Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as Amended

City of Mills will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income housing as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.496a(b)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years of the commencement of the demolition or rehabilitation relating to conversion. Before obligating or expending funds that will directly result in such demolition or conversion, City of Mills will make public and submit to the Wyoming Community Development Authority the following information in writing:

- 1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
- 2. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
- 4. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units;
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units; and
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of initial occupancy.

City of Mills will provide relocation assistance, as described in 570.496a(b)(2), to each low/moderate-income household displaced by the demolition of housing or by the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities. Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, City of Mills will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

"Activities that will directly or indirectly result in the displacement or relocation of low-tomoderate income citizens will not be funded with CDBG funds."

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-37

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SELF-ASSESSMENT FIRE INSPECTION PROGRAM FOR THE CITY OF MILLS, WYOMING

WHEREAS, Businesses operating within the City of Mills, Wyoming are required pursuant to Title 5 of the City Code to have business licenses; and

WHEREAS, Business licenses must be renewed annually; and

WHEREAS, Title 5 requires that operators of businesses, as part of obtaining their annual business license, must cooperate and comply with an inspecting officer from the City of Mills regarding certain inspections, including having an annual fire inspection administered by the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, The Fire Chief for the City of Mill has worked on a method of expediting and facilitating meaningful fire inspections and has determined that for certain businesses this requirement would be best met through a self-assessment program utilizing a form developed by the Fire Department which would be filled out by the business and forwarded to the Fire Department, which would review the same, with the Fire Department following up if there was a need to do so; and

WHEREAS, A properly Self-Assessment Fire Inspection ("SAFI") program would aid in the prevention of accidental fires by alerting the business owner on areas that the Fire Department regards as presenting a fire danger; and

WHEREAS, adopting a SAFI program for appropriate small businesses would streamline the business renewal purpose and will still provide for public and workforce safety; and

WHEREAS, An initial Self-Assessment Fire Inspection Checklist has been developed by the Fire Department and reviewed by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Self-Assessment Fire Inspection program is not proposed to apply to businesses that are places of assembly, businesses that have a sprinkler system or fire alarm panel, the same being businesses that are required to have outside companies inspect their premises once a year, places that use or store hazardous chemicals or products, or places that employ more than ten (10) persons.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Mills, Wyoming, hereby resolves as follows:

- a. The City of Mills shall adopts a Self-Assessment Fire Inspection Program, as developed by Fire Chief of the City of Mills, for certain small business owners who may elect to conduct self-analysis on their business premises in Mills and forward the result of the same on a checklist sheet that has been developed by the City of Mills and which may be updated or amended from time to time.
- b. The SAFI program shall not apply to places of assembly, businesses that have a sprinkler system of fire alarm panel, places that use or store hazardous chemicals or products, or places that employ more than ten (10) persons.
- c. The SAFI assessment form shall be mailed out on a timely basis, with the same being no less than 60 days prior to the expiration of the business license and shall be required to submitted to the Fire Department no less than 30 days prior to the expiration of the business license.
- d. The SAFI program shall go into effect on January 1, 2022.
