This grant request is to support part-time internal city personal to complete this project. Drue Epping is an ISA-certified Master Arborist and ISA-Certified Municipal Specialist with a degree in Arboriculture from MATC. She has 8 years of experience in urban forestry operations and has been serving as a municipal urban forest planner for 3 years making her qualified to do the reporting.
