AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 184-98-(4) OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN STATE OF LOUISIANA PROVIDING THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN, STATE OF LOUISIANA, BE AMENDED BY REVISING CHAPTER 6, MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, TO ADD A SECTION TO BE NUMBERED 6-4.13 AND TO DEFINE THE OFFENSE.

SECTION 1

That the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Lincoln, State of Louisiana, be amended by adding a section to be number 6-4.13 to read as follows:

Sec. 6-4.13 Speed Limits –Girl Scout Road

“No motor vehicle, as defined by Louisiana law, shall be operated at a speed in excess of 35 miles per hour on that section of Girl Scout Road between Highway 80 and One Thousand Feet South of Storey Road.”

SECTION 2

That the limit of speed referred to hereinabove shall be duly posted and displayed by means of appropriate highway speed limit signs.

SECTION 3

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4

That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its promulgation.


The Lincoln Parish Police Jury proposes the following in order to terminate the "Agreement For Construction of Building and Lease" for Lincoln Hall:

1. **PAYMENT:** Police Jury will pay \$210,000.00 within fifteen (15) days of execution of a termination and settlement agreement. The compensation to be paid is for all rights of you and your company in the property currently under lease. You, on behalf of yourself and your company, agree that prior to payment you will execute documents prepared by the Police Jury terminating leasehold rights and acknowledging receipt by you and your company of all compensation to which you are entitled.
2. **TERMINATION DATE:** The lease agreement will terminate, and you will vacate the premises, no later than February 1, 2022. Current building tenants will vacate the premises, no later than March 14, 2022.
3. **PROPERTY:** Per your proposal, all items needed to continue operations will remain.
