Councilor Wright stated that the basement waterproofing project at City Hall was approved, as was the 2024 Budget resolution, and that Council has gone to a consent agenda format.

Councilman Fleming asked about parking at the Police Department and whether it would be available or not during construction. Ms. Parker and Mr. Ballantine reminded him about the bump out for the travel busses and assured him that there would be parking during all phases of the project.

Councilman Fleming stated that Mike Salley is the Grand Marshal for the Memorial Parade this year. The parade route will start at Wilkinson School, travel to 11 Mile and end at the high school with a ceremony on the football field.

Councilman Fleming stated that Police Chief Corey Haines will be retiring June 30, 2023.

Happy 40th birthday to Sean Ballantine. Sean was officially promoted to DPS Director. The city is currently looking internally to back fill the positions that need to be filled in DPS. Mr. Ballantine wished to publicly thank the Women's Club for the gift baskets they dropped off for National Public Works Week. Mr. Ballantine will be off May 19 through 30.
