ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH TO THE EXTENT OF SUCH CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Rostek opened to public comment. There were no public comments.

City Clerk VanBlargan said David Tagliarini and Ray Kerr were the only two candidates who applied and qualified for the March 19, 2024 election ballot. She congratulated them. The only thing on the ballot would be the Charter Amendment to change the two week qualifying period to one week. It would take effect in December 2024 for the 2025 Municipal Election if it passes.

Vice Mayor Kerr proposed they push the Charter Amendment to the following election. He thought the turnout would be low. The City Clerk said the Presidential candidates for the primary would be on the ballot and she expects a good turnout.

A. FY24 Capital Garbage Truck Lease Approval

Public Works Director Megan Wepfer said the lease for the truck is \$8,500 a month for a thirteen month period from RDK Trucks. She responded to questions and comments from the Board.

Mayor Rostek asked for an update on contracting the garbage pick-up. The City Manager said they would need to issue an RFP which would take a few months.

Vice Mayor Kerr said he cannot vote for a side loader whether it is a rental or a purchase. Director Wepfer said the reason they are considering a side loader is because she cannot get a full staff in sanitation.

Vice Mayor Kerr asked what the penalty would be to get out of the lease early. Director Wepfer said she thought there was a 30-day clause. Vice Mayor Kerr said the level of service has decreased

with the side loader. Director Wepfer said the rear-load truck will pick up the bulk and brush items on Wednesdays. The City Manager said they would look into every option available.

Mayor Rostek asked what would happen to the truck that is being replaced. Director Wepfer said it would be sold. It could take money off the lease.

Commissioner Tagliarini said they need to move forward based on Staff's recommendation. Commissioners Brooks and McGeehen agreed.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Rostek called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

City Clerk Clara VanBlargan called the roll. All were present.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

4. PRESENTATIONS

A. Fire Crew of the Year

Fire Chief Clint Belk recognized Madeira Beach Fire Department A shift as the first Fire Crew of the Year for 2023.

B. Reclassification of Fire Inspector Perez to Fire Marshall

Chief Belk recognized the promotion of Fire Inspector Raul Perez to Fire Marshall. He would be the first ever in Madeira Beach history.

C. Promotion -Lt. Sleppy

Chief Belk recognized the promotion of Firefighter John Sleppy to Lieutenant. He has taken over the role of Training Officer and has been with the Fire Department for ten years.

E. Brian Lowack, President/CEO, Visit St. Pete/Clearwater

Mr. Lowack explained the purpose of Visit St. Pete/Clearwater and the activities and events they do for the community.

The City Manager said the presentation will be made part of the Minutes and on the website.

5. BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

A. Discuss/Review Boats – Live-aboards and Anchoring

Mayor Rostek opened to public comment.

John Garcia, 15334 Harbor Drive, stressed his concern for the safety and environmental impact on the area.

Brian Gonser, Seminole resident and owner of a Madeira Beach short-term rental, stressed environmental and safety concerns.

Belinda Gonser, Seminole resident, stressed concern about issues she encountered with the live-aboards.

Phil Secord, a Palmetto resident, said he was the regional Southwest Florida Marine Industries Association Manager. Some environmentalists are very concerned about derelict boats. His job is

to promote good, clean, and safe boating and anchoring in the counties he is involved in. Their position is to improve the boating industry and help it prosper.

Mayor Rostek reported on his research and gave a PowerPoint presentation. He focused on the improper use of Marine Sanitation Devices (MSDs).

The City Manager said Florida Statute 327.60 defines a live-aboard. Anchored or moored boats are not considered live-aboards. The people who live on them must adhere to the laws and regulations.

Mayor Rostek said there are 1.5 million vessels with MSDs boating in U.S. waters, generating 3.5 billion gallons of sewage, and there is no way of knowing how much is illegally discharged. They need to start protecting the waterways within the City limits. There are three "No Discharge Zones (NDZ)" in Florida where boaters cannot even discharge treated sewage. The Madeira Beach Marina offers boaters a free pumpout service, and he would like anchored or moored boaters to pump out every ten days. He wants boaters to show proof of an MSD pumpout with a date and time-stamped receipt. He is hoping for possible future municipal regulations and enforcement.

John Connolly, resident, did not think the pumpout should be limited to the boats within Madeira Beach.

Mayor Rostek said they could only regulate within the Madeira Beach boundary map. He would take it to the Big C.

John Garcia, 15334 Harbor Drive, said he was concerned about the illegal docking. It is a fairness issue. Residents pay property taxes to dock their boats, and the moored boats get to do it for free.

Mayor Rostek said they do not have enough acreage on the water to provide a mooring field. The City Manager said the Florida Statutes do not allow them to do it.

The City Manager said he would meet with Sergeant Blair from the Marine Unit and Captain Leiner, who oversees the City's agreement with the Sheriff's Office, and provide the information to the anchored boats in Madeira Beach.

Commissioner Brooks said a solution to save the waterways would be to get a pumpout boat and go to the anchored boats every eight or ten days and offer to pump them out.

The City Attorney said Florida Statute 327.60 is very specific as to the vessels the City can regulate. Section 4. A. states a vessel over 26 feet with an enclosed cabin with berthing facilities and houseboats can be required to show proof of sewage disposal within one of three no-discharge zones. Mayor Rostek said the three no-discharge zones are not located near this area. The City Attorney said Section 4. A. would not apply.

The City Attorney said Section 4.D. of the Statute states live-aboards, floating structures, and commercial vessels can only be regulated. He could prepare a code provision, but it would need

to be approved by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission before the Board could adopt it. The boats anchored in Madeira Beach waters do not meet any criteria.

Vice Mayor Kerr said their best alternative is to work with the Southwest Florida Marine Industries Association. It is a State issue, and the City needs to be given control. The City Attorney said the City of Clearwater is pursuing anchoring limitation areas where boundaries are set within City limits, and anchored boats must move every 45 days. It does not specify where or how far they need to move. It would not be a good option for the City.

Mayor Rostek asked if there was any way they could force the MSD pumpouts. The City Attorney said no. The Mayor asked if they could enforce the Clean Water Act, which requires boats to pump out three miles off-shore. The City Attorney it would need to be enforced federally since it is a federal law.

Commissioner Brooks said the pumpout boat is a wonderful option. At one time, there was a grant to assist in purchasing one. Marina Manager Brian Crabtree said a grant was obtained, but the Board of Commissioners at the time rejected it because they thought it would be too expensive to operate and maintain. The pumpout boat was kept at the Lighthouse Point Marina and is not in operation. He called to see what happened to it and has not received a response. The grants are selected for a body of water, and the boat must cover a certain amount of square footage. It would be a possibility to purchase the boat.

Vice Mayor Kerr asked if a pumpout boat would attract more boaters to anchor in their waters. He suggested taking it to the Big C and moving forward as a collective body.

Commissioner McGeehen said he would like to have more testing of the waters so they have more ammunition to take to the State.

Commissioner McGeehen said Florida Statute 327.44 states anchoring or mooring under bridges or adjacent to heavily traveled channels constitutes interference if unreasonable under the circumstances. He thought they should enforce the vessels obstructing the waterways more.

B. FEMA/City Participation in Mitigation Restoration/Flooding Prevention Program

The City Manager gave a brief background on the item. He asked for direction from the Board on whether or not to proceed with the Grant programs that allow property owners to participate in the housing grant programs that FEMA provides. If they proceed, they would need a dedicated consultant to manage it because of unresolved issues in the past.

Marci Forbes, Community Development Engineer, reported the grants have to be sponsored by the City of Madeira Beach. There would be nothing the county could do.

Commissioner Tagliarini asked if the person monitoring it would be an existing employee or if it would be a new position. The City Manager said it would be a new position. Commissioner Tagliarini asked if the grant would cover it. The City Manager said he thought it would cover the

majority of it. Ms. Forbes said the grant gets spread out over various components, not just the construction of a property.

Vice Mayor Kerr said he had multiple conversations with residents who went through the process, and it is very restrictive. Most said they wished they would not have done it. He thought if they implemented it again, they would need to find a way to have the funds directly issued to the applicant. Ms. Forbes said they are managed as a pass-through system, which is mandated. She has not heard of any program that deviates from the pass-through process. Vice Mayor Kerr said FEMA was not a good steward. Once everything was approved, they should not have come back and said it was not approved.

Commissioner Brooks asked if they could not collect it from the property owner if they could not comply with FEMA's request for \$92,000.00. The City Attorney said they have an agreement with the property owner in addition to the grant agreement, and they are legally obligated to comply. But, if the statute of limitations has run out, the property owner may owe the money, but they have no legal obligation to pay.

Vice Mayor Kerr asked if a lien provision could be written in the contract. The City Attorney said only if FEMA and the Federal Division of Emergency Management allow it. Vice Mayor Kerr said they would need to have security on the money.

6. CITY CLERK

A. Board of Commissioners to schedule a Special Meeting in March following the March 19, 2024, Municipal Election and Certification of Election Results: Reporting the Election Results of the Charter Amendment and Induction into Office – Ray Kerr and David Tagliarini to serve a new two-year term as District Commissioner.

City Clerk Clara VanBlargan said the Municipal Election is on March 19, 2024. The incumbents, David Tagliarini and Ray Kerr, who qualified during the qualifying period, their names would not be on the ballot. They had no opposition. Only the charter amendment would be on the ballot. She will report the certified final election results at the meeting when Commissioner Tagliarini and Commissioner Kerr are sworn into office.

The Board scheduled a special meeting at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 27, 2024, to read the final election results and to swear David Tagliarini and Ray Kerr into office to serve a new two-year term as District Commissioner.

7. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A. John's Pass Village Activity Center Zoning

Mayor Rostek opened to public comment. There were no public comments.

Community Development Director Jenny Rowan said two public workshops were held, and a third one will be held on Saturday, January 27. She reviewed what was discussed at the meetings. Staff

would meet after the next public workshop to review the input and present it to the Board and the Planning Commission.

Director Rowan said the six character districts would be turned into six separate new zoning districts. The Special Area Plan is tied to the Comprehensive Plan, which guides the entire process. The Comprehensive Plan supports the unique character of John's Pass Village. When they start thinking about zoning, certain standards in the Countywide Strategies Plan need to be addressed.

Director Rowan said the county will meet on February 20 to establish the Activity Center on the Countywide Plan Map and the Land Use Strategy Map. It will come back to the Board of Commissioners at the March 13th regular meeting.

Commissioner Tagliarini asked for the response to the first two public workshop meetings. Director Rowan said there were more questions at the second meeting. Andrew Morris, Long Range Planner, said most of the discussion was about whether planned development rezoning should be allowed there and ensuring the Land Development Regulations keep the character.

Commissioner Tagliarini asked if the county requires them to offer a bonus option in a development agreement. Director Rowan said no. Commissioner Tagliarini asked how the City would benefit from offering the option. Mr. Morris said it allows for mitigating the impact of new development on the community. The City Manager said it allowed for negotiating.

After a brief discussion about density lodging with a development agreement, the Board asked the presenters to identify and include the structures with high densities in John's Pass Village in their next presentation.

8. MARINA DEPARTMENT

A. RFP 2023-11 Digital Information Sign

Marina Manager Brian Crabtree explained that RFP 2023-11 was for a digital sign at the Marina entrance on the south side of 150th at Tom Stewart Causeway. The purpose would be to get information out to visitors and residents. Two bids were received, and the low bid from I2 Visual, based in Fort Myers, was for \$45,313.

Vice Mayor Kerr asked if it was a two-sided sign. Manager Crabtree said yes. Vice Mayor Kerr asked if they could put marketing information on it. Manager Crabtree said as long as it was general information. Vice Mayor Kerr asked if he reached out to Brian Lowack with Visit St. Pete/Clearwater to see if they would contribute to it. Manager Crabtree said no, but he will. It was budgeted in the Marina Fund.

Mayor Rostek asked if electricity was there. Manager Crabtree said yes, and the cost to trench for electric was removed from the quote.

The Consensus of the Board was to move forward with it.

9. PARKING DIVISION

A. Kitty Stuart Park Parking Lot Overview: Financial Status, Increased Utilization, and User Engagement

Parking Enforcement Supervisor Jamal Yahia gave an overview of what they observed during the three-month trial period of three resident spaces and an additional handicapped space in Tom and Kitty Stuart Park. There was a decrease in sales for October, November, and December. He asked for direction from the Board if they would like to keep the spaces. He responded to questions and comments from the Board.

Vice Mayor Kerr said he is for the handicapped parking, but the three added residential spaces would cost the City \$25,000 in potential revenue. The City Manager said it was a slower time of year, and the lots would fill up for longer periods of the day in January, February, and March.

Commissioner Brooks agreed with Vice Mayor Kerr. She was concerned about the long-term effects. Looking at how much money they were down in the off-season, what would the amount of revenue lost be during the in-season?

Commissioner Tagliarini said he would like to continue the trial. It is not always about revenues; sometimes, the returns are in the residents' quality of life.

The Consensus of the Board was to continue with the trial.

10. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

A. Refuse Collection Contracted Service Analysis

Finance Director Andrew Laflin reviewed his cost analysis for insourcing versus outsourcing the garbage collection. Outsourcing costs were hypothetical based on the recent bid results from the City of Belleair Beach. It would yield a fiscal savings of about \$150,000 annually.

Commissioner Brooks asked if the Belleair Beach bid included two weekly trash pick-ups and one-yard waste pick-up. Director Wepfer said she would have to read the bid, but if they would contract out, it would include all of it. The Belleair Beach bid would not have included any of the parks, the village, the beach, or any location with public cans.

Commissioner Brooks said she does not support outsourcing based on the feedback from the residents. It would be costly and time-consuming, and the residents would not want it.

Commissioner McGeehen agreed with Commissioner Brooks. He would hate to see the level of service drop for the amount of money they are looking at.

Mayor Rostek asked about the number of employees sanitation is down. Director Wepfer said one, but she had five interviews this week. The Mayor asked how much turnover there was in the last two years. Director Wepfer could not give an exact number.

Vice Mayor Kerr said he did not want to outsource but did not want the sidearm loader on the trucks. The sidearm beats up the totes and would be an added expense for repair.

Director Wepfer said she spoke to Jacksonville Beach about their issues with the sidearm loader. They had issues because it is a contracted service. Madeira Beach has a Broyhill with a sidearm, and it is programmed to meet the needs of the toters the City has. They always had one person on the ground and one in the truck.

The City Manager said they would try it. Director Wepfer said the truck is on a lease, and if they do not like it, they can return it and go back to a rear loader. The City Manager said it gives the City 100% control of the collection.

Commissioner Tagliarini said he is in favor of sacrificing the \$150,000 for the well-being of the customers.

Director Wepfer said the entire crew goes out after a storm to clean up the City, which is not a level of service they would get from a contracted service. It would be an additional cost to the City.

The Consensus of the Board was not to outsource the garbage collection.

11. RECREATION DEPARTMENT

A. Fitness Center

Recreation Director Jay Hatch gave an overview of the preliminary numbers for the three-month trial open registration of the fitness center. He asked for direction from the Board and responded to questions and comments.

Director Hatch said they faced many challenges, and if they decide to move forward, he would need to look at more equipment and technology. He reviewed the fiscal impact it would have.

Vice Mayor Kerr said he is still opposed to it. It should be dedicated to staff, and the City should not be in the business of having this type of facility. Commissioner Brooks agreed. It was not a gym that was intended for the public; it was meant for the Fire Department. The grant for the equipment was for them.

Commissioner McGeehen disagreed. He has only heard positive feedback and wants to keep it for the residents.

Commissioner Tagliarini said he is sympathetic to the problems but wants to leave it as it is. Mayor Rostek agreed.

The consensus of the Board was to bring back the yearly cost to continue with the open registration.

B. City Sponsored Fireworks

Director Hatch said last year's fireworks contract from the RFP was for one year with two oneyear option renewals. He would like to renew the contract for an additional year. He listed the following dates for the 2024 fireworks:

- March 16th Rotary Carnival
- May 4th Grouper Gala
- · July 3rd Independence Day
- November 11th Veterans Day

Commissioner Brooks said the two concerns she heard from residents were returning to the Fourth of July and getting the barge back. Director Hatch said the barge is more expensive and difficult to obtain, but the goal is to get one this year. The July 3rd date is more affordable and easier to obtain a barge. The company utilizes a company for barges. Having the fireworks on July 3 would make it easier to get a barge and easier to get the police. The fireworks would be more affordable, and they would not have to pay overtime for staff.

The consensus of the Board was to bring a contract with proposed dates back to the next regular meeting for approval.

Commissioner Tagliarini announced he attended the Institute for Municipal Elected Officials I (IMEO I) in Gainesville the past weekend. It was very informative. Commissioner Brooks said she and Commissioner McGeehen completed IMEO I and II. They should do an ordinance making it a requirement for newly elected officials to attend the training.

Background

The Board of Commissioners approved Ordinance 2024-01 after first reading and public hearing on Wednesday, January 10, 2024.

The Board of Commissioners adopted, after a second reading and public hearing, Ordinance 2023-24 at its regular meeting on December 13, 2023 placing a charter amendment on the March 19, 2024 Municipal Election Ballot for voter approval to change the qualifying period from the first two weeks in December to the first full week in December. Ordinance 2024-01, calling the March 19, 2024 Municipal Election was prepared for that purpose.

There will not be a race for Commissioner District 1 and Commissioner District 2 on the March 19, 2024 Municipal Ballot. Incumbents David Tagliarini (Commissioner District 1) and Ray Kerr (Commissioner District 2) will be sworn into office at a Board of Commissioners Special Meeting on Wednesday, March 27, 2024 at 5:30 p.m., to begin a new two-year term as District Commissioner. A light reception begins at 4:30 p.m. in the Commission Chambers. The Board of Commissioners Regular Workshop Meeting is at 6:00 p.m.

MARCH 19, 2024 MUNICIPAL ELECTION PROCEDURES (Ordinance 2024-01)

An Election shall be held in the City of Madeira Beach, Florida, on Tuesday, March 19, 2024, for the purpose of voting on one charter amendment.

In accordance with City Charter Section 3.4, Subsection B, the Board of Commissioners shall designate the Pinellas County Canvassing Board to serve as the Canvassing Board for the City of Madeira Beach The actions of the Canvassing Board shall be reported to the Board of Commissioners at its next meeting following the Election. The Board of Commissioners shall meet following the certification for the purpose of declaring the results of said Election

The polling locations for City of Madeira Beach voters to vote in the March 19, 2024 Municipal Election are as follows:

- Precinct 415 Madeira Beach Municipal Building, City Centre Room, 300 Municipal Drive, Madeira Beach, Florida;
- Precinct 301 Calvary Church Seminole (Combined), 6155 113 Street, Seminole, Florida 33772.

If the voters approve the charter amendment at the March 19, 2024 Municipal Election, it will take effect for the candidate qualifying period beginning in December 2024 for the March 2025 Municipal Election.

Charter Amendment on the March 19, 2024 Municipal Ballot:

City of Madeira Beach Charter Amendment

Amend Qualifying Period to the first full week in December.

This charter amendment would amend Section 3.3(A) of the Charter to change the Candidate Qualifying Period to the first full week in December instead of the first two full weeks in December. Should the Charter be amended?

The revised section of the Charter being proposed on the March 19, 2024 Municipal Ballot is:

City Charter, Section 3.3 Nomination of Board of Commissioners.

(A) Filing. Every person who shall desire to become a candidate for nomination under the provisions of this Charter to the office of Mayor and District-Commissioner, shall qualify to become such candidate by filing with the City Clerk during the candidate qualifying period held during the first two full weeks in December, excluding weekends, beginning at Noon on Monday, the first day of the qualifying period and ending at Noon on Friday, the last day of the qualifying period. Under no circumstances shall the City Clerk accept any nomination petitions or filing fees after the close of the filing period as stated herein. Every person's application is to have his/her name printed upon the ballot as a candidate for nomination to the office for which he/she aspires, in which application, he/she shall declare from the district he/she is a candidate or so declare if he/she is a candidate for Mayor. All applications shall be accompanied by an affidavit the candidate is an elector and a resident of the City of Madeira Beach, Florida, for one (1) year immediately prior to the date of said application and has been a resident of said district for which he/she declares himself/herself to be a candidate for a period of six (6) months prior to the date of said application. With said application shall be filed a petition which shall indicate prominently the district from which the Petitioner is a candidate, or if he/she be a candidate for Mayor.

The relevant Florida Statutes are:

Florida Statute 100.3605(1) (Conduct of Municipal Elections) provides:

(1) The Florida Election Code, chapters 97-106, shall govern the conduct of a municipality's Election in the absence of an applicable special act, charter, or ordinance provision. No charter or ordinance provision shall be adopted which conflicts with or exempts a municipality from any provision in the Florida Election Code that expressly applies to municipalities.

Florida Statute 105.031(6) (Qualification; filing fee; candidates oath; items required to be filed) provides:

"Notwithstanding the qualifying period prescribed in this section, a qualifying office may accept and hold qualifying papers submitted not earlier than 14 days prior to the beginning of the qualifying period, to be processed and filed during the qualifying period."

Florida Statute 166.031(1) and (2) (Charter Amendments) provides:

- (1) The governing body of a municipality may, by ordinance, or the electors of a municipality may, by petition signed by 10 percent of the registered electors as of the last preceding municipal general election, submit to the electors of said municipality a proposed amendment to its charter, which amendment may be to any part or to all of said charter except that part describing the boundaries of such municipality. The governing body of the municipality shall place the proposed amendment contained in the ordinance or petition to a vote of the electors at the next general election held within the municipality or at a special election called for such purpose.
- (2) Upon adoption of an amendment to the charter of a municipality by a majority of the electors voting in a referendum upon such amendment, the governing body of said municipality shall have the amendment incorporated into the charter and shall file the revised charter with the Department of State. All such amendments are effective on the date specified therein or as otherwise provided in the charter.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated cost for the Supervisor of Elections Office to administratively assist with the City of Madeira Beach Municipal Election on March 19, 2024 is \$1,589.10. The estimated cost to advertise Ordinance 2024-01 for a second reading and public hearing on February 14, 2024 is \$141.40.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MADEIRA BEACH, FLORIDA, CREATING SECTION 66-70 TO PROVIDE DUTIES OF VEHICLE OPERATORS TO ACTUATE PARKING METERS AND AMENDING SECTION 66-72 TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL LIMITATIONS ON PARKING IN CITY PARKING LOTS AND BEACH ACCESS EASEMENTS IN CHAPTER 66 (TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, City Staff has reviewed the current provisions of Chapter 66 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Madeira Beach and has recommended that Section 66-70 be created to provide for duties of vehicle operators to actuate parking meters and provide for parking beyond time fixed for such vehicles and that Section 66-72 be amended to provide for additional parking limitations; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations of the City Staff have been found meritorious by the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has received input from the public at two public hearings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MADEIRA BEACH, FLORIDA, IN SESSION DULY AND REGULARLY ASSEMBLED:

Section 1. That Section 66-70 (Duty of Operators of Vehicles to Actuate the Parking Meter; Parking Beyond Time Fixed for Such Vehicle) of Division 1 (Generally) of Article III (Stopping, Standing, Parking) of Chapter 66 (Traffic and Vehicles) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Madeira Beach, Florida, is hereby created and shall read as follows:

Sec. 66-70. Duty of operators of vehicles to actuate the parking meter; parking beyond time fixed for such vehicle.

- (1) When any vehicle shall be parked in any time regulated parking space as designated pursuant to this chapter, where controlled by a parking meter, the owner or operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering the parking space, immediately actuate the parking meter. The parking meter may be actuated by manual or electronic means and/or by payment of authorized legal tender, and the parking space may then be used by such vehicle during the parking time limit prescribed for that parking space.
- (2) It is unlawful for any person to permit a vehicle to remain or be placed in any parking space when the parking meter indicates or displays a signal showing that such vehicle is parked overtime or when the pay station receipt indicates that parking time limits have expired.
- (3) It is unlawful for any person to permit a vehicle to remain in any parking space for more than two (2) hours after a citation has been issued for violation of subsection (2) of this section.
- (4) When signs are erected giving notice of time limits, no person shall park a vehicle in any parking meter space and/or zone for a continuous period of time longer than that period of time designated by such signs. In order to enforce this provision no person shall roll the tires of a vehicle or attempt to remove the markings made by a parking enforcement specialist prior to removing the vehicle from the parking space.

<u>Section 2</u>. That Section 66-72 (Limitations on Parking in City Parking Lots and Beach Access Easements) of Division 2 (Parking Meters, Permits and Limitations) of Article III (Stopping, Standing, Parking) of Chapter 66 (Traffic and Vehicles) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Madeira Beach, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 66-72. Limitations on parking in city parking lots and beach access easements.

Parking of any type motor vehicle is allowed in the city parking lots and beach access easements subject to the following limitations:

- (1) All vehicles must park within the designated metered spaces;
- (2) No part of the vehicle may extend beyond the limits of the marked parking space;

- (3) Backing of vehicles into metered spaces is permitted if the license plate of the vehicle can still be readily observed (except where a no back in parking sign is posted for a particular lot or parking space);
- (4) Parking in front of a driveway, blocking access for residents or emergency vehicles is prohibited;
- (5) Double parking is prohibited. Double parking refers to parking next to or obstructing another parked vehicle, wholly or partially;
- (6) Parking too close to an intersection obstructing visibility for other drivers is prohibited;
- (7) Parking on the sidewalk or pedestrian walkway obstructing pedestrian traffic is prohibited;
- (8) Parking in a bus zone or bus stop impeding public transportation is prohibited;
- (9) Unauthorized parking in a reserved spot for employees or residents is prohibited. This includes parking in a designated space without proper authorization;
- (10) Parking in a manner that obstructs access to public facilities, like mailboxes or trash bins is prohibited;
- (11) Parking in a manner that obstructs visibility for other drivers, such as parking on a curve is prohibited;
- (12) Parking in a manner that blocks access to essential infrastructure, like fire hydrants or utility boxes is prohibited;
- (13) Parking within fifteen (15) feet on either side of a fire hydrant or in a designated tow-away zone is prohibited;
- (14) Parking in a bike lane or crosswalk endangering cyclists and pedestrians is prohibited;
- (15) Except when otherwise provided in this chapter, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a one-way roadway shall be so stopped or parked parallel to the curb or edge of the roadway, in the direction of authorized traffic movement, with its right-hand wheels within 12 inches of the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, or its left wheels within 12 inches of the left-hand curb or edge of the roadway;
- (16) Parking is only allowed during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, unless otherwise posted;
- (17) Meters are in effect on all lots during the allowable hours of operation, seven days a week; and
- (18) Parking is prohibited in all areas during the hours of 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m. daily, unless otherwise posted.

<u>Section 3</u>. For purposes of codification of any existing section of the Madeira Beach Code herein amended, words <u>underlined</u> represent additions to original text, words <u>stricken</u> are deletions from the original text, and words neither underlined nor stricken remain unchanged.

<u>Section 4</u>. Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith to the extent that such conflict exists are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>. In the event a court of competent jurisdiction finds any part or provision of the Ordinance unconstitutional or unenforceable as a matter of law, the same shall be stricken and the remainder of the Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect.

<u>Section 6</u>. The Codifier shall codify the substantive amendments to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Madeira Beach contained in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance as provided for herein and shall not codify the exordial clauses nor any other sections not designated for codification.

<u>Section 7</u>. Pursuant to Florida Statutes §166.041(4), this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Background:

Pursuant to Land Development Code Article VI, Division 6, Alcoholic Beverages, the applicant for ABP 2024-01 is requesting authorization from the Board of Commissioners for the approval of a (2COP) alcoholic beverage license for the sale of beer and wine for consumption on premises at Osaka Japanese and Thai Restaurant of Madeira Beach located at 696 150th Avenue Madeira Beach, Florida 33708. This establishment is located in the C-3, Retail Commercial Zoning District. The future land use designation for the property is Commercial General.

Pursuant to Section 110-539, the Notice of Public Hearing has been properly sent to all property owners within 300 feet of the subject property 15 days prior to the scheduled consideration by the Board of Commission. Such notice has also been posted on the subject property, at the Gulf Beaches Public Library, City Hall, and the City of Madeira Beach website.

Discussion:

When considering the alcoholic beverage license application, the Board of Commissioners shall consider the following factors:

(1) The extent to which the location and the extent to which the proposed alcoholic beverage request will adversely affect the character of the existing neighborhood.

Permitting Osaka Japanese and Thai Restaurant of Madeira Beach to serve beer and wine for consumption on premises would not adversely affect the character of the existing

neighborhood. The existing neighborhood is mostly commercial uses. Within the past five years, there was previously a sushi restaurant (Hinata Japanese Steakhouse & Seafood) at this location that was approved for the same type of (2COP) alcoholic beverage license in 2016 (ASP#2016-02).

(2) The extent to which traffic generated as a result of the location of the proposed alcoholic beverage request will create congestion or present a safety hazard.

Previously a restaurant with a (2COP) alcoholic beverage license was located at this location. The minimum parking requirements of this property exceed the requirements of (sec. 110-971). Additional traffic and congestion should not be created by the proposed alcohol use. The proposed alcohol use does not present a safety hazard.

(3) Whether or not the proposed use is compatible with the particular location for which it is proposed.

This proposed alcohol use is compatible with the location. Other businesses in this shopping center also serve alcohol such as Slyce Madeira Beach, another restaurant within the same shopping center.

(4) Whether or not the proposed use will adversely affect the public safety.

Public safety should not be adversely affected by Osaka Japanese and Thai Restaurant of Madeira Beach serving beer and wine for consumption on the premises. The restaurant is more than 300 feet away from any established church, synagogue, temple, or place of religious worship, public or private school operated for the instruction of minors, or youth recreation (community) center. This 300-foot requirement is the minimum distance required for bars and clubs located in the C-3, Zoning District (sec. 110-530) and does not need to be met for restaurants.

(5) No application for review under this section shall be considered until the applicant has paid in full any outstanding charges, fees, interest, fines or penalties owed by the applicant to the city under any section of the Code.

The applicant has no outstanding fines or penalties owed to the City under any section of the Code.

FIELD INTERNSHIP AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the **BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE**, Post Office Box 13489, St. Petersburg, Florida, 33733, hereinafter referred to as the College, and **CITY OF MADEIRA BEACH**, 300 Municipal Drive, Madeira Beach, Florida 33708, hereinafter referred to as the Agency.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the College offers an approved program of study in the field of Emergency Medical Services, and

WHEREAS, the College desires that its students obtain the necessary clinical and handson experience with the Agency in order to meet the requirements of the Emergency Medical Services program, and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to cooperate with the College in implementing the above-stated objective.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual promises contained in this Agreement, the Agency and the College, by their duly constituted and authorized officers, agree as follows:

THAT the students enrolled in the above-named program and the faculty at the College may ride with fire rescue units of the Agency subject to the following mutually agreed conditions:

- 1. That neither the College nor the Agency will discriminate on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, religion, sex, age, national origin, marital status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender identity, genetic information, or against any qualified individual with disabilities in its employment practices or in the admission and treatment of students. The College and the Agency recognize that sexual harassment constitutes discrimination on the basis of sex and neither party will not tolerate such conduct.
- 2. The College will provide the Agency with a list of all students and instructors who will be assigned to fire rescue in the Emergency Medical Services Program.
- 3. The College will be responsible for assuring that the Agency is in receipt, from each student and instructor participating, of a signed release agreement. (An example of the release agreement to be provided is attached as Exhibit A. The student signs the release in triplicate; the original goes to the Agency, one copy is retained in the student's file and the third copy is retained by the student.)

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- 4. The College through the Florida College System Risk Management Consortium (FCSRMC) shall obtain and maintain occurrence-type professional liability insurance coverage in amounts not less than \$2,000,000 per incident and \$5,000,000 annual aggregate covering the students and any faculty members for instruction/supervision of students only. The College shall provide a certificate of insurance to the Agency evidencing such insurance coverage if required by the Agency. Should any of the above-described policies be cancelled before the expiration date thereof, notice will be delivered in accordance with the policy provisions.
- 5. Students who are employed by the Agency participating in the field internship while on duty are required to sign the "Process for On-duty Firefighters Accomplishing Student SPC Field Internship Ride Time" form attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 6. The Agency reserves the right to withdraw its permission to allow participation of a particular student or instructor. Further, Agency reserves the right to withdraw its permission to all students or instructors in the program if and when it becomes apparent that: (1) the students or instructors are hindering the performance of the emergency medical personnel of the Agency; (2) the students or instructors are jeopardizing the health or safety of the patients or the emergency medical personnel; (3) the students or instructors are not cooperating with the emergency medical personnel; or (4) the students or instructors are subjecting themselves or the Agency's employees to liability for which no insurance has been provided.
- 7. The Agency shall provide to enrolled students of the College the opportunity for necessary clinical experience required for said program. Students shall undertake said clinical experience under supervision of the Agency's paramedic field preceptor. The number of students accepted under this program shall be agreed to by the parties for each term.
- 8. The Agency shall have ultimate responsibility for the care and treatment of the patient/client.
- 9. The Agency shall comply with students' privacy rights under federal and state laws regarding students' educational records.
- 10. The College and students shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations, and rules and policies of the Agency regarding the confidentiality of patient information.

THIS AGREEMENT shall become effective upon the date of signature of both parties, and shall be automatically renewed from year to year unless either party requests a change or termination thereof.

THIS AGREEMENT may be terminated upon the giving of written notice by either party to the other party thirty (30) days before the first day of August of any given year, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, such termination shall not become effective as to students already enrolled and participating in the program until they shall have had an opportunity to complete the program at the Agency to meet the course of study requirements for graduation.

ANY NOTICE required or permitted to be given under this agreement shall be sufficient if in writing and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to either of the parties. Notice shall be effective upon compliance with this section.

Participant does hereby waive, release and hold harmless the City of Madeira Beach, its officers, agents, employees, specifically including the individual fire department employees with whom Participant comes in contact with for any claim, demand, liability, suit, charge or compensation for loss or injury of any kind arising out of a loss or injury, including a losses or injuries arising from the negligence of the City of Madeira Beach, its officers, agents, employees, specifically including the individual fire department employees, participants and instructors of the Program. Participant assumes all risk of injury, liability and loss arising from my participation in or presence at said Program. Participant acknowledges that the City of Madeira Beach will not assume any costs relating to any injury Participant may suffer while involved in this Program. This waiver, release and indemnification is in consideration of the City of Madeira Beach permitting Participants participation in the Program. Participant acknowledges that absent this release, waiver and indemnification, the City of Madeira Beach and the individual fire department employees, EMTs and paramedics would not have offered or allowed me access to the Program because of unacceptable exposure to liability claims or expense of providing a program that is risk free.

PROCESS FOR ON-DUTY FIREFIGHTERS ACCOMPLISHING STUDENT SPC FIELD INTERNSHIP RIDE TIME

- 1. Students will wear approved SPC EMS Program uniform as defined by the EMS Program Director. This includes Student ID badge during the entire time the firefighter is acting in student status, as well as wearing only the SPC EMS Student vest as required (not the agency vest) while in student status.
- 2. Ride time will not begin before 0800 hours and will end no later than 2300 hours on the same day. If requested by the station officer, ride time will end earlier. Instructor must be notified. SPC Paramedic students employed by participating community partners are permitted to perform 24-hour shifts, with the approval of the department Chief, EMS Chief, or department equivalent.
- 3. No SPC EMS student shall perform skills at the Advanced Life Support level except while in student status, and under the direct supervision of an approved college preceptor. Violation of this rule will result in immediate termination of the student from the EMS program.
- 4. Students shall never be with a patient by themselves; they will always be with their assigned preceptor.
- 5. In accordance with the SPC EMS department syllabus and handbook, students must complete a minimum of 364 hours of ride time to meet the program's field experience and internship requirements.
- 6. Attending field internship without turning in a schedule for approval in a timely manner **before** the requested shifts will not be allowed. According to SPC EMS Program policies, any changes to the prior-approved schedule (i.e., station change, preceptor change, or date change) must be approved verbally by the assigned instructor **before** the ride time. There will be no exceptions. This may require the student taking time off from work to accomplish the required hours in the assigned time period. If this is not done, the ride time will not count and the student will be disciplined, with possible termination from the EMS program.
- 7. In accordance with Florida administrative code 64J, students may complete up to 20% (72.8 hours) of the field internship experience to be done aboard an advanced life support permitted vehicle other than an ambulance.

- (iii) any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and
- (iv) the penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.
- (2) Requiring the employee to sign a copy of such written statement to acknowledge his or her receipt of same and advice as to the specifics of such policy. Such person or entity shall retain the statements signed by its employees. Such person or entity shall also post in a prominent place at all of its workplaces a written statement of its policy containing the foregoing elements (i) through (iv).
- Notifying the employee in the statement required by subsection (1) that as a condition of employment the employee will:

- (4) Notifying the City within ten (10) days after receiving notice under subsection (3) from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- (5) Imposing appropriate personnel action against such employee up to and including termination; or requiring such employee to satisfactorily participate in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
- (6) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of sections (1) through (5) stated above.

Background

The public works department is requesting approval to purchase a 2023 Chevy Silverado 5500 Regular Cab 2WD that has been discussed during budget workshops and approved in the final FY24 budget. The truck has been budgeted in the Public Works Administration budget for \$75,000. Alan Jay is on the City of Tallahassee Purchasing Contract 5179-2023 City of Tallahassee. This truck will replace a 2004 Ford F550 that serves as the chassis for the Duralift Bucket truck which is used in various departments. The Duralift will be removed from the current truck and installed on the new one. Swapping the Duralift will require additional cost from a Fabricator but will stay within the allocated budget of \$75,000.

Fiscal Impact

\$75,000 has been budgeted in FY24 and the truck price is \$54,880.00. With the fabrication needed to switch the body staff will stay within budget.

Recommendation(s)

Staff recommends the approval of the 2023 Chevy Silverado 5500 Regular Cab 2WD from Alan Jay for the amount of \$54,880.00.



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



AGREEMENT FOR FIREWORKS DISPLAYS

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into on the ____ day of February, 2024 (the "Effective Date"), by and between MASTER PYRO DISPLAY, L.L.C., a Florida Limited Liability Company with a Principal Address of 3332 Victoria Park Road, Jacksonville, FL 32216 ("Contractor") and the CITY OF MADEIRA BEACH, a Florida Municipal Corporation ("City").

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2023, the City issued RFP No.: 23-01, requesting proposals from qualified companies to provide fireworks displays on March 17, 2023, May 6, 2023, July 3, 2023, and November 11, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2023, Contractor submitted a proposal outlining its proposed services and related charges; and

WHEREAS, having considered the responsive proposals received and found Contractor to be responsive and responsible, and having found Contractor's proposal to be the most beneficial to the City's needs, the City chose to negotiate final contract terms with Contractor; and

WHEREAS, the City and Contractor have agreed to exercise a one year contract renewal, per the terms of the issued RFP: and

WHEREAS, the City and Contractor having agreed on final contractual terms, have agreed to enter this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of the promises and covenants contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Contract Documents; Order of Precedence.

This Agreement shall consist of the following documents, and in the event of any conflict as to a term or condition between them, the earlier listed document shall control over the later listed document:

- This Agreement
- RFP No.: 23-01 (attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**)
- Contractor's Proposal including any attachments or exhibits thereto referenced in the Proposal (attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit B**)

2. Contractor Duties.

Contractor shall provide to the City fireworks displays on March 16, 2024, May 4, 2024, July 3, 2024, and November 9, 2024 in the manner set forth in its Proposal, and in full compliance with all applicable safety rule, regulations and industry best practices as are referenced in the City's RFP, Contractor's Proposal, or are otherwise provided for by law.

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3. Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date through November 30, 2024.

4. Payment

Pursuant to Florida Statutes §§ 218.73 and 218.74, Contractor shall be paid the following fees: \$5,000.00 for the March 16th display, \$5,000.00 for the May 4th display, \$20,000.00 for the July 3rd display and \$5,000.00 for the November 9th display not more than forty-five (45) days after it has submitted to the City a proper invoice, which invoice shall be submitted only after the Contractor's required services have been completed.

Improper payment requests shall be addressed by the City as provided for in Florida Statutes § 218.76, and any disputes with respect to payment of an invoice shall be determined as provided for in that statute and any associated City procurement codes or procedures addressing resolution of payment disputes.

5. Amendments.

This Agreement may only be altered by written amendment executed by authorized officials of both Parties.

6. Severability.

In the event that any provision or portion hereof of any Contract Document shall be found to be invalid or unenforceable, then such provisions or portion thereof shall be performed in accordance with the applicable laws. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision or portion of any Contract Document shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of the Contract Documents.

7. Miscellaneous Terms.

A. Each Party to this Agreement represents and warrants to the other Party that (i) they are duly organized, qualified and existing entities under the laws of the State of Florida, and (ii) all appropriate authority exists so as to duly authorize the persons executing this Agreement to so execute the same fully bind the Party on whose behalf they are executing.

B. Immigration Compliance; E-Verify. Contractor acknowledges that it is responsible for complying with the provisions of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, U.S.C. § 1324, et seq., and regulations relating thereto. Failure to comply with the above statutory provisions shall be considered a material breach and shall be grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement. The Contractor's employment of unauthorized aliens is a violation of § 274(e) of the Federal Immigration and Employment Act. The Contractor shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired during the term of this

Agreement and shall require the same verification procedure of any Subcontractors authorized by the Owner. Pursuant to Florida Statutes § 448.095(2), beginning January 1st 2021, Contractor shall register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. Contractor's contract with the City cannot be renewed unless, at the time of renewal, Contractor certifies in writing to the City that it has registered with and uses the E-Verify system. If Contractor enters into a contract with a subcontractor, the subcontractor must provide the Contractor with an affidavit stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an unauthorized alien and Contractor shall maintain a copy of such affidavit for the duration of the contract. If Contractor develops a good faith belief that any subcontractor with which it is contracting has knowingly violated Florida Statutes § 448.09(1) (making it unlawful for any person knowingly to employ, hire, recruit, or refer, either for herself or himself or on behalf of another, for private or public employment within the state, an alien who is not duly authorized to work by the immigration laws or the Attorney General of the United States) Contractor shall terminate the contract with the subcontractor. If the City develops a good faith belief that Contractor has knowingly violated Florida Statutes § 448.09(1) (making it unlawful for any person knowingly to employ, hire, recruit, or refer, either for herself or himself or on behalf of another, for private or public employment within the state, an alien who is not duly authorized to work by the immigration laws or the Attorney General of the United States) the City shall terminate this contract. Pursuant to Florida Statutes § 448.095(2)(c)(3), termination under the above-circumstances is not a breach of contract and may not be considered as such.

- C. **No Third-Party Beneficiary**. This Agreement is for the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns, and it is not the intent of the Parties to enter this Agreement for any other person's or entity's benefit.
- D. **Jurisdiction, Venue, Applicable Law**. In the event of any litigation between the Parties with respect to the interpretation or enforcement of this Agreement, same shall be conducted, if in state court, in the appropriate circuit or county court in and for Pinellas County, Florida, and if in federal court, in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida, Tampa Division. In any such litigation, the substantive and procedural laws of the State of Florida shall be applied.
- E. **Public Records**. In accordance with Florida Statutes § 119.0701, the Contractor shall:
 - 1. Keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service.
 - 2. Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the requesting City with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
 - 3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the contractor does not transfer the records to the City.

4. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the City all public records in possession of the Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public records to the City upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the City, upon request from the City's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the City.

The City has selected Contractor for its stated skills, abilities and unique product offerings, as represented to the City by Contractor's solicitation response and via other means. Contractor has represented to the City that it has the in-house capabilities, resources and expertise to perform the services required by this Agreement except as otherwise expressly set forth in this Agreement. Therefore, except in the case of a sale, transfer or assignment of all or substantially all of the assets of Contractor to a successor who has asserted its intent to continue the business of Contractor, Contractor shall not assign or transfer any right or duty under this Agreement to any other party without the prior written consent of the City. In the unlikely event Contractor asserts it is necessary to subcontract for the services of third parties to perform any service or provide any product under this Agreement not already provided for therein, Contractor shall first obtain prior written approval of the City. Subject: Tampa Bay Coastal Master Plan

Background

The TBRPC is in the process of creating a project proposal to develop a Tampa Bay Coastal Master Plan (TBCMP), similar to <u>Louisiana's</u>. We were among the 120 (out of 869) selected by NOAA to submit a full application for their <u>Climate Resilience Regional Challenge</u> track one funding (we are requesting \$2 million). It would likely be a 4-year project.

<u>A broad summary of the TBCMP</u>: The plan will equip the region with compound flooding maps and a prioritized list of feasible restoration and risk reduction project concepts, both structural and nonstructural, that will serve as guidance to equitably address the many challenges posed by high-tide flooding, storm surge, rainfall-related flooding, and future sea level rise. Our initial Letter of Intent is attached.

It hasn't officially kicked off, but the extensive application required by NOAA is serving as the impetus for building the project's framework for completion. Here is a link to the current working proposal we will be submitting to NOAA for funding, and we will be using this for applying to other grants: https://docs.google.com/document/d/1-e9AbR7YOSXh9IbapeDas7 8MWkWBjrgIlumykweomg/edit?usp=sharing

The plan will be designed for local governments in the Tampa Bay region, so their participation is essential for this project's success. Tampa, St. Pete, Oldsmar, Pinellas, Hillsborough, Crystal River, Pasco, and others are already involved. I am sending this email to get the City of Madeira Beach's support and participation in the project. I'm hoping to include the local governments as "collaborators" on the project since local gov't staff will be our primary end users/implementers. See the attached document for more information on the distinction between "collaborators" vs "partners."

Geographic Description: The Tampa Bay region, located on the Gulf coast of Florida, covers an area of approximately 2,200 square miles and is characterized by its extensive coastal waterways and urban centers at typical elevations of 2-10 m above mean sea level. The region is home to 3.8 million. Tampa, St. Petersburg, and Clearwater are the largest and most prominent cities within the Tampa Bay metropolitan area, although there are nearly 60 municipalities, many of which are active members of the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council (TBRPC). The region's population is growing rapidly and protection and planning is needed to address compounding environmental stressors.

Resilience Vision

The Tampa Bay region envisions resilience as the ability and enduring capacity of its diverse coastal communities and habitats to mitigate and adapt to the risks posed by long-term climatic changes and short-term weather extremes. As groundwater and sea levels rise, and the pace and extent of coastal flooding and erosion accelerates, communities throughout the Tampa Bay region are faced with the difficult challenge of deciding how to prepare for and adapt to these changing conditions, especially with our most vulnerable residents. Adaptation strategies can range from building and fortifying infrastructure, to habitat restoration and incorporating nature-based solutions, to planned community or asset relocation. Each approach comes with its own costs, benefits and trade-offs, and community members and asset managers must engage in thoughtful discussions about risk and which mitigation strategies are most appropriate for their specific circumstances.

In the proposed project, the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council (TBRPC) and its partners will facilitate a cross-jurisdictional and multi-stakeholder planning process to develop a Coastal Master Plan for the Tampa Bay region that illustrates how the Gulf coast will change over time, proposing a coordinated suite of enduring, local adaptation pathways in response to the many risks to our diverse communities. The plan will equip the region with a prioritized list of feasible restoration and risk reduction project concepts,

both structural and nonstructural, that will serve as guidance to equitably address the many challenges posed by high-tide flooding, storm surge, rainfall-related flooding, and future sea level rise in vulnerable areas, particularly historically marginalized, underserved, and underrepresented communities. This four-year planning process and the resulting plan will be grounded by extensive community engagement, regional collaboration, the latest scientific information, and key social and ecological metrics, as well as pertinent tools, studies, and cost considerations. The project team will leverage existing resources and collaboratives, including the Tampa Bay Regional Resiliency Coalition, as well as build new community connections, to catalyze crucial conversations about risks from flood and storm surge exposure, and practical, equitable initiatives to adapt more than 700 miles of coastline in the Tampa Bay area. This approach will create a cohesive, enduring strategy that will mobilize the region's broader resiliency vision and goals, while supporting local and regional efforts to fund and implement resilience and adaptation actions.

Regional Context

The Tampa Bay region is home to 3.8 million people (about twice the population of Nebraska despite being 10 times smaller in size) spread across communities of diverse cultures, socioeconomic backgrounds, and geographies. The region is also home to world-renowned Gulf beaches and Florida's largest open-water estuary, which are inextricably linked to the local economy and livelihoods of residents. Water is vital to the region, but it also puts our communities at significant risk of coastal and inland flooding. According to *The 3rd National Risk Assessment* from First Street Foundation (2021), many of the Tampa Bay region's counties face major to severe flood risk today, and are among those in the state with the highest projected growth in flood risk over the next 30 years. Local governments in the Tampa Bay region tend to carry out projects as the need arises, and resilience considerations are commonly integrated into existing capital improvement projects. Local governments are beginning to pursue resilience projects for their own sake, but there is little coordination across the region and there is no current strategic plan for long-term coastal adaptation at a regional scale. The proposed planning project will build upon existing regional collaboratives to engage more communities and advance joint actions that will accelerate the region's climate resilience and adaptation practices.

Since 1962, the TBRPC has convened local governments and gubernatorial appointees to plan for and coordinate intergovernmental solutions to complex, large-scale issues. The TBRPC membership includes 21 municipalities from within the six-county Tampa Bay region—Citrus, Hernando, Pasco, Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Manatee Counties — as well as gubernatorial appointees and state agencies. An integral part of the TBRPC since 1985, the Agency on Bay Management is a committee that serves as a broad-based forum for open discussion of the issues involving the Tampa Bay estuary, and a voice for protection, restoration, and wise use of its natural resources by the entire region.

Under the leadership of the TBRPC, the Tampa Bay Regional Resiliency Coalition (the Coalition) was formed in 2018 to synchronize climate adaptation and mitigation activities and provide access to resources to advance local and regional responses to disruptions resulting from the impacts of climate change. In five years, the Coalition has grown to 33 member governments and more than 90 resilience partners. The Coalition adopted the first Regional Resiliency Action Plan (RRAP) in 2022 to serve as a five-year roadmap of general local and regional adaptation and mitigation actions. The proposed regional-scale coastal master plan will complement the RRAP in building local governments' capacity and progress towards implementation, while promoting efficient, well-informed decision-making as well as pre-positioning them for other funding opportunities. The resulting plan will serve as an adaptation resource and guide for decision-makers to maximize enduring community benefits that support a thriving coast where people can continue to live, work, and enjoy the region's unique features.

Proposed Activities and Outcomes

The Tampa Bay Coastal Master Plan (TBCMP) will guide investments in coastal restoration, resilience, and risk reduction across the region by effectively communicating anticipated landscape and hydrologic changes and proposing a suite of potential projects to advance the region's adaptation to current and future flood impacts. As the first of its kind in the state, the TBCMP will foster the ongoing, iterative process of adaptive management to ensure long-term capacity building and progress to advance adaptation actions across the Tampa Bay region. The activities include: (1) convening stakeholders to identify a four-year

planning process; (2) regional flood risk analysis; (3) solicitation of adaptation projects; (4) iterative review and evaluation of projects; (5) report publication.

Essential stakeholders and community members will be convened to identify a shared vision, goals, and methodology for the plan's development. With input from community leaders and other stakeholders, project partners will develop a four-year planning process and outreach strategies to maximize regional coordination, transparency, and innovation. Ad hoc technical and community advisory workgroups will be established to support deliberative discussions throughout the process, ensuring that iterative engagement and shared goals are achieved. The planning process and outreach efforts will be designed to support future replication and enduring capacity for adaptation.

The inclusive planning process of the TBCMP will reach beyond governmental partners, a common barrier for large-scale planning efforts, to deeply engage underserved communities to ensure the project and its outcomes equitably reflect the interests, values, and priorities of all residents. Key stakeholders will include community members, business owners, scientists, health professionals, resilience experts, local, state, and federal agencies, and other interested parties. The TBCMP outreach effort will leverage the existing stakeholder network of the Coalition and the Agency on Bay Management, as well as the recommendations of the Tampa Bay Estuary Program's Equity Strategy. Additionally, outreach to new stakeholders, especially historically underrepresented communities, will be prioritized to build inclusivity and diversity into the master plan process. As much as possible, engagement will begin at existing community-based meetings and events to ensure the greatest reach and inclusive dialogue. Relationshipbuilding will engage diverse community leaders, such as faith-based leaders and community champions, who will be compensated for participating in project meetings. The TBCMP team will engage with stakeholders throughout the entire process and beyond, further fostering enduring capacity to advance adaptation efforts.

Outcomes include: (1) regional advisory workgroups with diverse membership; (2) equitable outreach strategy; (3) four-year replicable planning process and timeline that underpins a shared vision and goals; (4) relationship-building and increased community awareness and participation in coastal resilience efforts; (5) historically underserved communities engaged in community meetings and represented in the workgroups.

Existing data, tools, and local knowledge will be compiled and adapted, as needed, to conduct a region-wide risk analysis identifying areas with high exposure to flooding. A regional risk assessment will help to analyze current and future flood risk and community vulnerabilities to inform proactive measures that provide resiliency and adaptation from storm surges and other flooding events. Through modeling, the project team will develop probabilistic flood maps for the Tampa Bay region by incorporating the effects of storm surge, sea level rise and rainfall on coastal and riverine flooding. Jurisdictions throughout the region have completed or are in the process of completing risk assessments that provide readily available data for regional critical assets and mitigation focus areas. In addition, the project team will leverage available tools and modeling resources developed by local and state agencies including the Florida Flood Hub for Applied Research and Innovation, University of Florida, University of South Florida, and University of Central Florida, such as the Adaptation of Coastal Urban and Natural Ecosystems (ACUNE) Geo Tool, the Tampa Bay Water Integrated Hydrologic Model, and the Tampa Bay Coastal Ocean Model (TBCOM). One or more local universities will be contracted to perform the modeling needed for the risk assessment and subsequent project evaluations.

At-risk communities, both waterfront (gulf, bay, and riverine) and inland, will be identified across the region's coastal counties using existing public resources and local knowledge. Underserved and marginalized communities will be identified and prioritized in the assessment using resident insights and tools such as the USC's Social Vulnerability Index, CDC/ATSDR Social Vulnerability Index, FEMA National Risk Index, EPA's Environmental Justice Screening and Mapping tool, the Tampa Bay Estuary Program's Equity Strategy (expanded to the entire region), and University of South Florida's Community Resiliency Information System (CRIS) platform. This approach will help prioritize locations for adaptation projects that maximize the equitable flow of benefits to underserved communities across the region. The planning process will facilitate interactive engagement such as community coastal mapping exercises and deliberative community discussions about residents' experiences with flooding, their risks, and the trade-offs associated with actions we can take now to achieve a more resilient future.

Outcomes include: (1) regional maps illustrating current and future flood risks; (2) identification of atrisk communities, especially underserved, to inform project locations; (3) community meetings and risk messaging for the public.

Potential project concepts will be solicited from the public, members of advisory groups, and Coalition members to address key coastal and inland flooding concerns across the region. Informed by the risk assessment, the TBCMP team will work with public and private sector partners to solicit new project ideas, refine project concepts, and listen to residents to identify areas of need. Regional meetings will foster innovation and multi-jurisdictional consensus on new potential coastal protection project concepts, including restoration and structural and non-structural risk reduction projects. Structural risk reduction projects encompass large-scale infrastructure changes to reduce flooding and enhance coastal protection; emphasis will be on nature-based solutions. Nonstructural measures can be applied across all communities, such as elevating residences, commercial floodproofing, and resilience policies. In addition, the plan will include approaches to restore, create, and sustain ecosystems for resilience benefits that align with the project vision and regional restoration goals. Project concepts will leverage existing resources, like beneficial reuse of sediment from the Army Corps of Engineers' maintenance dredging, to lower costs and increase feasibility of implementation.

Components of ongoing county-level Adaptation Plans that have regional potential, whether by design or expansion through TBCMP-related evaluations, may also become candidate project concepts for inclusion in the TBCMP. The project team will prioritize engagement with underrepresented communities throughout the process to ensure their values and concerns are reflected in the plan and to empower engagement in the planning process by increasing awareness about current risks and brainstorming potential solutions. Underrepresented community members (compensated for their time) and local government staff will participate in professional development workshops—hosted by the University of Florida and HBCU Florida A&M University— and become integral in co-developing structural and nonstructural project ideas to advance through the assessment process as suggested in the NAAEE Community Guidelines for Excellence. Outreach themes, highlights, priorities, takeaways, and outcomes will be tracked and reflected in the final TBCMP.

Outcomes include: (1) broad list of adaptation project concepts around the region, including those developed by communities; (2) through workshops and deliberative community discussions, local government staff will be better equipped to more effectively understand and communicate risk and co-design solutions with those most impacted communities.

Candidate projects will be iteratively reviewed and evaluated to determine their effectiveness at reducing flood risks, producing equitable outcomes, and feasibility for implementation. By evaluating restoration or risk reduction project concepts and advancing promising ideas, the master plan process will support more comprehensive implementation efforts. An engineering firm will be contracted to refine the project concepts for further evaluation. Candidate projects will be evaluated with geospatial land loss and inundation models (as funding allows), cost benefit analyses, as well as other impacts on important social and ecological metrics (such as navigation, equity, health, housing, habitat impacts, and community vulnerability) and other residents' concerns. Furthermore, the master plan will use data of current and future conditions and estimates of flood-related damages to the region's communities and assets to assess the potential benefits of restoration and risk reduction projects, identifying those projects that most effectively support flexible adaptation pathways.

Outcomes include: (1) project assessment methodology, including modeling, cost benefit analyses, and qualitative indicator matrix; (2) prioritized list of effective restoration and risk reduction projects.

A final Tampa Bay Coastal Master Plan will communicate flood risks around the region, and prioritize risk reduction and restoration projects to support enduring adaptation. The planning process and results will be detailed in a final report summarizing future landscape changes and tangible adaptation pathways that provide co-benefits to the region's most vulnerable communities and ecosystems. The project team will host community and advisory group meetings to gather feedback on the draft plan, ensuring it reflects the shared vision. Subsequent meetings and outreach sessions will facilitate the dissemination of the final plan and related resources. A dashboard will complement the master plan, enabling full access to data, information, and visuals developed through the planning process. Three-dimensional (3D) renderings of vulnerable areas with and without the proposed projects will be created to illustrate site-specific flood risks

and feasible solutions. These visuals will help communicate risk to residents and other public and private partners, highlighting how pilot project concepts across the region will progress adaptation efforts and enhance community resilience.

This TBCMP planning process and final report will facilitate project identification and advancement to allow expedited execution of projects as funding becomes available, such as the NOAA Transformational Habitat Restoration and Coastal Resilience Grants. The TBCMP will not be too prescriptive about project details so that designs can be customized, and appropriately engineered, to site-specific conditions when implemented. To ensure enduring capacity for implementation, the project team will identify sources of potential funding to be incorporated within the plan. The TBCMP will provide a valuable communication resource for underserved and underrepresented communities to better understand their flood exposure, how the coast will change over time, and place-based adaptation pathways. Educational resources, such as engagement best practices and outreach materials, developed throughout the project by the National Wildlife Federation and University of Florida, will help ensure staff continue to engage the community through deliberative discussions about risk and the ongoing process of adaptation. Finally, the TBCMP will be updated on a six-year cycle so efforts are sustained.

Outcomes include (1) a published plan illustrating flood risks over time and corresponding restoration and risk reduction projects; (2) an interactive dashboard and select 3D renderings of projects will assist in communication efforts; (3) regional coordination and community support to advance concerted adaptation actions; (4) local government staff, especially in under resourced northern counties of the region, will have more capacity to take efficient and effective action when implementation funds become available; (5) nature-based projects will provide resilience co-benefits to habitats and communities; (6) the region's underserved communities will have new adaptation resources and be better positioned to receive large-scale risk reduction projects.







SAND DUNES RESTORATION / SHORE STABILIZATION PROJECT

Pinellas County contractor, Gator Dredging, completed the sand dunes restoration on Monday, December 5. The approximately 1,800 linear feet area receiving additional sand stretched from the southern property line of the Ocean Sands Condo buildings, just South of Archibald Park, North to the north property line for the Sereno Condos/Townhomes just North of Archibald Park:





A separate contractor began the plantings on the last week of December hoping to complete just after the new year. Again, signs posted on site continue to remind all to please stay off and do not walk on, through, etc., the new sand dunes. The City of Madeira Beach greatly appreciates everyone's cooperation.

ANOTHER WINTER STORM - FLOODING

Unfortunately, various properties in our City once again on the overnight of Saturday, Dec 16 into Sunday, Dec 17, experiencing flooding as a winter storm pushed considerable Gulf water onto our City streets particularly from 140th to the North. Difficult for some of our low-lying areas to prevent rising waters; fortunately the recently installed/revitalized sand dunes in and around Archibald Park did keep water and sand off the Archibald Park areas including the parking lot. Approximately 1/3 of that sand did wash away, but enough was left to allow the County's contractor to continue with the plantings.





Note: Android device users who already had the previous Ready Pinellas app installed will need to download the new app from the Google Play store and remove the old app from their devices. Apple device (iPhone and iPad) users will see the app automatically updated.

The new app features a refreshed design and user experience, additional information and tips, and convenient checklists to make sure you and your family are prepared. App users can use emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan.

As a storm approaches, the app will provide real-time updates to help keep you safe, including detailed information that is available at your fingertips even if you lose internet connectivity. It will provide resources to contact us year-round and during a disaster and give you tips to Stay Informed.



Ready Pinellas App Features

- Know Your Zone: If you have your locator services on, the app will tell you
 if you are in a designated evacuation zone. You can also look up other
 addresses to see if they are in an evacuation zone. Remember:
 Evacuation zones were updated for the 2022 hurricane season, so you
 may have a new zone. When a storm is approaching, it will tell you if
 Pinellas County is in the 5-day or 3-day cone and if an evacuation order
 has been issued.
- Make a Plan: Use our emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan that you can share. You can take pictures of items for your home inventory.
- Push Notifications: Through the app, you will receive informational and emergency notifications from Pinellas County Emergency Management, the National Weather Service and Alert Pinellas.
- <u>Special Needs</u>: You can learn more about special needs assistance, which
 is intended for those who need transportation or require minimal medical
 assistance while seeking public shelter. You can register from the app.
- Preparedness Tips: Learn how to prepare your family, pets, home, condo, mobile home, boat and more.
- Safety Tips: Find information on What to Do Now before, during, and after an event. Learn about year-round preparedness, how to clean up after a flood or food safety if power has been out.

PARKING

A few reminders regarding **resident** and **visitor** parking:

- 1. Residents can obtain up to 3 RESIDENT PARKING PASSES at no charge, that allow residents to park in any City of Madeira Beach lot while the lot is open as well as on streets that allow resident parking. No overnight parking is allowed at any City lot using the RESIDENT PARKING PASS (everyone can use the overnight parking lot areas by paying the \$3/hour fee). Property owners are also eligible to receive parking passes with a valid driver's license and vehicle registration.
 - 2024 Resident Parking passes are available in-person at City Hall or on-line at the City's website, www.madeirabeachfl.gov. Please remember your driver's license and vehicle registration must be presented and must be valid.
- 2. **VISITOR PARKING** is available at all City of Madeira Beach lots and the John's Pass Boardwalk & Village on-street spaces and the lot adjacent to the VFW (entrance off 129th Ave E) by paying the hourly rate of \$3 (may pay using the ParkMobile app or at a kiosk/meter located at each lot). Overnight parking is only allowed at City of Madeira Beach lots located from 130th Ave to 136th Ave (entrances off Gulf Blvd) not allowed at the John's Pass Parking lot and the Archibald Park Parking lot by paying the \$3/hr rate (available for up to 7 days).
- 3. Please keep in mind, particularly visitors, that there are other privately-run/managed parking lots throughout our City that typically charge \$4-\$8/hour as well as the occasional \$20 \$45 full day rate/charge. These lots are NOT owned/managed/enforced by the City of Madeira Beach.
- 4. To alleviate various residential street congestion due to construction sites, we will be issuing parking permits to construction workers, contractors/sub-contractors, and related vehicles/trucks to ensure they park correctly, mainly not blocking any streets (particularly for emergency vehicle access). Information is on our City website under Parking.

Commissioner District 1-Two-Year Term - \$7,500 Commissioner District 2-Two-Year Term - \$7,500 (Madeira Beach Charter Section 2.2(B) and Ordinance 2023-23)

During the candidate qualifying period held from noon on Monday, December 4, 2023 to noon on Friday, December 15, 2023, one candidate qualified for Commissioner District 1 and one candidate qualified for Commissioner District 2.

The Commissioner District 1 and Commissioner District 2 will not appear on the March 19, 2024 election ballot. David Tagliarini will serve as the elected Commissioner for District 1 and Ray Kerr will serve as the elected Commissioner for District 2.

Induction of the above two will occur at 5 pm on Wed, March 27, 2024, at the City Hall Commission Chambers.

On march 19, 2024, there will also be one BALLOT QUESTION.

We ended a very successful 2023 that began with a new recycling company and processes that greatly improved and increased residential recycling with over 75% of all materials collected eligible to be recycled; numerous beautification improvements at our pocket parks, various medians on 150th Ave, and John's Pass Village; enhanced on-line services accessibility in Parking, Building Permits, and Community Development; resurfaced parking lots near John's Pass Village; and over-all enhancements in City equipment, resources, and personnel. TIME TO BEGIN PREPARING FOR THE NEXT STORM SEASON

FEMA- January Plan



After an emergency, you may need to survive on your own for several days. Being prepared means having your own <u>food</u>, <u>water</u> and other <u>supplies</u> to last for several days. A disaster supplies kit is a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency.



Make sure your emergency kit is stocked with the items on the checklist below. <u>Download a printable version</u> to take with you to the store. Once you take a look at the basic items consider what <u>unique needs</u> your family might have, such as supplies for pets or seniors.

Basic Disaster Supplies Kit

To assemble your kit store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins or a duffel bag.

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

✓ Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)
 ✓ Food (at least a several-day supply of non-perishable food)
 ✓ Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
 ✓ Flashlight
 ✓ First aid kit
 ✓ Extra batteries
 ✓ Whistle (to signal for help)
 ✓ Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
 ✓ Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)

Maintaining Your Kit:

After assembling your kit remember to maintain it so it's ready when needed:

- Keep canned food in a cool, dry place.
- Store boxed food in tightly closed plastic or metal containers.
- Replace expired items as needed.
- Re-think your needs every year and update your kit as your family's needs change.

Kit Storage Locations

Since you do not know where you will be when an emergency occurs, prepare supplies for home, work and cars.

- **Home:** Keep this kit in a designated place and have it ready in case you have to leave your home quickly. Make sure all family members know where the kit is kept.
- Work: Be prepared to shelter at work for at least 24 hours. Your work kit should include food, water and other necessities like medicines, as well as comfortable walking shoes, stored in a "grab and go" case.
- Car: In case you are stranded, keep a kit of emergency supplies in your car.

Please continue to stay vigilant and prepared as these winter and spring storms can be even more impactful than storms during hurricane season.

Ready Pinellas Emergency Planning Mobile App

Introducing the new and improved Ready Pinellas mobile app!

Ready Pinellas is designed to help residents prepare themselves and their families before, during and after a storm. It is available for free download on the Apple <u>App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u> store.

Note: Android device users who already had the previous Ready Pinellas app installed will need to download the new app from the Google Play store and remove the old app from their devices. Apple device (iPhone and iPad) users will see the app automatically updated.

The new app features a refreshed design and user experience, additional information and tips, and convenient checklists to make sure you and your family are prepared. App users can use emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan.

As a storm approaches, the app will provide real-time updates to help keep you safe, including detailed information that is available at your fingertips even if you lose internet connectivity. It will provide resources to contact us year-round and during a disaster and give you tips to Stay Informed.



Ready Pinellas App Features

- Know Your Zone: If you have your locator services on, the app will tell you
 if you are in a designated evacuation zone. You can also look up other
 addresses to see if they are in an evacuation zone. Remember:
 Evacuation zones were updated for the 2022 hurricane season, so you
 may have a new zone. When a storm is approaching, it will tell you if
 Pinellas County is in the 5-day or 3-day cone and if an evacuation order
 has been issued.
- Make a Plan: Use our emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan that you can share. You can take pictures of items for your home inventory.
- Push Notifications: Through the app, you will receive informational and emergency notifications from Pinellas County Emergency Management, the National Weather Service and <u>Alert Pinellas</u>.
- <u>Special Needs</u>: You can learn more about special needs assistance, which
 is intended for those who need transportation or require minimal medical
 assistance while seeking public shelter. You can register from the app.
- <u>Preparedness Tips</u>: Learn how to prepare your family, pets, home, condo, mobile home, boat and more.
- Safety Tips: Find information on What to Do Now before, during, and after an event. Learn about year-round preparedness, how to clean up after a flood or food safety if power has been out.
- · Report Damages after a storm has hit Pinellas County.

Residents can obtain up to 3 RESIDENT PARKING PASSES at no charge, that allow residents to park in any City of Madeira Beach lot while the lot is open as well as on streets that allow resident parking. No overnight parking is allowed at any City lot using the RESIDENT PARKING PASS (everyone can use the overnight parking lot areas by paying the \$3/hour fee). Property owners are also eligible to receive parking passes with a valid driver's license and vehicle registration.
 - 2024 Resident Parking passes are available in-person at City Hall or on-line at the City's website, www.madeirabeachfl.gov. Please remember your driver's license and vehicle registration must be presented and must be valid.
- 2. **VISITOR PARKING** is available at all City of Madeira Beach lots and the John's Pass Boardwalk & Village on-street spaces and the lot adjacent to the VFW (entrance off 129th Ave E) by paying the hourly rate of \$3 (may pay using the ParkMobile app or at a kiosk/meter located at each lot). Overnight parking is only allowed at City of Madeira Beach lots located from 130th Ave to 136th Ave (entrances off Gulf Blvd) not allowed at the John's Pass Parking lot and the Archibald Park Parking lot by paying the \$3/hr rate (available for up to 7 days).
- 3. Please keep in mind, particularly visitors, that there are other privately-run/managed parking lots throughout our City that typically charge \$4-\$8/hour as well as the occasional \$20 \$45 full day rate/charge. These lots are NOT owned/managed/enforced by the City of Madeira Beach.
- 4. To alleviate various residential street congestion due to construction sites, we will be issuing parking permits to construction workers, contractors/sub-contractors, and related vehicles/trucks to ensure they park correctly, mainly not blocking any streets (particularly for emergency vehicle access). MARINA

On March 23rd the City of Madeira Beach and the Municipal Marina will hold the 13th Annual Great American Grunt Hunt. This unique event is special to Madeira Beach because it incorporates the traditional fishing vibe of the city along with the involvement of young and inexperienced anglers to enjoy a Fishing Tournament that they can compete in. The idea was to get the whole Family involved, from you 80-year-old grandparent to your 8-year-old grandchildren. The White Grunt is the perfect species for such an occasion. White Grunts are one of our most predominant reef fish on the Gulf coast and can be caught on almost any type of structure in depths ranging from 10 to 100 feet of water. Grunts are not picky eaters but seem to prefer baits like cut squid, threadfins, and live or frozen shrimp. Many different rigs can be used, but it seems that most of the charter boats prefer a multiple hook "chicken rig" or a knocker rig with a 2oz lead.

Youth anglers 14 years and younger are available to enter in both overall and youth divisions. For anglers looking for more of a challenge we have added a hook and line only Hogfish division. This part of the tournament is optional for \$25 and the top three anglers are eligible for prize money. Probably the star of the show is our Community Fish Fry. With loads of fresh fish available we offer everyone an awesome fish fry dinner with fresh fish, fries, and slaw for only \$15 a plate. The food is expertly prepared by Snapper's restaurant, and we have never let anyone go home hungry. The Captains Party will have a huge raffle, 50/50, food, tournament apparel, registration, and of course some adult beverages. Look forward to seeing you there!

We will be moving forward this month with the addition of a Digital Information Sign at the Marina, along 150th Avenue. This project went out to bid in November and we have selected the low bid option of i2 Visual, Inc. The project upon completion will help modernize the existing sign and help spread important information about the City to our residents and visitors. We will hopefully be starting this project very soon and have it completed by springtime.

We wish Mr. Buncic the best of luck and appreciate everything he has done for us in his 2+ years of service. I am happy to promote Colton Carier into the full time Marina Attendant Position. The transition has been quite smooth as Mr. Carier has several years experience at the Marina and its customers. The Marina is taking applications for a part-time Marina Attendant now, and we hope to fill the position soon.
