## **Call to Order:**

Chairperson Rosalie Gann called the Emergency Preparedness meeting to order at 4:00pm.

## **Welcome, Introductions & Announcements:**

Chairperson Gann welcomed attendees to the meeting and outlined the meeting's agenda.

## **Approval of Minutes:**

Motion to approve the July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Emergency Preparedness Committee Meeting minutes was moved by Doug Dicharry and seconded by Cy Humphreys. The July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Emergency Preparedness Committee Meeting minutes were approved as written.

## **Medina Updates:**

Captain Gidlof provided an update on the state of the city, to include a review of the new public safety camera system and an overview on the recent increase in property crimes. The police department community publications will be shifting to fall/winter safety tips and holiday safety recommendations.

## Presentation – Carl Lunak, City of Bellevue Emergency Manager:

- Specializes in coordination of emergency services, Public Works, transportation, etc.
- CERT is a valuable program for emergency preparedness, highly recommended for all community members
- Trees & vegetation can pose a wildfire hazard during hot and dry summers, especially when near residences and buildings

- New homes are consistently being built with integrated fire suppression systems
- Evergreen vegetation tends to hold more moisture over drier vegetation and are a stronger deterrent to wildfire danger
- Provided resources with information on preventing fire from reaching residences (vegetation management, non-igniting building materials, etc.)
- Familiarize yourself with the operation of fire extinguishers, especially inside your home
- Training announcements will be extended to the City of Medina when available through the City of Bellevue Office of Emergency Management
- Wildlife Urban Interface Plan (WUIP) City of Bellevue program that is a plan with how to deal with fires that come from wildland areas into more urban areas
- City of Bellevue Office of Emergency Management partners well with private and public schools in and around the Bellevue area with fire inspections, training offerings, and resource provisions
- Generators
  - o Gas-powered portable generators are versatile and convenient, but require fuel storage at home
  - O Natural gas/propane generators can be convenient, especially with natural gas supply to a residence. However, it can be more cumbersome to start up in the event of a power outage.
  - o Be cognizant of carbon monoxide gas poisoning from generator exhaust
- City of Bellevue completed an emergency shelter plan for major natural disasters for displaced community members

#### **Roundtable:**

- In response to a recent earthquake in the northern Puget Sound area, the Seattle Times published emergency preparedness links for the public to utilize.
- Discussion on the Medina Days and Seafair events:
  - Significant public turnout
  - Lots of pamphlets and giveaways provided to community members and public
- Radio update:
  - Cy Humphreys and Captain Gidlof will be working on an inventory and potential upgrade to the community radio inventory.
  - o Group maintains ties with the Bellevue radio group
  - o The repeater seems to be functioning properly

### **Upcoming Events:**

- Halloween is only a couple of weeks away; E-lert recommended for neighborhood safety.
- October 19<sup>th</sup> at 10:19am is the WA Great Shakeout event. There will be no community radio exercise this year.
- Shredder Day/Drug Take-back/E-recycling community event to be held at Medina Park on Saturday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023.
