ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 184-98-(4) OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN STATE OF LOUISIANA PROVIDING THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE PARISH OF LINCOLN, STATE OF LOUISIANA, BE AMENDED BY REVISING CHAPTER 6, MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, TO ADD A SECTION TO BE NUMBERED 6-4.13 AND TO DEFINE THE OFFENSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF LINCOLN PARISH, LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION CONVENED THIS 10th DAY OF JANUARY, 2023:

SECTION 1

That the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Lincoln, State of Louisiana, be amended by adding a section to be number 6-4.13 to read as follows:

Sec. 6-4.13 Speed Limits – Knowles Road

“No motor vehicle, as defined by Louisiana law, shall be operated at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on Knowles Road.”

SECTION 2

That the limit of speed referred to hereinabove shall be duly posted and displayed by means of appropriate highway speed limit signs.

SECTION 3

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4

That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its promulgation.

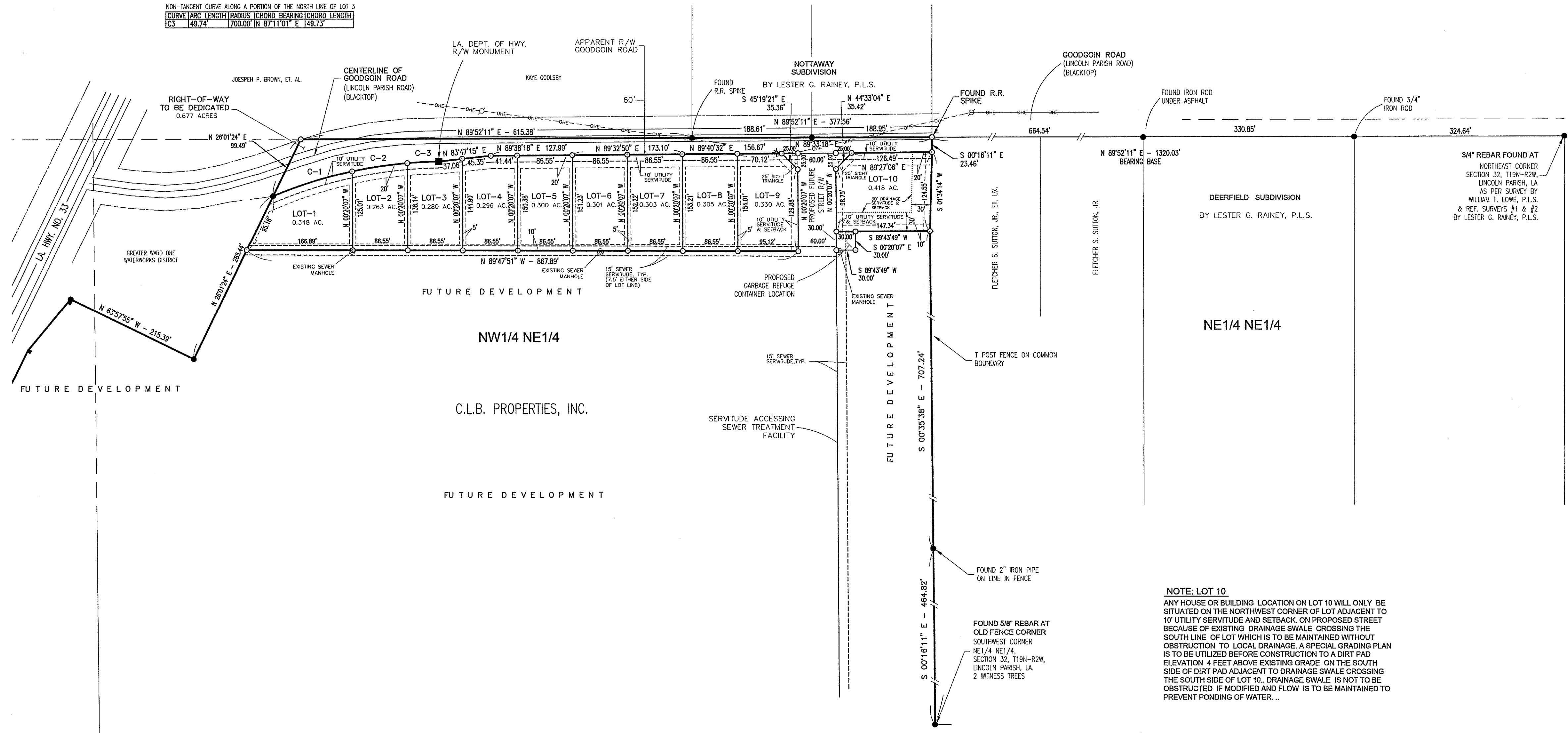
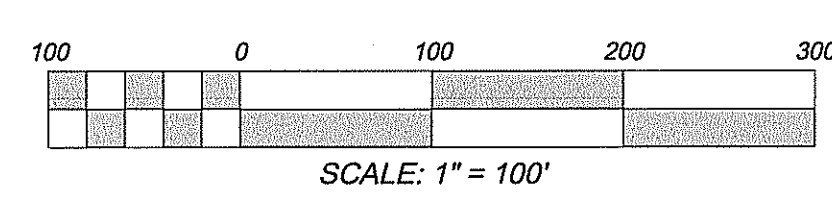

A RESOLUTION TO URGE AND REQUEST THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND DEVELOPMENT TO TAKE ACTION TO PROVIDE GREATER SAFETY AT THE WESTBOUND EXIT #86 at LA 33 OF INTERSTATE 20

WHEREAS, the westbound Exit #86 at LA 33 is a heavily traveled area, particularly during peak morning travel times and

WHEREAS, the traffic in this area becomes congested along the exit ramp and onto the shoulder of Interstate 20 and

WHEREAS, these conditions are dangerous for travel and

WHEREAS, action to provide greater safety to the motoring public in this area is needed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Lincoln Parish Police Jury does hereby request the Department of Transportation and Development to take action to provide greater safety to the motoring public and to minimize potential accidents at Exit #86 at LA 33 of Interstate 20, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development and the Lincoln Parish Legislative Delegation.

TEMPORARY ANIMAL SHELTERING AGREEMENT

This Agreement (the or this “Agreement”) is entered into by and between the **City of Ruston, Louisiana** (“City”), whose address is Post Office Box 2069, Ruston, Louisiana 71273, herein represented by Ronny Walker, Mayor, and the **Lincoln Parish Police Jury** (the “Police Jury”), whose address is Post Office Box 979, Ruston, Louisiana 71270, herein represented by Richard I. Durrett, President.

WHEREAS, the Police Jury has requested the City to assist in the temporary sheltering of dogs and cats captured or surrendered within Lincoln Parish outside the municipal limits of Ruston; and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to provide this temporary service for dogs and cats as described above which are delivered alive to the City Animal Control Facility by an authorized representative of the Police Jury (sometimes “Lincoln Parish Animals”); and

WHEREAS, with the permission of the City, the Police Jury has constructed temporary pads and kennels at the City Animal Control Facility at the cost of the Police Jury for use in the temporary sheltering of Lincoln Parish Animals.

NOW THEREFORE, the City and the Police Jury agree as follows:

1. Temporary Sheltering. The City agrees to allow and/or provide temporary sheltering of dogs and cats captured or surrendered within Lincoln Parish outside the municipal limits of Ruston which are delivered alive to the City Animal Control Facility by an authorized representative of the Police Jury.
2. Limitation of Services. The services provided by the City under this Agreement shall be limited to the parameters set forth in Sec. 1 and subject to space limitations at the City Animal Control Facility.

3. Fees. The fee for sheltering shall be \$100.00 per Lincoln Parish Animal received from the Police Jury and any cremation fees invoiced to the City for any Lincoln Parish Animals. The City will invoice the Police Jury monthly for Lincoln Parish Animals received for the prior month as well as any cremation fees for Lincoln Parish Animals after receipt of invoice by City for such fees.

4. Term and Termination. This Agreement shall be effective as of _____, 2022 and remain in force for one (1) year, ending _____, 2023 and may be extended by mutual agreement of the parties. The City may terminate this Agreement after providing sixty (60) days written notice to the Police Jury.

5. Indemnification. The Police Jury agrees to indemnify and hold the City harmless from any liability associated with sheltering of animals received under this Agreement.

6. Counterparts. This instrument may be executed in counterparts and individual signature pages may be attached to the same document which shall be considered as one instrument and all counterparts shall be considered as one instrument.
