- Summer scheduled and season to start April 21st, but stating they cannot start by this date due to ice conditions
- Day by day runs / monitoring of conditions
- Looking at extending the winter schedule out of St. Ignace if conditions do not improve by April 21st with trips added as needed
 - o Hoping to get the West Shore (previously the Anna May) in the water and in service soon
- Attorney Evashevski noted that the franchise agreement does not have anything regarding requests to alter the beginning of the summer season
 - o Currently in litigation over this legal document that states each line shall run by April 21st
 - o If there will be a deviation from the agreement, it needs to be in writing with specific conditions

- Requesting vehicle permits through May 21st
- Planning Commission issued their zoning permit only authorizing the set before April 30th or after November 1st
- Property is located within vehicle zone 1, which has a May 1st cut off
- Frost law dependent at this time as well
 - o Building Inspector Dave Lipovsky commented that he does not see frost laws being lifted any time soon, and that there have not been any projections on when they may come off
- Park Manager Myron Johnson
 - o Permission was given by the State Park to stage the modular sections at the State Dock until May 1st, but this would need to be revisited if requested to store past that date
- Looking at a multiple day closure of M-185, which will disrupt multiple businesses in the area and those who use the shoreline as a route
- Zoning ordinance now does not allow for spring sets
- Stonebrook residents have voiced concern and do not want to see a set in during evening or early morning hours
- Mayor Doud commented that the State Park needs to determine permission for staging at the State Dock and the use / shut down of M-185
 - o Mr. Johnson noted that the Bonzheims would need to submit a request to the State Park for this

- o Would also like permission to bring the truck in to the Coal Dock if they are unable to get in to the State Dock

Council ok with this – Mission Point needs to keep in touch with the Street Administrator and Police Department.

- Motion made by Myers, seconded by White, to enter in to closed session at 2:30 pm to discuss ongoing litigation.

- Motion made by Chambers, seconded by Moskwa to leave closed session at 2:48 pm.

Voting Yea: Chambers, Corrigan, Moskwa, Myers, White
- Mayor Doud asked the boat lines to give an update on the beginning of their 2026 summer season:
 - o Shepler's
 - Still have some ice in the harbor
 - Hoping to have the Wyandot out for sea trial on Wednesday
 - Hoping to perform sea trial on the Cap Shepler Thursday, and targeting a Friday opening in both ports, running the summer schedule
 - All boats are dry docked in Mackinaw City - cannot move the Wyandot from launch until the ice is completely clear and cannot launch other boats until the Wyandot is launched
 - David Jurcak, Grand Hotel, voiced concern about Shepler's website publishing that "the 2026 season is delayed due to ice"
 - o This has caused calls from guests assuming that this message applies to the opening of the whole Island
 - o Arnold Transit
 - West Shore, Joliette, Marquette II, Ottawa in the water as of today
 - Still some clear ice and ice burgs out in the straits
 - Councilwoman Myers asked for a progress report on the Huron at the next meeting - this boat needs to be back in the fleet, especially for next winter season
 - Work on the Huron has been on hold so they could work on summer boats
 - Huron will be completed this summer
 - Councilwoman Myers inquired if there were any contingency plans for this weekend if Arnold and / or Shepler's cannot use fast boats or cannot run at all
 - Arnold noted that there is plenty of parking space in St. Ignace to handle the overflow if they have to continue running out of St. Ignace only
 - Drew May - will look at bringing extra shuttles in and open spaces in the LaSalle lot for now

- Attorney Evashevski:
 - o What will happen with Shepler passengers that cannot ride Shepler boats as of April 21st?
 - o The City has received a letter stating that, in order to accept cross ticketing at their boat lines, Hoffman would require the City to withdraw certain claims from current litigation regarding honoring cross ticketing.
 - The City is not willing to do this. The City must ensure that the public is taken care of, and that does not come with contingencies on litigation claims - City still stands in the position that, if not cross honored, then those individuals who have purchased tickets and passes for Shepler should at least be reimbursed
 - o At this time, the City Council is taking the word of both Hoffman Marine companies, stating that it is not safe to run at this time. Therefore, the City will not be taking any stance on this at this time.

VI. Miscellaneous / General Council Discussion / Additional Agenda Items

David Jurcak, Grand Hotel

- o Noted that there is currently a trash pickup issue on the island
 - There are no available 2-footer drays and not way to get dumpsters – the Grand hotel has multiple locations that need to get construction debris to the dump, but there is no way to get it there at this time
 - Veronica Dobrowolski noted that the Senator will be running tomorrow and is focusing on brining dumpsters across to help alleviate this issue
- o Mr. Jurcak inquired if the Council would allow the Grand to utilize their own truck and trailer to collect the debris, and then leave the trailer at the dump until it can be transferred into a dumpster
 - Mayor Doud noted that a meeting would be set up with the appropriate department heads to get the trash issue handled

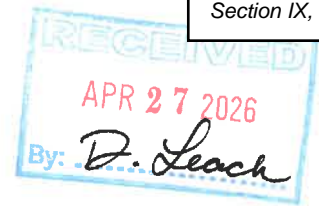

To: Mayor Doud and members of the Mackinac Island City Council:

I am a full-time resident of Mackinac Island and a licensed physician with over 30 years' experience in emergency medicine. I am writing to express several concerns I have with the amended Code of Ordinances 66-167 regarding e-bike licensing.

The amendment was adopted April 1, 2026 but the council meeting was April 2, 2026. This would appear to violate the Open Meetings Act. The amendment also states it goes into effect in 20 days, but also says effective date is April 29, 2026. I do not believe this allows an adequate public comment period and is internally inconsistent. Furthermore, the letter from Chief Miedzianowski is dated April 17, 2026.

As a medical professional, I have concerns with the definition of "qualified person with a mobility disability". The application of disability criteria for a motor vehicle parking permit is just that, for parking in accessible sites, not for operating the vehicle. To apply these criteria, which I would say precludes almost anyone from operating an e-bike without a throttle, is erroneous.

The requirement of medical certification and notarization means persons applying for an e-bike permit are incurring not insignificant costs, especially when more than one is needed. I would think certain people with the severe disabilities outlined in the amendment are on fixed incomes and would be financially strained in addition to the difficulties they may experience going from one place to another to do these tasks.

The requirement for medical certification and notarization will strain the resources needed to fulfill these steps and will undoubtedly strain the medical center staff and limited number of notaries on the island just as the busy summer season kicks off.

The Affidavit of Mobility Disability, paragraph 5 requires the applicant to vouch all information in the application is accurate and truthful. Exhibit A lists the same disability criteria outlined in the amendment, but also requires the applicant to describe their disability. This is also stated in the Mobility Disability Accommodation Application which requires "all fields completed". The Americans with Disabilities Act clearly states citizens are not obligated to describe, declare or define their disability to anyone, including law enforcement. Yet the Chief's letter also states the forms have to be filled out completely for review "by PD staff". Failure to disclose your disability will result in the application being denied. I am not aware of any member of the Mackinac Island Police Department being trained, educated or otherwise qualified to review protected personal medical information and determine the extent of disability. I don't imagine appealing a denial would ever result in a different outcome.

The lack of securing permission from the police department could result “impoundment” of the vehicle. Persons reliant on their e-bike are then left without any transportation at all. This is outrageous.

E-bikes have been permitted on the island for some years now and to essentially ban them with the stroke of a pen violates the 5th and 14th Amendments to the United States Constitution which prohibit the deprivation of property without due process and fair compensation. Is the City of Mackinac Island prepared to compensate every denied application for the loss of use of their bike?

These licensing requirements do not seem to be applied to major employers being issued permits for seasonal workers without regard to disability in violation of the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment.

I will not deny there are “bad apples” riding recklessly, speeding or using a class 3 e-bike with a throttle. However, the police department has the tools, if not the will, to enforce these regulations through speed limits and inspection. Trampling the rights of otherwise law-abiding citizens is not the solution you seek. I call on the Council to repeal and void this amendment.

Fifth Amendment

Fifth Amendment Explained

No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offence to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Fourteenth Amendment

Fourteenth Amendment Explained

Section 1

All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

Section 2

Representatives shall be apportioned among the several States according to their respective numbers, counting the whole number of persons in each State, excluding Indians not taxed. But when the right to vote at any election for the choice of electors for President and Vice-President of the United States, Representatives in Congress, the Executive and Judicial officers of a State, or the members of the Legislature thereof, is denied to any of the male inhabitants of such State, being twenty-one years of age, and citizens of the United States, or in any way abridged, except for participation in rebellion, or other crime, the basis of representation therein shall be reduced in the proportion which the number of such male citizens shall bear to the

whole number of male citizens twenty-one years of age in such State.

Section 3

No person shall be a Senator or Representative in Congress, or elector of President and Vice-President, or hold any office, civil or military, under the United States, or under any State, who, having previously taken an oath, as a member of Congress, or as an officer of the United States, or as a member of any State legislature, or as an executive or judicial officer of any State, to support the Constitution of the United States, shall have engaged in insurrection or rebellion against the same, or given aid or comfort to the enemies thereof. But Congress may by a vote of two-thirds of each House, remove such disability.

Section 4

The validity of the public debt of the United States, authorized by law, including debts incurred for payment of pensions and bounties for services in suppressing insurrection or rebellion, shall not be questioned. But neither the United States nor any State shall assume or pay any debt or obligation incurred in aid of insurrection or rebellion against the United States, or any claim for the loss or emancipation of any slave; but all such debts, obligations and claims shall be held illegal and void.

Section 5

The Congress shall have power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article.

Dear Mayor and Members of the Mackinac Island City Council,

I am writing on behalf of Dickinson Homes and our clients, Scott and Kim Bonzheim, regarding the Bonzheim home project and our request for a vehicle permit extension through Thursday, May 21, 2026, to allow delivery and setting of the home during the same general timeframe that other areas of the Island are permitted vehicle access through the Thursday before Memorial Day.

This request is being made because the project is now facing a very narrow and difficult spring delivery window due to severe late-winter weather, deep frost conditions, and ongoing road restrictions across the Upper Peninsula. Based on the conditions we have been working through, our best estimate is that the first realistic opportunity to move the Bonzheim modules may not occur until the week of Monday, May 11, 2026, assuming restrictions are lifted in time. Without some flexibility from the City, a home that is otherwise ready to move forward may be forced into a delay of several additional months.

We respectfully ask the Council to consider what that delay would actually mean in practical terms. This is not a request based on convenience. It is a request to avoid a substantial and unnecessary setback caused by weather conditions outside anyone's control. The Bonzheim home is already far enough along that missing this spring window would likely push the set to October 2026. That would create significant additional cost, disrupt specialized trucking and crane scheduling, delay our factory follow-up crews, and leave the foundation and site unfinished for much of the season.

It would also disrupt the schedules of skilled workers from Mackinac Island and the Upper Peninsula who are already planning around this project. Excavation, plumbing, electrical, tile, carpentry, and related follow-up work all depend on the home being delivered and set within a workable spring window. Delaying the project until fall could create missed opportunities for those trades to secure and complete work that is already anticipated as part of this schedule.

From a practical and visual standpoint, allowing the home to be delivered and set this spring is the better outcome for everyone involved. It is better for the property owners, better for the neighborhood, and better for the City than allowing an open foundation and incomplete site to remain in place through the heart of the season. Our goal is to move the project forward efficiently, secure the structure as quickly as possible, and minimize the overall duration of disruption rather than extend it.

Dickinson Homes is prepared to work within whatever reasonable conditions the Council believes are appropriate. We are willing to work around approved hours, approved days, escort requirements, traffic controls, and any other operating limitations the City believes are necessary. We understand that Mackinac Island requires a different level of coordination and care than a typical delivery site, and we fully respect that. Our team is prepared to work closely with the City, Police Department, Fire Department, and any other relevant officials to ensure the delivery is handled safely, professionally, and with as little disruption as possible.

This delivery has been planned carefully. The Bonzheim project consists of nine modular sections. Our preferred approach is to bring the crane over on a Monday and complete the home set over two consecutive days, ideally Tuesday and Wednesday. If the City prefers more limited working windows, we can adapt and spread the operation across additional days. We will coordinate escorts, radios, route timing, and all required safety measures. In addition, Dickinson Homes has committed its own factory crew to remain on site for three weeks immediately following the set so that the roof can be completed and the structure can be enclosed as quickly as possible. We are not asking for flexibility without a plan; we are asking for flexibility with a clear, organized, and responsible execution plan already in place.

Dickinson Homes has also successfully helped bring multiple projects to fruition on Mackinac Island, and we understand the level of planning, coordination, and respect required to complete work in this environment. We are prepared to approach the Bonzheim project with that same level of care and professionalism.

This is an important project for our clients and for our company. It is also a project we are prepared to complete in a way that reflects well on everyone involved. We are asking the Council to allow a reasonable extension so that extraordinary weather-related delays do not force an otherwise avoidable postponement into the fall. Granting this request would help bring the project to a safe and orderly stage sooner, reduce long-term disruption at the site, support the scheduling of skilled local and regional trades, and allow the work to proceed in the most efficient and responsible manner possible.

We appreciate the Council's time, consideration, and service to the community. Thank you for reviewing this request and for giving thoughtful consideration to a practical solution that would benefit the property owners, the neighborhood, the skilled workers involved, and the City as a whole.

Kim and Scott Bonzheim addressed the Commission. Lipovsky stated he would like an architectural review. Myers stated also our Ordinance requires a review over 3500 square feet. Dombroski clarified that footage includes the entire home, not just habitable space. Murray went through the list the Planning Commission asked for in June; accessory building height, scenic easement letter, state park approval of scenic easement, one module is too large and requires City Council approval, and MDOT approval. Myers stated the Commission wanted to understand the process from MDOT for the roads. State park approval for the route needs to be granted. Staging on the state park dock needs approval as well. Straus requested an updated timeline since the foundation will not be done in summer of 2025. Ryan Spencer stated he talked to Cory Gardner and his quote was "don't worry Ryan, when the time comes we will work with you, but it has to be at the time of the permit, not ahead of time". Myers stated that helps us understand the process with MDOT. Spencer stated that when setting the modules, traffic would probably be stopped at Stonecliffe Gate North. This will be a 2- or 3-day set. Dufina asked if Dickinson Homes will be providing the personnel to direct traffic. Spencer stated the timeline is the foundation this fall and deliver the mods in spring. They will then be finishing in the summer and fall and complete by fall of 2026. They intend to go to council to ask for zone 2 set timeframe. Murray stated he believes they have submitted everything and that Planning Commission may be going beyond what zoning requires. Straus stated everything the Planning Commission is asking for is within the Planning Commission purview. Myers stated we need to have a favorable architectural review, a state park letter regarding transit of mods, location of building material storage and staging, state approval for use of M-185, an updated timeline, a variance for the module size, and a statement from Planning Commission highlighting the section of being in zone 1 and that frost laws are concern. Straus stated the discussion regarding the frost law concern and not being able to work in the spring, is in the minutes. Evashevski stated in our ordinance it states start date and timing "will be least invasive to summer season". Evashevski stated we know a variance is needed, and the concern with it being set so close to the season, and zone 1 timeframes description is very clear. We must not lead applicant to believe this will all be allowed. The Planning Commission is just the first step. Spencer stated they will not be making the mods until approved by City Council. Spencer stated we know the frost laws probably won't work with them for a spring start and approval by City Council for mod length is not certain. Evashevski stated our approval triggers the production of the mods. So Evashevski wants to make sure we are letting the applicant know Planning Commission approval does not guarantee they can proceed with mod size and in their timeline. Straus stated we need to approve with contingencies or deny. Straus stated Planning Commission could also send a letter to City Council. Myers finds it troubling that we have talked to the developer and Dickinson continually about our

spring set concerns. The applicant is still sticking to that timeline and that is problematic. Dufina asked about the building department having signed and sealed drawings before the building permit is issued. Lipovsky wondered if they could set before the frost laws are on. Possibly schedule for a January set. Spencer stated he doesn't know but that is a possibility. Straus asked what timeline is submitted for review today? Do we want to review based on what is in the packet. Motion to approve with a set by April 30 or after November 1, pending frost laws not in affect, with contingencies of a favorable architectural review as required by zoning ordinance, a letter from the state regarding transit of mods on M-185 and approval of staging as depicted in the application, timeline submitted reviewed and resubmitted if not correct, a variance for length of one mod granted by City Council, and as per our Ordinance and concern of frost laws it be set by April 30 or after November 1st, as it lies in zone 1. Dufina confirmed that mods aren't made yet.

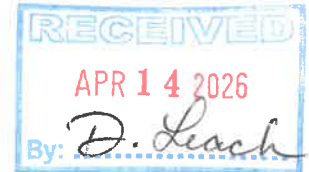

Hi Danielle,

This correspondence is coming directly from our Island Dock Lead, Ian – who the past couple years has been the one to hang the banner per my instructions. He sent me the picture of what he did last year (also drew up what he envisions for this year, both pictured below) and mentioned he likes the benefit these extra grommet anchors will give. Reflecting on last, there was very little give from the line on the left, even after multiple windy days and no grommets along the bottom. He mentioned the banners also have cut outs within them to allow air flow cutting down on wind resistance.

“We use twine, wrapped around the two points multiple times to prevent slack and give on our anchor points. On the top edge we have metal hooks that can be moved to accommodate any grommets. On the bottom corners we have tied down straight across to prevent any slack of movement. If the bottom edge has multiple grommets we can weave a line along the bottom edge and then anchor straight across to minimize even more movement. It would be as if the banner was anchored from all edges, while allowing guests to walk underneath. I (Ian) have consulted my certified mechanical engineer Uncle on the project should this plan not meet the city standards for a better solution.”

I hope you can see our transparency in this commucation to ensure we aren't doing anything intentionally to be in violation. I know Dennis mentioned it is not on him/you to tell us exactly how to achieve the banner tie down requirement of being tied/fastened around the perimeter at a 2 foot max spacing as it's been a requirement on Mackinac Island for many years now. With that statement, I have been reviewing the sign and display ordiance on cityofmi.org and I cannot locate further direction on what has been preapproved for the tie down material – understanding these special events are on a case by case basis. So I will ask if twine can continue to be acceptable?

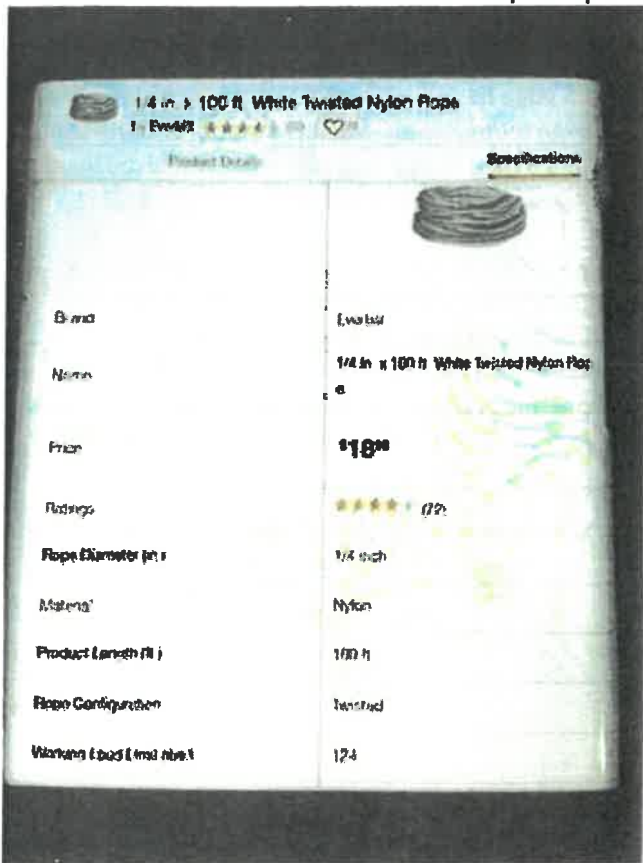

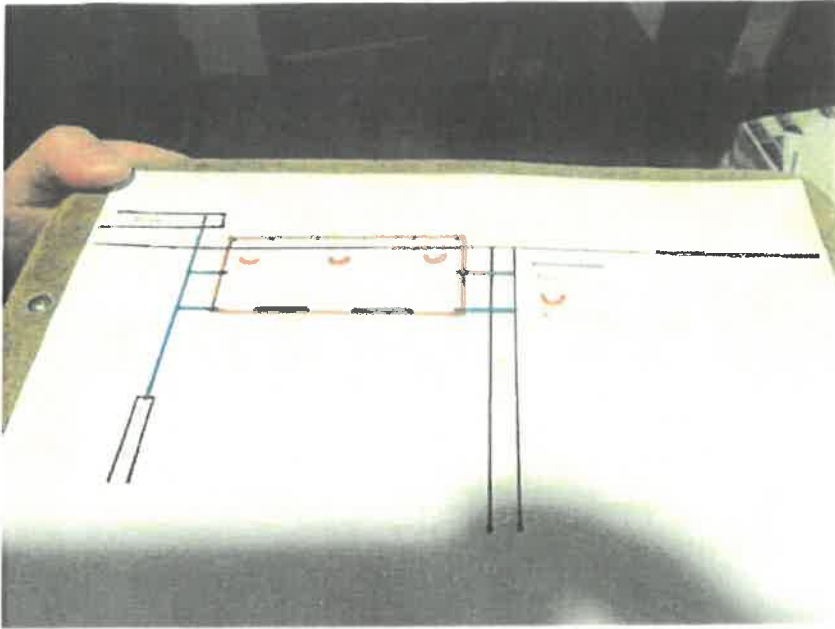

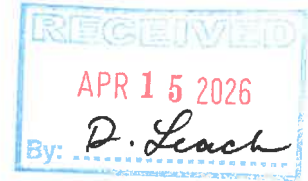

**AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE,
BEING ORDINANCE NO. _____, AS AMENDED
CITY OF MACKINAC ISLAND**

Ord. No. _____, Eff. _____

An ordinance to amend Article 22 of Ordinance No. _____, as amended, to clarify the makeup of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

THE CITY OF MACKINAC ISLAND ORDAINS:

Section 1. Article 22, Section 22.01 of said Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance No. _____, as amended) is repealed and replaced with the following:

Section 22.01 – Creation and membership.

A board of zoning appeals is hereby established having the powers authorized in Public Act No. 110 of 2006, as amended. The board of zoning appeals shall consist of the city council.

The city council may appoint to the zoning board of appeals not more than two alternate members for the same term as regular members, being the elected city supervisor and the elected city assessor. An alternate member may be called to serve as a member of the zoning board of appeals in the absence of a regular member, if the regular member will be unable to attend one or more meetings. An alternate member may also be called to serve as a member for the purpose of reaching a decision on a case in which the member has abstained for reasons of conflict of interest. The alternate member appointed shall serve in the case until a final decision is made. An alternate member serving on the zoning board of appeals has the same voting rights as a regular member.

Section 2. Effective Date. **This ordinance shall become effective _____.**

Katie –

I have several questions regarding the proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance addressing the makeup of the Board of Zoning Appeals (commonly referred to as the Zoning Board of Appeals). I am submitting these in advance of the April 14, 2026, Planning Commission public hearing so that they can be addressed at that time.

1. The original draft of the amendment specifically stated that the alternates would be the elected city supervisor and the elected city assessor. Based on Ordinance Committee input, this requirement has been removed. Is it still the unstated intent that the alternates would be elected officials?
2. The amendment states that the two alternate members will serve, “. . . for the same term as regular members.” However, the regular members are the members of City Council, who serve for rotating three-year terms, with two members being up for election (or reelection) each year. As such, there are three separate terms that apply to the City Council at any given time. Which of those terms would apply to the alternate members?
3. Who will determine that an alternate member is needed at any particular meeting?
 - a. The Planning Commission chair?
 - b. The city attorney?
 - c. The mayor?
 - d. A vote of the Planning Commission as a whole?
4. When will the determination that an alternate is needed be made?
5. When it is determined that an alternate is needed, which alternate will be appointed? Who will make this decision? (Will they be designated as Alternate No. 1 and Alternate No. 2?)

Please transmit these questions to the members of the Planning Commission as well as to Erin Evashevski for their consideration.

My hope is that by addressing these details at this time, future uncertainty will be avoided.
