# Final 2024 Dog Park Observations and Recommendations

# **Project Objectives**

- Observe and record usage of Hillview and McKenzie fenced dog park installations; include usage outside fences
- Use intake forms to:
  - Quantitatively and qualitatively observe and rate dog and human behavior
  - > Record environmental and situational factors to assess their impact on utilization.
- Engage community members at parks to garner opinions, issues, and perspective.
- Observe other parks as possible
- ♣ Tabulate Data, Summarize Trends, Findings, and make Recommendations

# Parks Assessed

# McKenzie

- > Scope included observation at West and East sections of the park
- > Dog park is in West section along with courts and parking lot
- > 43 Observations made December 2022 through September 2023

# Hillview

- Scope included observation in dog park, soccer field, and adjacent sidewalks/paths
- > 40 Observations made January 2024 through December 2024

# Lincoln

- > Scope included North park span between 168 and 108 University Ave
- > 26 Observations made February 2024 through December 2024

# Heritage Oaks

- Scope included entire park
- > 11 Observations made March 2023 to July 2023

# McKenzie Findings

- McKenzie had a few hiccups as it got started
- Dog Park is indeed utilized
- Dog park did not alter behavior of off leash dog owners at East End
- Increased usage during adverse weather compared to Hillview
- Dog Noise is a non-issue at McKenzie
- Community

# Hillview Findings

- ◆ Dog Park unusable for much of the year --lost grass and much mud
- Hillview exhibited generally higher dog counts when aggregating all segments (lots of foot traffic with onleash dogs outside the park)
- A Minimal dog reactivity observed, despite many triggers outside the park; there were no sustained noise/fight incidents.
- Observed a large amount of dog waste not being picked up.
- Offleash activity on the soccer field was light, yet present.
- There was after-curfew use of the dog park at a substantial 10% rate. Reason given by visitors was consistent work hours conflict.
- There were some professional dog handlers that visited, but they stopped once the mud to grass ratio was about 25-30%. Interviews with dog owners was the felt a community benefit from handlers.

# Heritage Oaks and Lincoln North Findings

# Heritage Oaks

Behavior consistent with observations made during 2021-2022 Hillview Baseball Pilot program

# Lincoln North

- > Substantial On- and Off-Leash behavior; mostly solitary or paired humans, only 3 groups (2 training and 1 social) ever observed
- Never saw any parking issue; never saw an owner leave a poop behind
- Did not gather specific data for Lincoln South, but casual observation confirmed that area remains popular with on- and offleash walkers, more often sunny and turf less wet.

- McKenzie had substantially more dogs inside fence than onleash outside.
- Hillview had fewer dogs inside the fence and more dogs onleash outside.
- Interviews cited turf damage or mud as reasons at Hillview

- Utilization varied widely.
- No correlation between dog park usage and community events or court sports
- No correlation between dog park usage and court sport schedules
- If parking was not available, people walked in.
- Did not assess parking at Heritage Oaks

# **Overall Commentary**

- Natural turf cannot tolerate year around usage, even during fair weather usage. Grass lasted less than a quarter.
- Full parking lots do not deter use of dog parks. Mud does.
- After-hours use at Hv supports enabling evening usage there
- There was a community benefit observed at Hillview from the presence of knowledgeable dog handlers in the park.
- Interviews showed there is a subset of users that seek isolated, off-leash space for very specific reasons, including:
  - Dog reactive
  - Desire for isolated training
  - Owner's/handler's disability
- While the occurrence of noise and dog reactivity was low, there is opportunity to explore programming the dog parks to address offleash use.

SUBJECT: 2025 Public Art Budget

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Discuss the 2025/2026 budget needs for art projects and programs

### **BACKGROUND**

Each fiscal year the City creates a budget for all its operating and capital functions that covers July 1 – June 30. The Public Art Fund is included in that annual budget. Currently, the Public Art Fund exists to fund public art programs and acquisition on City property. At the start of fiscal year 2024/2025 the City had \$433,631 in the Public Art Fund and budgeted \$128,000. Expenditures to date for the current fiscal year are \$82,070. This was used for call for art services, sculpture purchase and sculpture cleaning.

Staff will provide a proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year and the commission will discuss and provide input.
