
June 30, 2024 Budget Monitoring Dashboard






Non-Operating Departments




Budget Process

CITY OF LAKE FOREST PARK

Overview

- > A City budget provides an outline for future levels of service and legislative priorities
- Acts as a legal document that provides local government officials the authority to incur obligations and pay expenses
- Allocates resources among departments
- Controls how much each department may spend during the biennium

The Budget Process



The Budget Process - Spring

- Council Retreat
 - To identify future City priorities to align in the future budget
- Staff Budget Objectives Discussions
 - Leadership Team Meetings
- Update any necessary City plans and/or policies
- Official Call to Budget
- Budget estimates start being developed by Department Teams

The Budget Process - Summer

- Budget estimates developed and completed by Department Directors and Teams
- Finance Department compiles all estimates developed by departments
- Finance/Administration build the budget
 - revenue & expenditure estimates and requests
- Administration reviews and evaluates any proposed Program Enhancement & Change Forms
- Present year end revenue and expenditure projections for current 2023-2024 biennium
- Work towards the finalization of the Mayor's Preliminary City Budget: September 12, 2024


The Budget Process – Fall

- Mayor presents Preliminary Biennial Budget
- Detailed Department Presentations
- City Council Recommendation and Deliberations
- Prepare Proposed City Biennial Budget with agreed upon revisions
- Public Hearings: Property Tax, Utility Rate Increases, User Fee Schedule and Budget Related Items
- Adopt Property Tax Levies and file with King County Deadline November 30th
- Adopt Budget by Ordinance and any other Budget Related Ordinances & Resolutions
 - Goal November, Hard Deadline December 31st
