**Call to order:** Chair McCartney called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM

**Land Acknowledgement:** Chair Alvarez-McCartney read the land acknowledgement.

**Approval of Agenda:** Cmr. Finazzo made a motion to approve the agenda, Cmr. Kleweno seconded, and the motion to approve the agenda was carried unanimously.

**Approval of Minutes:** Cmr. Kaje made a motion to approve the April 4, 2024, minutes. Cmr. Finazzo seconded the motion.

Cmr. LaBonte suggested some minor edits.

All voted to approve the April 4, 2024, minutes as amended, and the motion was carried unanimously.

**2024 Comprehensive Plan Update**

***LFP Housing Element Goals & Policies Discussion***

Mr. David Fiske from LCG led the discussion on the housing element for the Comprehensive Plan Update. Mr. Fiske discussed some options for renter stability tools including working with the county housing authority, emergency housing, permanent supportive housing, and other policies.

Mr. Andrew Oliver discussed the findings of areas with dimensional feasibility for middle housing, which was then compared to walkability scores.

Cmr. Kaje brought up the discussion of smaller cottage like housing that is detached and traditional. Mr. Fiske mentioned that it is a novel approach that they can look into this policy approach.

1 Cmr. Alvarez-McCartney asked Mr. Fiske to elaborate on Policy H-1.10. Mr. Fiske noted that the  
2 state of Washington has highlighted areas that have racially discriminatory covenants, some of which  
3 were in the city of Lake Forest Park. Mr. Fiske mentioned that this policy could be combined into  
4 the housing element in the Comp Plan.

6 Regarding Goal H-2, Ms. Shuch mentioned that cities have taken different approaches to ensure  
7 that the patterns of segregation do not continue. Cmr. Finazzo mentioned the importance of  
8 ensuring that the language in the element be present to rule out any future implicit biases regarding  
9 race.

11 Cmr. Kaje mentioned how the Planning Commission Board did not wish to reduce environmental  
12 protections to the critical area zones in the city. Cmr. Cranmer mentioned that switching the land  
13 use between single family and duplex, even if it does not increase the footprint of the house, can  
14 potentially still affect the critical areas. Mr. Oliver mentioned that there are other alternatives the city  
15 can use, including RUEs.

16  
17 Cmr. Cranmer expressed concerns of increasing housing units due to limited infrastructure including  
18 environmental concerns and sewer issues.

20 **2024 Comprehensive Plan Update- Transportation Discussion**

21 Mr. Hofman discussed the status of the Transportation Element. Mr. Hofman mentioned that the  
22 transportation element is near being finished as edits have been made.

23  
24 **2024 Comprehensive Plan Update- Climate Discussion**

25 The Planning Commission tabled the Climate Element discussion for the next meeting. Mr. Hofman  
26 mentioned that the consultants are working on this item and are on track.


