Castic called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM 16 17 Land Acknowledgement: Cmr. Larson read the land acknowledgement. 18 19 Approval of Agenda: Cmr. Larson made a motion to approve the agenda, Cmr. Lee seconded, and 20 the motion to approve the agenda was carried unanimously. 21 22 **Approval of Minutes:** Cmr Larson made a motion to approve the May 8th Special Meeting 23 Minutes, Cmr. Finazzo seconded and the motion to approve the minutes was carried unanimously. 24 25 Public Comment: No public comments. 26 27 **Next meeting:** The next meeting occurs on June 11, 2024. 28 29 City Council Liaison Report: A new traffic camera has been placed on 178th. the Council is also 30 looking into conducting studies at new possible locations including on Bothell way and 104th. The 31 Council member __ also gave an update on the new park and the work that has been done to push 32 for funding for the park. There has also been updates on Building Codes that are pro environmental. 33 The Council member also discussed that the process for the biannual budget has begun and is 34 projected to be finished by the end of November. 35 36 **Old Business:** 37 Economic Development goals and policies 38 A couple of the commissioners expressed some concerns that the goals of the plan mismatch the 39 City. While there is concern with jobs and revenue, the draft goals don't necessarily match the 40 current reality of the City. Cmr. Castic pointed out that the survey results were geared more towards 41 expanding small local businesses to keep the character of Lake Forest Park. The Commission agreed 42 to talk to the consultant to revise the language. 43 44 Cmr. LaBonte discussed omitting the language provided by King County aimed to provide equity 45 opportunities for people of color stating that she believes the language can be harmful rather than

helpful. It was noted to Cmr. LaBonte that the language is a requirement by King County to ensure

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equity.

1	Cmr. Lee pointed out that other areas should be targeted as well as the Town Center for economic
2	growth.
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4	Parks, Trails, and Open Space goals and policies
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6	The Planning Commission discussed the Parks, Trails, and Open Space element. The Board
7	discussed helping stakeholders, like the Stewardship Foundation, with events such as ivy removal
8	demonstrations. The Board also discussed the idea of purchasing parts of the Town Center to foster
9	more public opportunities.
