVID Rescue Plan Act of 2021. One reason - our office kept paying our employees during 2020 while revenue went down.

Section of the FACT SHEET dated May 10, 2021 from the U.S. Department of the Treasury – Office of Public Affairs that pertains to the Judges' Office is listed below:

"American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is to provide \$350 billion in emergency funding for state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments." Money released to Lincoln Parish was \$9,079,086.00. "The Treasury also released details on the ways funds can be used to respond to acute pandemic-response needs, fill revenue shortfalls among state and local governments, and support the communities and populations hardest hit by the COVID-19 crisis."
