## <u>Proclamation Recognizing April 2023 as Alcohol Awareness Month in the Township of</u> <u>Middletown</u>

WHEREAS: Alcohol is the most commonly used addictive substance in the United States. Excessive drinking is responsible for more than 95,000 deaths in our nation each year, approximately 3,500 of those deaths being among underage youth; and **WHEREAS:** Young people who begin drinking before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who begin drinking at age 21; and

**WHEREAS:** The typical American will see 100,000 beer commercials before they turn 18; and

- **WHEREAS:** Kids who drink are more likely to be victims of violent crime, involved in alcohol-related traffic crashes, and have serious school-related problems; and
- **WHEREAS:** A supportive family environment is associated with lowered rates of alcohol use in adolescents. Consistent and sustained parental attitudes can influence a child's decision about whether to use alcohol and drugs; and
- **WHEREAS:** Kids who have conversations with their parents and learn a lot about the dangers of alcohol and drug use are 50% less likely to use alcohol and drugs than those who don't have such conversations. Now,
- **THEREFORE:** I, Mayor Tony Perry and the Middletown Township Committee, join the Middletown Municipal Alliance and Crossroads at the Lincroft Annex in proclaiming April 2023 **Alcohol Awareness Month** in Middletown Township. - **WHEREAS:** The OASIS tlc philosophy embraces human beings for their interconnectedness to each other and all living things. Its centers are set up to foster interdependence and social connectedness to better the quality of life of adults on the autism spectrum and with autism. Now,
- **THEREFORE:** I, Mayor Tony Perry and the Middletown Township Committee do hereby proclaim April 2023 as **Autism Awareness Month** in the Township of Middletown.
