Park Board did an introduction round robin.

Amy also noted there are a substantial number of elderly residents, would love to think of something that could appeal to the senior citizens. Richie mentioned they could go to Senior Center for more information as she knows they have bingo socials and activities for our seniors. Richie also mentioned it would be great to get young kids events in our parks with possible ShoreLake arts involvement like music lessons in the parks.

Councilmember Bodi also stated this discussion will be something to think about for future programming at the Lakefront Park as the planning gets going.

D. Walking Route Project

Tyler put together some walking routes. The Board brainstormed some ideas on how the walk could go and other possible routes.

E. Other

Cory Gave update on Lakefront Property and Aquatics Study, process of obtaining consultants is on its way.
