ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Cmbr. Bodi moved to approve the agenda as presented. Cmbr. Riddle seconded.

<u>Cmbr. Furutani moved</u> to amend the agenda to add Resolution 1852 to the Ordinances and Resolutions for Discussion. <u>Cmbr. Kassover seconded. The motion to amend the agenda carried unanimously.</u>

Senior Project Manager Silvia presented the item and responded to Council questions.
