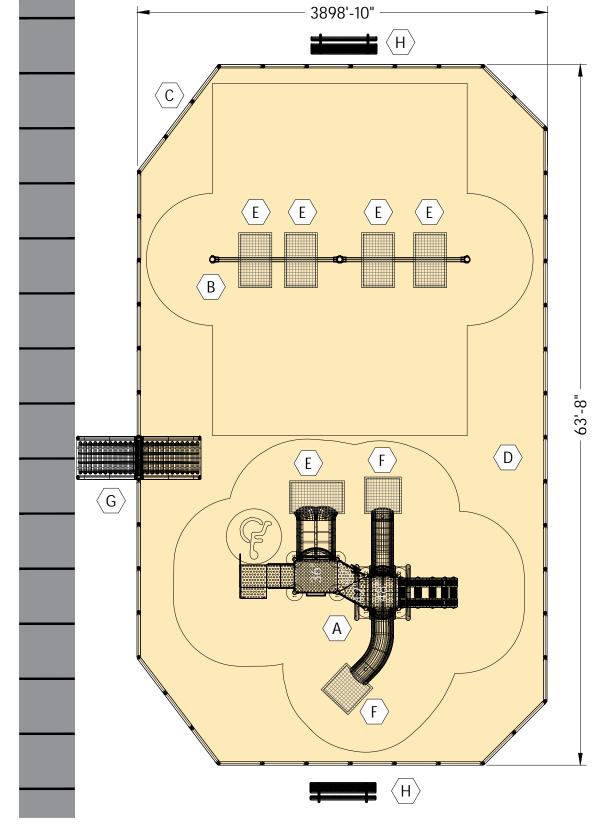

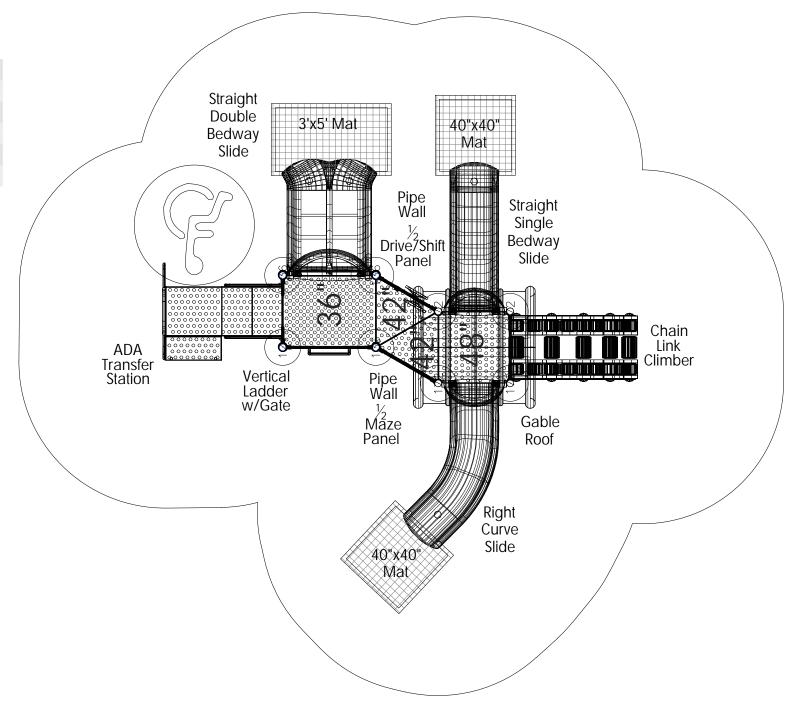

A RESOLUTION ADJUSTING FEES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF RUBBLE AND REFUSE AT THE TRASH TRANSFER STATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 78 of the Marietta Code of Ordinances, the City of Marietta operates a Trash Transfer Station for the deposit of rubble, or any other refuse which exceeds the size or capacity of the City-provided sanitation container; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to impose fees in an amount sufficient to cover the costs of the City's maintenance of the facility and final disposal of rubble and refuse received at the facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARIETTA the fees for the acceptance of rubble and refuse at the Trash Transfer Station are established as follows:

1.	Brush	and	Tree	Limb

a. Residential Customers: \$10 flat fee upon presentation of current local utility

bill and government-issued photo identification

b. Commercial Customers: \$80 per ton (\$10 minimum fee)

2. Refuse (Household Trash) \$80 per ton (\$5 minimum fee)

3. Refrigerators \$15 each

4. Tires

a. Less than 20-inch diameter \$5 each

b. 20-inch or larger diameter \$10 each
