5. Accessibility Study

Showers shared feedback from the Oakland County ARC Accessibility study. Between 60-70 people responded, with 3 from Madison Heights. Generally, participants responded that the Oakland County cities they visit have average rating for accessible services but the most often mentioned areas of interest were in Transportation and Recreation. Troy and Rochester Hills were highest rated.

Motion made by Showers to create an Accessibility Survey based specific to Madison Heights based on the Oakland County Arc model. Seconded by Brown. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by Brown to create a subcommittee made up of Showers, Strunk, and Hames to plan an adaptive game night social program to take place in July at the Library. Seconded by Showers. Motion passed unanimously.

MICHLUG, founded in 2000, is a club of passionate LEGO fans that enjoy exhibiting their creations for public enjoyment.

We offer many different options which can be tailored to your specific needs:

- **1)** City Exhibit: The classic way we started 10" x 10" Modular sections of roads and buildings that can be arranged to fit the desired area. Trains can also be provided.
- **2)** MOC Table: My Own Creations aka MOCs, is a catch-all term for any creation from a LEGO builder. Sculptures, Spaceships, and posible figures are just some of the MOCs MICHLUG has exhibited before. Offerings are subject to the MICHLUG members participating in the event.
- **3)** Play table: We provide a large pile of parts and let the attendees create and play. We do offer attendees the option to buy something they have made, if permitted by the venue.
- **4)** Sales table: One of our most popular attractions, the sales table often offers bulk LEGO and buildable minifigs for attendees to buy.
- **5)** Bespoke exhibit: If the aforementioned does not meet aspirations you have, a custom exhibit may be possible and in-depth discussion is required to properly understand if your needs can be met.

In all circumstances:

- A) We need to know if power will be provided, as items like trains can be power-dependent.
- **B)** We need to know if tables will be provided (and what size they are) or if we will need to bring our own.
- **C)** We need to understand the security of the environment, such as security personnel, barriers, and the ability to secure the location when members are off-site (such as a multi-day show). At least one member will be present during the open hours of the show, but in the case of multi-day shows, we all leave after close and come back early the following day, before the public is let in.
