

Q1 What is the role of public art? Please select your top three choices.









Q3 What kinds of art experienced in public places do you enjoy the most? Please select your top three choices.




Q4 How important is a robust public art program/scene in your community?







Q5 Do you think Los Gatos is a town with a vibrant public arts scene?






Q7 Does the public art in Los Gatos reflect you as a community member?

Q8 Where do you want to see/experience public art in Los Gatos? Please select your top three choices.








