BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARIETTA, STATE OF OKLAHOMA, THAT:

WHEREAS, The City Council of Marietta, Oklahoma held a public hearing on this matter on this date and there were no objections to Bancfirst's request. Notice of the public hearing was published in the Marietta Monitor on September 22, 2022.

WHEREAS, The City Council of Marietta, Oklahoma, hereby agrees that it is in the best interest of the City of Marietta, Oklahoma County to adopt this Ordinance approving the permanent vacating and closing of the public way, alleyway and easements and foreclosing the right to reopen the public way, alleyway and easements regarding the specific property, to wit:
