#### **ORDINANCE NO. 462-0-22**

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE AN ACT OF SALE BY THE PARISH OF LINCOLN TO SELL ADJUDICATED PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS: <u>PARCEL NO. 26183264516</u> IN ACCORDANCE WITH LA R.S. 47: 2202 T SEQ. AND TO AUTHORIZE THE LINCOLN PARISH POLICE JURY PRESIDENT TO SIGN ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS AND TO ADDRESS THEIR MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO

**WHEREAS**, the immovable property described below was adjudicated to the Parish of Lincoln in 2009, for nonpayment of taxes; and

**WHEREAS**, the three (3) year period for redemption provided by Art. 7, §25 of the Louisiana Constitution has elapsed, as well as the five (5) year redemption period established by Parish Ordinance No: 337-14-0 and the owner of record has failed to redeem the adjudicated property; and

*WHEREAS*, LA R.S. 47: 2202 *et seq.* provides that the Parish may sell adjudicated property in accordance with law after the expiration of the period for redemption; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parish of Lincoln has declared the property described below surplus and not needed for a public purpose and to dispose of said property in accordance with LA R.S. 47:2202, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parish of Lincoln has received a written offer to purchase said property from Asriel G. McClain, for the consideration of \$1,692.85 (One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Two Dollars and Eighty Five Cents) cash, has been accepted by the Lincoln Parish Police Jury; and

**WHEREAS**, the property described herein below will be purchased through the Parish "Lot Next Door" program and is therefore exempt from the public bidding requirement.

**NOW BE IT ORDAINED** by the Lincoln Parish Police Jury, that any Act of Sale of the below described property shall contain the following conditions and requirements:

- 1) This property described as Lincoln Parish Parcel #26183264516, with no municipal address located on Oakdale Street, Ruston, LA and more fully described as:
  - LOTS 16 & 17 OF BLK. 15 OF WASHINGTON HTS. SUBD. (FROM B.H. RAINWATER)(25-479) SUCCN. OF JOHN B. MILLAGE TO LIZZIE MILLAGE (234-618).
- 2) This property shall be sold in accordance with LS-R.S. 47:2201 *et. seq.*, without any warranty, from either the Parish or Management Company, whatsoever, even as to the return of the purchase price.
- 3) The sale shall be on a form approved by the Parish Attorney and that the sales price is paid by certified funds at the time of the sale.
- 4) The sale shall include a reservation of all mineral rights to the Parish, but shall convey all surface rights.

- 5) The following shall be completed prior to closing of sale:
  - a. E&P Consulting Services, LLC shall certify in writing to the Parish Attorney that they have examined the mortgage records, conveyance records, probate and civil suit records of the Parish of Lincoln and that attached to this certification will be a written list of names and last known addresses of all owners, mortgagees, and any other person who may have a vested or contingent interest in the property, or who has filed a request for notice as provided in the former provisions LS-R.S. 33:4720.17(B), as indicated in those records.
  - b. E&P Consulting Services, LLC will provide notice to those persons identified in accordance with LS-R.S. 47:2201 *et. seq.* Proof of said notice will be filed in the conveyance records of Lincoln Parish immediately after the Act of Sale.
  - c. At the time of closing, the E&P Consulting Services, LLC will certify in writing to Parish Attorney and Clerk of Court that the number of days mandated by LS-R.S. 47:2201 *et. seq.* has elapsed since the above required notice was made or attempted and that the property has not been redeemed by the payment of the taxes owed.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, by the Lincoln Parish Policy Jury, that the Police Jury President is hereby authorized to execute a Cash Sale of the above described adjudicated property to the highest acceptable bidder. A RESOLUTION TO URGE AND REQUEST THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND DEVELOPMENT TO TAKE ACTION TO PROVIDE GREATER SAFETY AND TO MINIMIZE VEHICLE DAMAGE IN THE WESTBOUND LANES OF INTERSTATE 20 BETWEEN EXIT 81 IN GRAMBLING, LA AND BIENVILLE PARISH, LA

WHEREAS, these westbound lanes in Lincoln Parish, Louisiana are dangerous for travel and have been the cause of damage to multiple vehicles;

WHEREAS, these lanes are a heavily traveled area; and

WHEREAS, action to provide greater safety to the motoring public in this area is needed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Lincoln Parish Police Jury does hereby request the Department of Transportation and Development to take action to provide greater safety to the motoring public and to minimize vehicle damage on this section of Interstate 20, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana by means of repairing the base and road surfaces for safe travel.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 22-39**

WHEREAS, the Code of Federal Regulations as enacted by the United States Congress mandates that all structures defined as bridges located on all public roads shall be inspected, rated for safe load capacity and posted in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards and that an inventory of these bridges be maintained by each State; and

WHEREAS, the responsibility to inspect, rate and load post those bridges under the authority of Lincoln Parish in accordance with those Standards is delegated by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development to Lincoln Parish.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing authority of Lincoln Parish (herein referred to as the Parish) that the Parish in regular meeting assembled does hereby certify to the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (herein referred to the DOTD) that for the period 1 October, 2021 through 30 September, 2022:

1. The Parish has performed all interim inspections on Parish owned or maintained bridges in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards.

- 2. Bridges owned or maintained by the Parish have been structurally analyzed and rated as to the safe load capacity in accordance with AASPHTO Manual for Maintenance Inspection of Bridges. The load information that has been determined by the LA DOTD for all bridges where the maximum legal load under Louisiana State law exceeds the load permitted under the operating rating as determined above has been critically reviewed by the Parish. Load posting information has been updated by the Parish to reflect all structural changes, any obsolete structural ratings or any missing structural ratings.
- 3. Parish owned or maintained bridges which require load posting or closing are load posted or closed in accordance with the table in the DOTD Engineering Directives and Standards Manual Directive No. 1.1.1.8 All DOTD supplied load posting information concerning a bridge has been critically reviewed by the Parish Engineer prior to load posting.
- 4. Bridges owned or maintained by the Parish are shown on the attached list in the format specified by the DOTD. Corrections to data supplied to the Parish by the La. DOTD are noted. These stipulations are prerequisites to participation by the Parish in the Off-System Bridge Replacement Program.

#### **Purpose:**

To provide investment objectives that reflect the primary mandate to manage public funds prudently.

#### Scope:

All investments made on behalf of Lincoln Parish Police Jury.

#### **Policy:**

The Lincoln Parish Police Jury ("Police Jury") may invest any funds which are designated for investment and are above the immediate cash requirements of the Police Jury, from whatever source derived, in statutorily sanctioned investments. These investments are governed by State Law as described in La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §33:2955, as amended. Types of investments mentioned include, but are not limited to, Direct U.S. Treasury obligations, bonds, debentures, notes issued by or guaranteed by federal agencies; bonds, debentures, notes, or other evidence of indebtedness issued by the state of Louisiana or any other state of the United States, or any of the political subdivisions of any state, or by any domestic U.S. corporation, with limited exceptions noted in La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §33:2955; or certificates, or time certificates of deposit in any bank domiciled or having a branch office in Louisiana or any other federally insured investment as described in La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §33:2955 as amended.

The Police Jury shall authorize the Administrator or Treasurer to invest any surplus funds in whatever type deposit that shall offer the Police Jury the most favorable rates of interest.

In managing the investments of the Police Jury, the Administrator or Treasurer may seek the assistance of an outside agent (agency) to assist in the management and investment of surplus funds on behalf of the Police Jury. In seeking such assistance, the Administrator or Treasurer may formally solicit proposals for investment management services.

Investments of the Police Jury shall be guided by the following:

- 1. Cash management and investment activities shall be conducted in a manner consistent with prudent business practices applied by governmental entities and shall be in compliance with applicable statutes.
- 2. Funds, as determined by the Treasurer to be in excess of immediate cash requirement, shall be invested only in statutorily permitted obligations.
- 3. Appropriate emphasis in making any investment shall be in the following order:
  - A. To ensure safety of the principal amount.
  - B. To ensure liquidity of funds to meet all obligations of the School Board.
  - C. The yield of the investments.

In no event shall monies be considered available for investment unless and until such funds are determined by the Administrator or Treasurer, in the exercise of prudent judgment, to be in excess of the immediate cash requirements of the fund to which the monies are credited.
