The Commission of the City of Mangum will meet in special session on August 26, 2026, at 4:30 PM, in the City Administration Building at 130 N. Oklahoma Ave, Mangum, OK for such business as shall come before said Commission.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Scott called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

1. Discussion and possible action on the creation of a proposal to entice a business to create a Nuclear Lifestyle Innovation Campus in the Mangum area where public disclosure of the matter discussed would interfere with development of products or services with possible executive session in accordance with 25 O.S. 307(B)(7) and (C)(11).

Information from the NLIC has been made public. Meeting can be held outside of executive session.

OPEN SESSION

2. Discussion and possible action in regard to executive session.

Attorney Kendall stated that he attended the NLIC (Nuclear Lifestyle Innovation Campus) conference. It consisted of interested community leaders where they got the idea of what the State of Oklahoma is looking for as far as nuclear energy development. Attorney Kendall went over multiple power points from <https://ee.ok.gov/nlic/record/> during this meeting. The three nodes of Oklahoma's NLIC were defined as fuel manufacturing, power generation, and storage. It was stated by August 28th the preliminary interest has to be sent in with what assets and infrastructure that we have. The benefits would be up to 2,200 jobs from start to finish. Not all the jobs would be permanent because some of the jobs will be during building. Other benefits would be infrastructure improvements, and a wide variety of jobs with \$100,000 median salaries. The discussion is if this is something Mangum would want to pursue then we would need to choose what areas we would like. Then we would need to come together and figure out what resources we have as a community.

Commissioner Hamon stated that his concern is that this has grown so big that it isn't just a Mangum decision anymore we would need to include the county now. Commissioner Clark stated if we submit a proposal, it doesn't mean we are locked in anything. The concerns with the disposal area of it were discussed. It was stated that the project would be federally and state backed so there would be a lot of resources. It was stated that Oklahoma hasn't been chosen yet there are a couple other states that have slight advantages. Discussion on what nodes the City of Mangum should accept was discussed. There was discussion on some of the items that are in the required questionnaire.

Motion to move forward with proposal of all three nodes.

Motion made by Commissioner Hamon, Seconded by Commissioner Huckabay.

There was more discussion on how to get this information out to the community. It was requested for each Commissioner and the Mayor to fill out the questionnaire and get it back to the City Clerk by tomorrow August 27th. Then City Attorney Kendall and City Clerk McClintock will compile them all into one and submit with a written proposal.

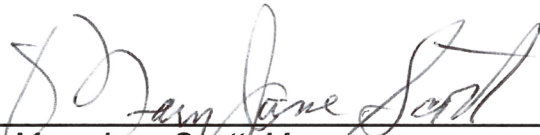

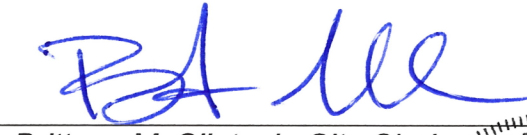
