City Council Regular & Board of Adjustment Meeting MINUTES

May 9, 2023, at 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Byron Sanford called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor, Byron Sanford called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

INVOCATION

Mayor Pro Tem, T.J. Wilkerson provided the Invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO FLAGS

ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. Recognition of outgoing Councilmember TJ Wilkerson.

Mayor Byron Sanford presented Councilmember TJ Wilkerson with a plaque and flag in recognition of his dedication and service to the City of Montgomery during his term on City Council.

2. <u>Presentation of Proclamation by Mayor designating the week of May 21-27, 2023 as "National Public Works Week".</u>

Mayor Byron Sanford presented Eric Standifer of Public Works a proclamation in recognition of Public Works First Responders Week.

VISITOR/CITIZENS FORUM:

Ms. Sara Countryman requested that she discuss her concerns at the time of the item #6 being presented.

CONSENT AGENDA:

- 3. Approval of the following:
 - (a) revised City Council meeting minutes of 04-11-2023.
 - (b) City Council and Board of Adjustment meeting minutes 04-25-2023.

Councilmember Carol Langley moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Councilmember Cheryl Fox seconded the motion. **Motion Passed (5-0).**

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION:

3. Presentation of the Annual Financial Report and Audit from Belt Harris Pechachek, LLLP.

Ms. Darla Dear, Auditor presented to Council the City's Financial Audit results. She began by thanking Nici, Dave and Gary for all of their assistance in providing the documentation that had been requested in order to complete the audit.

She addressed the council and instructed them to review page 1. As this is the "opinion page" and out of the entire packet is the most important page. The Auditors issued the city with an "unmodified opinion" which is a great opinion. She reviewed pages 24 and 25 which was the revenue and expenditure and stated the City had an ending fund balance of \$2,5154 million which is an excellent job. Most government entities should be looking to keep a minimum of 25% in the fund balance to cover three months of operating expenses, the city is running at 38%.

She stated that on Page 67 you can see that the city came in under budget by \$446,000.00.

Ms. Dear concluded her presentation and requested any questions from the council.

Council did not ask any questions.

4. Consideration and possible action by the City Council acting as the Zoning Board of Adjustment on a revised variance request to Section 98-122 of the City Code of Ordinances related to rear yard requirements for 128 Dina Lane.

Mr. Dave McCorquodale informed the council that this item is a revised request, the applicant has complied with the conditional recommendations from Planning & Zoning and has supplied a drainage plan, and there is a 5 ft. encroachment. Staff are recommending approval of the variance for a 5ft encroachment, and no raised beds and or decking.

Councilmember Casey Olson moved to approve the variance as presented along with the conditions of the submitted drainage plan and no raised beds or decking. Councilmember Cheryl Fox seconded the motion. Motion Passed (5-0).

5. Receive the Final Report from the Planning & Zoning Commission on a rezoning request for 14640 Liberty Street, Montgomery, Texas from R1-Single Family Residential to B-Commercial as submitted by Evan Ballew and convene into a Public Hearing for the purpose of allowing interested parties to be heard.

Mr. Dave McCorquodale presented this item and informed the council that the recommendation of the Planning & Zoning Commission is not to rezone the property as requested. Tonight, is the Public Hearing which is a legal requirement for any rezoning request.

Mayor Byron Sanford opened the public hearing at: 6:22 P.M.

**Audio from the podium is at time distorted

<u>Sara Countryman, resident</u> stated that she had been doing her research last week and wanted to bring a few things to light. The State Law in the State of Texas says that the Specific Use Permit (SUP) is not a tool for circumventing the table of uses. Currently, today the house is zoned R = Residential and that means it is residential as someone should be living in that house, continues as R zoning and to be considered for Special Use there has to be a requirement such as 'home occupation', for that.

She went on to state that our city codes have those standards spelled out and, in the Planning & Zoning meeting, although they voted "no" staff did not go through the items ("which I have here") A through G of what the requirements are, the homeowner said he wanted to do just inside and outside paint and add parking. According to item G on the Code of Ordinances those (*audio distorted*) done.

Ms. Countryman continued that he (homeowner) wasn't advised differently, and she doesn't know if staff is aware or fully understands what is being done and that the conditions are of home occupancy and what the conditions are for a special use permit. Spot Zoning is not in our City Code and not like Harris County where you can have residential, industrial and convert from residential to commercial. That area according to the current Adopted 2018 Zoning map is zoned residential. She noticed in the P&Z packets there was a map and Merriam Walker bought it up as well it shows it to be "Future Commercial", that has never been and is a "pie in the sky" idea by the former administrator Jack Yates in 2015, it has never been adopted. The fact that was bought up as a possibility makes her feel like the staff is hoodwinking or directing people to do something as he thinks that the council will approve a Special Use Permit. She wonders if we are advising correctly.

Ms. Countryman went on to add that P&Z accepted this zoning in 2018 on a 9/24/2018 meeting item no. 6, on page 74 there is a map, that's the map that should have been presented to the owner and as she has mentioned some of these homes don't have titles and deeds, so turning them into commercial property is a pipe dream.

Julie Dennison, resident

stated that she is against the property being zoned commercial as firstly its in her back yard and they purchased their home as a forever home. The house in question was built as a home and that is the way it needs to stay. If you let this gentleman, go commercial in it, then the next one and next one after that and you will end up with a strip there which will sit vacant and its going to cause rats, dumpsters would be placed there and who knows what types of businesses would go in the other places.

Ms. Dennison continued by stating that when they purchased their home, they were told it was residential and that it would all stay residential, she understands there are deed problems but feels that could all be resolved pretty easily. She reiterated that she is against this commercial application.

She went on to say she is sorry the gentleman has put a lot of money into the place, it was built as a home, he knew it was a home and he should have checked everything out before he placed his business in there to start with. She wants it to remain residential as it could ruin their property values.

Evan Bellew, property owner introduced himself and stated he had been here in town for 25 years, and he had opportunities to take his business to other local cities, and recognizes that is no one's problem but his, but he did want to have his business where he lives, although not "in" but right on the outside and wants to continue to contribute to the city as he has previously worked at the Montgomery Fire Department and is now at the Magnolia Fire Department.

Mr. Bellew stated he truly wanted a place for his business to go in and based on the city's future land use plan maps which he found on his own accord and researched through the city's website, he had communicated with staff on other properties he has which has been impacted by the city's

infrastructure, staff have been very helpful on that, he has tried to follow due process and whatever decisions are made here today, he is open to any available options.

Councilmember Carol Langley inquired if Mr. Bellew had purchased the property.

Mr. Bellew confirmed that he had.

Mayor Sanford closed the public hearing at 6:29 P.M.

Councilmember Casey Olson stated he has a question on the zoning maps that he has in front of him.

Mr. McCorquodale inquired if he has questions about the differences between the zoning map and future land use map.

Councilmember Casey Olson stated that he has seen a future land use plan, but it was his understanding that it was never adopted.

Mr. McCorquodale responded that the P&Z over the course of ten (10) months in 2017 reviewed the future land use plan with the City Administrator at that time and the City Engineers. In July of that year, they met for a joint workshop (P&Z and City Council) they get all the way to the end and in September/October and the attorneys advised that they were unable to locate in records a current comprehensive plan on file, therefore the city cannot formally adopt the future land use plan. Everyone agrees it is a tool that the city wants to look to the future with.

Mr. McCorquodale continued that in October at the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting Bill Simpson moved to approve the future land use plan and recommended approval of it to City Council, amended the motion to include it with any future comprehensive plan updates that may occur, it was a unanimous vote and Ms. Carol was one of them.

He added that is the history and it is an unofficial guide and as he told the owner Mr. Bellew, he cannot tell you this is what they are for sure going to do, but it is a tool that gives us a little bit of a view. Again, it wasn't formally adopted and wasn't included in the comprehensive plan, the city spent the better part of a year with staff and consultants developing it. He concluded that it should be looked at. He feels it could use an update, it certainly wasn't a pipe dream or never saw the light day kind of thing.

Councilmember Patricia Easley inquired if it had gone through the rezoning process, with notification of the neighbors?

Mr. McCorquodale responded that it had and published the notice in the paper and said that he is there to do one main thing a rezone applicant in our city, that we as a city follow state law and the applicant has met all the requirements on the way to you.

Councilmember TJ Wilkerson inquired that if it is zoned commercial would it affect the neighbors tax base.

Mr. McCorquodale responded that it will not, he had spoken with the County several years ago when he took on a rezoning project when he first joined staff. They advised him that if land is vacant, the county is going to use our zoning, so if you a vacant piece of property zoned commercial that is the way you are going to be taxed Vacant being no structure on the land.

Therefore, with this it would not affect the surrounding properties.

Councilmember Patricia Easley inquired if they had considered a Special Use Permit (SUP).

Mr. McCorquodale responded that he had discussed that at planning and zoning and ran it by the attorneys and was advised it certainly is a tool available to use, that would allow you to change the use to professional only, or some type of office space, and if you wanted any parking restrictions, landscaping etc. then an SUP would do that.

Councilmember Patricia Easley stated that she felt part of the concern if and when he sells the property and as it is then zoned commercial how could the city prevent a service station going in.

That is why P&Z couldn't ultimately approve it to rezone commercial as it could then be any business within the permitted uses.

Alan Petrov, City Attorney reminded council that they are not discussing an SUP this evening, this is a question do you approve a rezoning request to commercial.

Councilmember Cheryl Fox inquired if he had received any other resident's opposition.

Mr. McCorquodale responded that he had been provided with notice from a relation of a resident, who was serving in the military and was not in favor of the rezone request.

Councilmember Carol Langley inquired what size is the property.

Mr. Bellew responded that it is 200 ft long and 125 ft wide. He also stated that after participating in the rezoning process it is questionable that on the application there is a box that asks does this meet the city's future land use plan. Somewhat confusing. To address Councilmember Wilkerson's point, the property is already appraised at half a million dollars, the buffalos' springs area is what is driving it up. He concluded by stating that if he didn't care for the neighbors he wouldn't be there.

Councilmember Carol Langley stated that she knows in her mind that commercial on 149 will come someday, is this the day? Probably not. There are a lot of problems in that area with regard to titles.

Councilmember Carol Langley moved to accept the final report as presented. Councilmember Cheryl Fox second the motion. **Motion Passed (5-0).**

7. Consideration and possible action on AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS AMENDING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATIONS AS DEFINED IN THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 98, "ZONING," FOR A 0.57-ACRE TRACT SITUATED IN THE JOHN CORNER SURVEY, ABSTRACT NUMBER 8, TRACT 16, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TEXAS COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS A PORTION OF 14640 LIBERTY STREET, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TEXAS FROM "R-1" SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT, AS FOUND ON THE CITY'S OFFICIAL ZONING MAP TO "B" COMMERCIAL ZONING DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION; AND TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE UPON PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION.

Mr. Dave McCorquodale informed the council that this is the ordinance which relates to item No:6 and staff is recommending to not approve or move to deny it.

Councilmember Casey Olson moved to deny the ordinance for the rezoning application. Councilmember Carol Langley seconded the motion. **Motion Passed (5-0).**

Councilmember Cheryl Fox moved to approve the ordinance as presented. Councilmember Patricia Easley seconded the motion. **Motion Approved (4-0).**

2. Consideration and possible action on AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS, AMENDING ITS MUNICIPAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023; APPROPRIATING THE VARIOUS AMOUNTS HEREIN, AS ATTACHED IN EXHIBIT A; CONTAINING FINDINGS AND A TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS ACT CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Gary Palmer, City Administrator presented this item. He informed the Council that there was an unanticipated vacancy in the Finance Office and while staff are holding things together the city needs help. He placed an advertisement for the position of Finance Manager after taking the opportunity to review and restructure the office within Finance. He has also reached out to SGR to assist with interim help while the city seeks a qualified candidate. The budget amendment is to facilitate that process as there aren't enough funds to cover the contract.

Councilmember Casey Olson inquired about the \$46,000.

Mr. Palmer responded that it is for approximately three months of interim help, covering all functions of the Finance Office, to include travel and housing. He added that this is for on-call service, and the contract can be terminated with fourteen (14) days' notice. The plan is to have a parallel process to get immediate help and continue the recruitment process.

Councilmember Casey Olson stated that for that amount of money the city could hire a good firm.

Mr. Palmer stated that the market for finance help is now hot, so this is the wisest move.

Councilmember Patricia Easley moved to approve the Budget Amendment #3 as presented and not to exceed \$46,000. Councilmember Cheryl Fox seconded the motion. Motion Passed (4-0).

3. Consider Approval of an Agreement for Professional Services with Strategic Government Resources (SGR)

Mr. Palmer advised the Council that this is the contract for which they just approved the budget amendment. Legal has reviewed it and there are no issues. Staff is recommending approval.

Councilmember Casey Olson moved to authorize the City Administrator to execute the professional services agreement with SGR for Interim Finance Director to not exceed \$46,000. Councilmember Patricia Easley seconded the motion. **Motion Passed (4-0).**

Councilmember Cheryl Fox moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilmember Casey Olson seconded the motion. **Motion Passed (4-0).**

Discussion

Mr. Steve Hari of H-Wines has expanded his venture within the City of Montgomery, specifically downtown, and has opened a new business, H-Bistrot at 401 College Street, Montgomery. This business will serve food and mixed beverages.

Mr. Hari talked with staff regarding this idea in early January and began the steps required for obtaining a Texas Alcoholic Beverage Permit for the TABC, while waiting planning and development approval. The City Secretary must sign the TABC application as well as the Comptroller and County agencies in order to obtain the TABC approval.

City Code of Ordinances states that the City cannot approve and or issue a City Alcoholic Beverage Permit until the TABC has issued their license and the applicant must come before City Council for final approval.

Mr. Hari submitted his City application to the City Secretary on January 16, 2023. No fee was issued or taken as the TABC had not completed their application process. Mr. Hari was to provide the City with his TABC license in order for the City Secretary to issue the City Permit.

The City was informed that H-Bistrot was open and operating without the City Permit. Upon research it was discovered that TABC issued their license 03-23-2023 for Mixed Beverage Onsite Consumption.

City of Montgomery Code Enforcement was informed of the situation, discussed with Mr. Hari, and let him know that he should attend City Council meeting for his City Approval.

FOR ON-PREMISES ALCOHOL DISTRIBUTION ESTABLISHMENTS; REGULATING BEER ESTABLISHMENT PERSONNEL; DELINEATING UNLAWFUL CONDUCT ON PREMISES WHERE BEER OR WINE IS SOLD; PROHIBITING SALE OF ALCOHOL TO INTOXICATED PERSONS; PROHIBITING SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO MINORS; PROHIBITING THE EMPLOYMENT OF ANYONE UNDER THE AGE OF TWENTY-ONE (21) TO SELL ALCOHOL; PROHIBITING PURCHASE AND POSSESSION OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL BY MINORS; PROHIBITING CONSUMPTION ON A STREET, SIDEWALK, OR ALLEY, OR CEMETERY; PROHIBITING POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL IN PARKS BETWEEN CERTAIN HOURS; PROHIBITING POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL AT SCHOOL ATHLETIC EVENTS: DESCRIBING THE PENALTY FOR DRUNKENESS AND VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATE; AND APPLICABILITY OF THE TEXAS ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CODE.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Sec. 1. Definitions.

Unless otherwise provided, the words and phrases used in this ordinance shall have the same meanings as ascribed to them by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code.

Sec. 2. License to manufacture, sell, distribute, etc.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, brew, distill, sell or distribute any wine, beer, liquor or other alcoholic beverage within the city, or engage in any other activity for which a license or permit is required by the Texas Liquor Control Act, without first obtaining a license so to do from the city. The annual fee for each such license shall be an amount equal to one-half (1/2) the fee charged by the state for a license or permit to engage in a similar activity. Such fee shall be paid to the tax collector and the tax collector shall provide suitable and proper blanks for issuing receipts therefore referred and shall keep a duplicate copy of all license receipts issued as part of the records of office. All license receipts issued under the terms of this section shall terminate one year from the date of issuance and no license receipt shall be issued covering a longer term than one year.
- (b) No applicant shall be granted a license under this section who has not first been licensed by the county and State of Texas and who fails to present satisfactory evidence of the same.

- (c) No license shall be issued under this section if the applicant shall owe any delinquent taxes to the city. The word "applicant" shall include each member of a partnership or association and all officers and the owner of the majority of the corporate stock of a corporation and the manager of the business for a corporation.
- (d) It shall be unlawful for any person licensed to sell beer, liquor or wine at retail other than a manufacturer or distributor to use or display a license or to exercise any privilege granted by a license except at the place, address, premises and location for which the license is granted.

State Law Reference--Local Fee Authorized, V.T.C.A., Alcoholic Beverage Code, Sec. 11.38.

Sec. 3. Sales Categories

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell any type of alcoholic beverage, either for on-premises or off-premises consumption, except where such sale is permitted by ordinances of the city.
- (b) The types of categories for the sale of alcoholic beverages are hereby established as follows:
 - (1) Category A--Off-premises consumption sale of all alcoholic beverages--package store.
 - (2) Category B--Off-premises consumption sale of wine, beer or ale.
 - (3) Category C--Off-premises consumption sale of beer.
 - (4) Category D--On-premises consumption sale of beer and wine--restaurant or cafe, where the sale of beer and wine on the premises would be incidental to the restaurant or cafe business.
 - (5) Category E--On-premises consumption sale of beer-tavern, lounge, or bar--the sale of beer for on-premises consumption being the principal business line.
 - (6) Category F--Warehouse storage of beer, wine, or liquor for distributors--no sale of beer for on or off-premises consumption permitted on the premises.
- (c) All existing businesses heretofore approved by the city council are hereby reclassified according to the above.
- (d) Written application for the sale of alcoholic beverages shall be made on forms provided by the city and filed with the city clerk. Such application shall be signed by the actual lessee or intended operator of the business for which the license is sought. The owner of the property must file a written consent to the application, unless the owner is making the application. Every such application shall contain the following:
 - (1) An adequate legal description of the property for which license is sought, either by lot and block number or by a metes and bounds description.
 - (2) The exact nature of the business to be operated must be fully described.

- (3) A plat of the property must be attached to the application showing the improvements, parking areas, location of signs and other structures on the property and within three hundred (300) feet to scale.
- (4) A description of signs and the hours they will be operated.
- (5) A floor plan of the building in which the business is to be conducted must be attached to the application, showing fixtures, furniture, rest rooms, kitchen and other equipment.
- (6) A statement giving the names, addresses and interests of all persons having a direct or indirect financial interest in the property and the business to be conducted.
- (7) A verified statement must be attached to the application, stating that the building is not within three hundred (300) feet of a church, school or hospital and that the building is in compliance with the requirements of this chapter for separate and adequate toilet facilities for men and women, if used for on-premises consumption of beer, liquor or wine.
- (f) A filing fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) to defray the expenses of processing an application filed under this section must be paid when the application is filed.
 - V.T.C.A. Local Fee Authorized, Sec. 61.36.
 - (g) No application under this section shall be approved:
 - (1) If the applicant or application does not meet all requirements of the ordinances of the city.
 - (2) If the granting of such application shall increase the number of alcoholic beverage establishments to more than five (5) in any one block, a block to be defined as being from intersection to intersection on both sides of the street.
 - (3) If the applicant shall owe any delinquent taxes to the city.
 - (4) If applicant has not already fulfilled all County and State requirements.

As used in this subsection, the term "applicant" shall also mean and include each member of a partnership or association and all officers and the owner or owners of the majority of the corporate stock of a corporation and the manager of such business for a corporation.

(h) After all the requirements for license application under the provisions of this section have been met, a public hearing shall be scheduled by the city clerk at a regular meeting of the city council, at least ten (10) days in advance of written notice to be mailed to all owners of property within two hundred (200) feet of the property in question, informing them of the time and place of holding the public hearing. Such notice shall be mailed to owners as shown on the last approved tax roll of the city. If the application is not approved by the city council, no new application may be filed for a period of one (1) year from the date of the public hearing on the original application, unless the city council shall determine that conditions have so changed that an earlier hearing would be justified.

(i) Uses permitted under any of the categories designated in this section may not be converted to another use, but application for the new use under the provisions applicable must be made as in the case of an original application.

Sec. 4. Sale near church, school or hospital.

The sale of alcoholic beverages by any dealer is prohibited within three hundred (300) feet of any church, public school or public hospital, the measurements to be along the property lines of the street fronts and from front door to front door and in direct line across intersections where they occur. This section shall not apply where the church, school, or hospital is built within three hundred (300) feet of an existing place of business where alcoholic beverages are sold.

State law reference--Authority of city to enact ordinance similar to above section, V.T.C.A., Alcoholic Beverage Code, Sec. 109.33.

Sec. 5. View of interior of sales establishments not to be obstructed.

All establishments selling any alcoholic beverage must be so constructed that the interior of such establishment shall at all times be plainly visible from the front of such establishment, with no curtains or drapes or other obstruction which prevent a clear view of the interior of such establishment.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 104.02.

Sec. 6. Building requirements for on-premises establishments.

No person shall sell beer, liquor or wine at or on any premises within the city for consumption on the premises where sold unless the building housing such business conforms to the following:

- (1) Has not less than six hundred (600) square feet of floor space devoted solely to the retail portion of the operation of such business, exclusive of storage and/or restrooms.
- (2) Complies with the building code.
- (3) Complies with the electric code.
- (4) Complies with the plumbing code.
- (5) Is connected to the city sanitary sewer system for toilet facilities.
- (6) Is connected to the city water system.
- (7) Has adequate flush toilet facilities, with separate facilities for men and women in the building. Outside toilet facilities will not constitute compliance with this requirement.
- (8) Has sufficient lighting and such lighting provides illumination to at least twenty-five (25) footcandles in all areas of the premises where beer, liquor or wine is sold or consumed, according to measurements by an agent of the city.

Sec. 9. Sale to intoxicated persons prohibited.

It shall unlawful for any person to sell any alcoholic beverage to any person who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor, for either on-premises or off-premises consumption.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 101.63

Sec. 10. Sale to minors prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell any alcoholic beverage to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 106.03

Sec. 11. Employment of minors to sell.

It shall be unlawful for any person engaged in the business of selling alcoholic beverages to employ any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to sell, handle, transport or dispense or assist in selling, handling, transporting or dispensing any alcoholic beverage.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 106.09

Sec. 12. Purchase by minors.

It shall be unlawful for any person under twenty-one (21) years of age to purchase any alcoholic beverage.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 106.02

Sec. 13. Possession or consumption by minors.

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twentyone (21) years to possess or to consume any alcoholic beverage in any public place, unless the person under the age of twenty-one (21) years is accompanied by his or her husband or wife, over the age of twenty-one years.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 106.04

Sec. 14. Consumption on street, sidewalk or alley prohibited.

The drinking of any alcoholic beverage on any public street, sidewalk or alley of the city, whether afoot, as a passenger or as an operator of any vehicle, is unlawful and is prohibited. The throwing of any opened container of the type generally used for alcoholic beverages from or out of any vehicle shall be prima facie evidence that the occupant thereof was then and there drinking alcoholic beverages in violation of this section.

Sec. 15. Consumption or possession in cemeteries prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drink or have in his possession any alcoholic beverages within any cemetery located within the corporate limits of the city.

Sec. 7. Regulations for beer establishment personnel.

- (a) No person other than the permittee or licensee shall serve beer, or other drink or food to any customer or patron of a beer establishment unless the person so serving is employed by the permittee or licensee of the beer establishment.
- (b) No person serving beer to any patron or customer of a beer establishment shall receive, as compensation, any part of the price paid by the patron or customer for such beer, nor shall his compensation be dependent on the amount served by him.
- (c) No person shall collect from any customer or patron of a beer establishment, as the price of beer, more than the price paid to the bartender or cashier by the person serving the beer.
- Sec. 8. Unlawful conduct on premises where beer, liquor or wine is sold.

Conduct by any person at a place of business where the sale of beer, liquor or wine at retail is authorized that is lewd, immoral, or offensive to public decency is hereby declared to include but not be limited to the following prohibited acts, and it shall be unlawful for any person engaged in such business, or any agent, servant or employee of such person, to engage in or to permit such conduct on the premises of the retailer:

- The use or the permitting the use of loud, vociferous, obscene, vulgar, indecent or abusive language;
- (2) Exposure of person or permitting any person to expose his person;
- (3) Displaying or permitting any person to display a pistol or other deadly weapon or switch blade knife, in a manner calculated to disturb the inhabitants of such place;
- (4) Solicitation of any person for coins to operate musical instruments or devices;
- (5) Becoming intoxicated on the licensed premises or permitting any intoxicated person to remain on the premises;
- (6) Permitting solicitation of persons for immoral or sexual purposes or relations;
- (7) Failing or refusing to comply with or failing or refusing to maintain the retail premises in accordance with the sanitary or health provisions of the city and county;
- (8) Possession of any narcotic;
- (9) Possession of any equipment used or designed for the use of administering any narcotic;
- (10) Permitting any person to possess on the licensed premises any narcotic or any instrument used for or designed for the use of administering any narcotic.

State law reference--V.T.C.A., Sec. 101.62; Sec. 104.01.

Sec. 16. Consumption in parks prohibited between certain hours.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drink alcoholic beverages of any kind in any public park within the corporate limits of the city between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.

Sec. 17. Possession prohibited at school athletic events.

It shall be unlawful for any person to bring or carry into any enclosure, field or stadium, where athletic events are sponsored or participated in by any public school, any alcoholic beverage or to have any alcoholic beverage in their possession while in or on such enclosure, field or stadium.

Sec. 18. Drunkenness.

Whoever shall get drunk or be found in a state of intoxication in any public place, or at any private house except his own, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 19. Violations of Ordinance.

Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance, or who allows, on premises covered by his license issued under this chapter, any person to do the things prohibited by this Ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) or more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Each day such violation continues shall be a separate offense. Any room, building, structure or place of any kind where alcoholic beverages are sold, bartered, stored, possessed or consumed in violation of this chapter or the Texas Liquor Control Act, or under conditions and circumstances contrary to the purposes of this chapter or the Liquor Control Act is hereby declared to be a common nuisance, and any person who maintains or assists in maintaining or permits the violation of this chapter or the Liquor Control Act shall be guilty of a violation of this chapter. Action may be maintained by the city to abate and enjoin such nuisance.

Sec. 20. Constitutionality.

If the constitutionality of any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this ordinance. It is hereby declared that the remaining parts of this Ordinance would have been ordained and passed had it been known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.

Sec. 21. Effective date.

Whereas, on account of the public safety necessitating the passage of this Ordinance, an emergency is created on behalf of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare necessitating that this Ordinance become effective at once and it is accordingly ordained that the Ordinance become effective immediately upon publication as required by law.

Sec. 22. Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be considered concurrent with or in addition to the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, and where a conflict may be found to exist, the provision of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code shall apply. Applicants for a City of Montgomery Alcoholic Beverage License must comply with all applicable state and county codes and regulations as well as the requirements of this ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-01

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS, AMENDING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 1989-2, DATED FEBRUARY 14, 1989, BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, "LICENSES," SECTIONS 6-25, 6-33 AND 6-34 OF CHAPTER 6, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES," OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE APPLICATION AND RE-APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE CITY; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AFTER PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Montgomery, Texas, by Ordinance No. 1989-2, dated February 14, 1989, as amended, adopted a policy to regulate the sale and licensing of alcoholic beverages in the City pursuant to the Texas Alcoholic Beverages Code; and

WHEREAS, the ordinance is codified in Chapter 6, entitled "Alcoholic Beverages," Article II, "License," of the City of Montgomery Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code (TABC) and Section 33.13 of the TABC Administrative Law describes the process to apply for a license or permit to sell alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the City staff, the City Council desires to amend Sections 6-25, 6-33 and 6-34 of the Code of Ordinances, relating to the approval process

in the City by which an application or re-application to sell alcoholic beverages in the City can be approved;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION I.

RECITALS ADOPTED: The City Council adopts the findings and recitals above as true and correct.

SECTION II.

AMENDMENT TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ORDINANCE. Sections 6-25, 6-33 and 6-35 of Article II, entitled "License," in Chapter 6, "Alcoholic Beverages," of the City Code of Ordinances are hereby amended, such that they read as follows:

Sec. 6-25. - Required; fee; term.

It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, brew, distill, sell or distribute any wine, beer, liquor or other alcoholic beverage within the city, or engage in any other activity for which a license or permit is required by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, without first obtaining a license to do so from the city. The fee for each such license shall be an amount equal to one-half of the fee charged by the state for a license or permit to engage in a similar activity. Such fee shall be paid to the tax collector, and the tax collector shall provide suitable and proper blanks for issuing receipts therefor referred and shall keep a duplicate copy of all license receipts issued as part of the records of office. All license receipts issued under the terms of this section shall terminate two years from the date of issuance, and no license receipt shall be issued covering a longer term than two years.

Sec. 6-33. – Approval of license application by City Council.

After all the requirements for a license application under the provisions of this article have been met as determined by the City Administrator, the application shall be presented to the City Council for approval at a public meeting.

Sec. 6-34. - Conversion to different use.

Uses permitted under any of the categories designated in this article may be converted to another use only with the approval of City Council.

SECTION III.

REPEALING CLAUSE. This amendment to Ordinance No. 1989-2, dated February 14, 1989, as codified in Section 6-57 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Montgomery, Montgomery County, Texas, shall prevail and all other Ordinances in conflict are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

SECTION IV.

SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby but shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION V.

TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS ACT. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was considered was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, of the Texas Government Code.

SECTION VI.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its publication as provided by law.

We received and recommend approval of Change Order No. 4 to the Water Plant No. 3 Improvements contract. This change order includes deductions of unused contract items, quantity adjustments, and a final accounting of the damages to Cooling Tower No. 1. Approval of the change order will result in a \$48,662.93 decrease to the final contract amount, from \$1,028,675.76 to \$980,012.83. As a reminder, the original contract amount was \$996,550.00.

Additionally, we conducted a final inspection of the referenced project on August 3, 2022 and find it to be substantially complete in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. The developer's surety has provided the required maintenance bond for the infrastructure, as included with this letter, and all punch list items have been addressed. Recommendation

Motion to adopt the Resolution supporting the City's application for TxDOT's 2023 Transportation Alternatives Call for Projects.

Discussion

Background

TxDOT offers a grant program for non-roadway mobility projects every two years. Projects can either be physical improvements (e.g., a sidewalk or trail) or planning documents that serve as a guide for future physical projects. The city submitted grant applications in 2021 for two sidewalk projects. While we scored well according to a TxDOT follow up meeting, we were not awarded grant funding for either project. The primary feedback from TxDOT was that the projects were small in scope and did not serve enough community members. Another takeaway was that the projects were not part of a planning document adopted by the city.

Purpose

City staff submitted a Preliminary Application for an <u>Active Transportation Mobility Plan</u> in March for TxDOT's 2023 Call for Projects. The need for the plan is twofold:

- 1. Serve as the guide for staff and council to identify projects and budgets if the city decides to self-fund high-priority projects.
- 2. Increase our competitiveness when applying for mobility grants.

The grant award process is highly competitive. The 2023 Call for Projects received \$1.7 billion in funding requests for an anticipated \$250 million worth of federal funds. In other words, 85% of this year's grant applications will *not* get funded. To get grant funding, an application needs to score every possible point during the grant application review process. 20% of those points are based on whether a proper planning process has been followed and a plan has been adopted that includes the project.

In short, without an adopted plan that identifies proposed projects and illustrates how those projects connect to the rest of the community, we will be at a significant disadvantage and there is a good chance future grant applications will not be funded. An Active Transportation Mobility Plan is the document that meets the city's current needs to pursue mobility grants for non-roadway projects.

TxDOT Transportation Alternatives grants are 80% federally funded with a 20% local match. The budget estimate used in the Preliminary Application is \$120,000 for the development of an Active Transportation Mobility Plan. While that figure may be slightly high, using that as a starting point means the city will need to budget \$24,000 in next year's budget for the Plan.

Where do we get our drinking water?

The source of drinking water used by City of Montgomery is ground water. It comes from the Jasper Aquifer and the Catahoula Aquifer.

Contaminants that may be Present in Source Water

The sources of drinking water (both tap and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:



Dear Mayor and Council:

The following is a brief summary that describes our activities since the April 25, 2023 Council Meeting:

Capital Projects:

1. Water Plant No. 3 Improvements – We received Pay Estimate No. 7 & Final in the amount of \$61,021.74. The final inspection was held on August 3, 2022 and the contractor has addressed all punchlist items. The project is complete, and acceptance of the infrastructure will be addressed as a separate agenda item this month. We are working with City Staff to close out this project with the Texas Water Development Board.

2. GLO Projects

- a. Water Plant No. 3 Generator We received Pay Estimate No. 6 & Final in the amount of \$39,354.71. The contractor has addressed all of the punchlist items addressed during the final walkthrough. As a reminder, the one-year warranty period will end on February 21, 2024. The project is complete, and acceptance of the infrastructure will be addressed as a separate agenda item this month. We are working with Grant Works, Quiddity and City Staff to close out the project with the GLO.
- b. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive Ditch Regrading and Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation As a reminder the one-year warranty period will end on January 11, 2024. We are working with Grant Works, Quiddity and City Staff to close out the project with the GLO.
- **3. 15-Year Infrastructure Plan** We provided a draft of the sanitary sewer analysis to the TORC and plan to present the final analysis at the June 13th Council meeting.
- **4. Old Plantersville Waterline Extension** This project is on hold until further notice.
- **5. Old Plantersville Force Main Extension** This project is on hold until further notice.
- **6.** McCown St. and Caroline St. Waterline Replacement We are continuing with our design, and we expect to be complete in July.

- **7. Downtown Drainage Master Plan** We are continuing with our analysis of existing and proposed conditions, and we expect to be complete in early June.
- **8. Downtown Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation** We received Pay Estimate No. 1 in the amount of \$99,864.00. The contractor has substantially completed the project and we have received and reviewed post-rehabilitation videos to confirm the quality and quantity of repairs completed. We are scheduling a final walkthrough with the contractor.
- 9. 2023 Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation The project was split into two projects to allow bidding and construction of the primary sanitary sewer rehabilitation work to take place without being delayed by TxDOT review. The pipebursting design is nearly complete and will be submitted to TxDOT upon completion. The primary sanitary sewer rehabilitation project began advertising on May 11th. We plan to hold a pre-bid meeting on May 25th and receive bids on June 1st to present at the June 13th Council meeting.
- **10. Lift Station No. 10 Improvements** We are continuing with design and expect to be complete in June 2023.
- **11. Flagship Boulevard Storm Sewer & Pavement Replacement** As a reminder, the contract was awarded to Civil & Environmental Engineering Services, LLC in the amount of \$573,043.50 and 75 calendar days. We held the pre-construction meeting on May 18th and issued the notice to proceed at that time for construction to begin after the school year ends.

Developments:

1. Plan Reviews

- **a.** Town Creek Storage II We did not receive revised plans this month.
- **b.** Pizza Shack Parking Expansion We did not receive a revised plan set this month.
- c. Montgomery Bend (Pulte Group) Section 1 Water, Sanitary and Drainage We received revised plans on April 18th and provided comments on May 18th.
- **d.** Montgomery Bend (Pulte Group) Section 2 Water, Sanitary and Drainage We received plans for review on April 28th and provided comments on May 18th.
- **e.** Lupe Tortilla We received a revised set on February 16th and offered conditional approval contingent upon receipt of the amended plat.
- **f. Lincoln Elementary School (MISD)** We received revised plans on April 24th and provided plan approval on April 28th.
- **g.** Montgomery Elementary School (MISD) We received plans for review on April 25th and provided comments on April 27th. We received revised plans on May 1st and provided plan approval on May 3rd.

- h. Athletic Complex Turf Improvements (MISD) We received plans for review on April 24th and provided comments on May 3rd. We received a revised plan set on May 16th and are continuing with our review.
- i. Home Depot We received plans for review on May 10th and are proceeding with our review.
- j. Texas and Beyond Plaza We received plans on April 18th and provided comments on May 3rd. We have not received a revised plan set.
- **k.** Redbird Meadows Phase 1A Water, Sanitary and Drainage All plan reviews related to the development are on hold until further notice.
- **I. Redbird Meadows MCMUD 215 Lift Station No. 1** All plan reviews related to the development are on hold until further notice.

2. Plat Reviews

- a. Montgomery Brewing Minor Plat We did not receive a revised plat this month.
- **b.** Cornerstone Community Church Development Plat We received a revised plat on April 25th and provided comments on May 11th. We have not received a revised plat.
- c. Shoppes at Montgomery Section 2 Amending Plat We received the amending plat on March 27th and offered no objection. It is our understanding that the plat is being prepared to be sent to the City for final approval.
- **d.** Lonestar Estates Partial Replat We received the partial replat for review on April 17th and provided comments on May 11th. We have not received a revised plat.
- **e. Redbird Meadows Sections 1, 2, and 3 Preliminary Plats** All plat reviews related to the development are on hold until further notice.

3. Ongoing Construction

a. Montgomery Bend (Pulte Group) Mass Grading, Detention, and Offsite Utilities – The contractor is proceeding with construction of the mass grading, detention, and offsite waterline. We are providing periodic inspection services on behalf of the City.

We also received plan revisions on April 18th and provided plan approval on May 3rd.

4. One-Year Warranty Inspections

- **a.** Town Creek Crossing, Section 1 –We held a warranty inspection on March 23rd and the contractor is working to address the remaining punchlist items.
- **b.** Villas of Mia Lago, Section 2 We are continuing to coordinate with the developer to ensure the remaining punch list items are addressed.

General Ongoing Activities:

1. TxDOT:

- **a. FM 1097 & Atkins Creek Drainage Improvements** We received a draft exhibit of the proposed easement locations. We are reviewing the exhibit and will work with City staff to begin the conversation with impacted property owners.
- b. Access Management along SH-105 from Grimes County Line to Shepperd Street—We are continuing to identify potential utility conflicts with the SH 105 improvements. According to TxDOT, the first phase of the project is scheduled to begin in Summer 2025. Construction in Montgomery is included in Phase III of this project.
- c. FM 1097 and Buffalo Springs Drive Traffic Signal It is our understanding the signal is in design and is estimated to be complete in June 2023, per TxDOT. TxDOT does not currently have a construction schedule, but they do not expect construction to begin for a few years.
- **d. SH-105** and **Buffalo Springs Drive Traffic Signal** It is our understanding the signal design is expected to be completed in June 2023. TxDOT does not currently have a construction schedule, but they do not expect construction to begin for a few years.
- **2. Biweekly Operations and Developments Call** We are continuing the biweekly operations and developments calls with City Staff and H2O Innovations.
- **3.** Emergency Preparedness Plan No engineering update. We will continue to follow up until plan approval is received. We are reviewing the plan in anticipation of hurricane season and will

complete any necessary updates.

- **4. Impact Fee Updates** We received all required files from Quiddity and are proceeding with Impact Fee updates as required per the City's Code of Ordinances.
- 5. Lonestar Parkway Bridge Repair It is our understanding the construction was awarded to Rebel Contractors at the May 9th meeting of the Montgomery County Commissioner's Court. It is also our understanding that the County will be requesting the City's share of the project now that the construction contract is awarded.
- **6.** Lonestar Parkway and Buffalo Springs Intersection Improvements We received plans for the intersection on behalf of the City and offered no objections on May 5th.
- **7. TWDB Annual Reporting** We received correspondence from the TWDB to complete the required annual reporting and usage projections by May 1st. We provided all requested reports and information to the TWDB on April 28th.





Down to the Wire: 10 Days to Go

With only 10 days left in the 88th Legislative Session, a few critical measures continue to make their way through the process. We ask that you continue to communicate with your legislative delegations on these critical issues. There are only a few more days before legislative deadlines give a clearer indication of what will finally pass and what will have to wait until the next legislative session.

The list below in no way represents every city-related bill that still has the ability to pass this session. It also doesn't account for the ability of certain concepts in bills that are no longer viable to be added to other bills still moving through the process, as amendments, if germane. The following list represents bills we commonly receive questions about from city officials. For all of these bills, we strongly encourage interested city officials to continue the dialogue with their elected senators and representatives about the impact of the legislation on their communities.

Preemption

• H.B. 2266 (Leach/Middleton) – H.B. 2266 would allow a state license holder to bring legal action against a city if city regulation results in adverse economic impact on the

license holder. The bill significantly expands city exposure to lawsuits regarding the impact of local regulations. H.B. 2266 passed the House and will be considered in the Senate Committee on Business and Commerce on Friday, May 19. TML prepared this <u>letter</u> in advance of the Senate committee hearing.

Land Use

- S.B. 1412 (Hughes) S.B. 1412 would authorize a property owner to build, sell, or rent an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) in any residential zoning district or un-zoned lot in a city. Further, the bill would prohibit a city from imposing regulations on ADUs, including certain regulations on size, parking, or external feature requirements. This would effectively preempt local regulation of ADUs in city neighborhoods. The committee substitute protects deed restrictions and homeowner association rules that limit or prohibit ADUs. TML provided the Senate Committee on Local Government this letter in opposition to the bill. S.B. 1412 passed the Senate and has been voted out of the House Land & Resource Management Committee.
- S.B. 1787 (Bettencourt) S.B. 1787 would prohibit a city from adopting or enforcing an ordinance that requires a residential lot to be larger than 1,400 square feet, wider than 20 feet, or deeper than 60 feet, or if regulating the density of dwelling units on a residential lot, a ratio of less than 31.1 homes per acre. It also prohibits the application of numerous land use regulations on "small lots," which are defined in the bill as lots that are 4,000 square feet or less. Applies to all cities in counties with a county population of 300,00 or more. TML provided this letter to the Senate Committee on Local Government. S.B. 1787 passed the Senate and has been voted out of House Land & Resource Management Committee.
- <u>S.B. 2037</u> (Bettencourt/Oliverson) S.B. 2037, as it passed the Senate, would prohibit a city from "directly or indirectly" regulating use and density of buildings in the ETJ, including a new prohibition on regulating minimum lot sizes in the ETJ. S.B. 2037 passed the Senate and has been voted out of House Land & Resource Management Committee.

Other

- <u>H.B. 471</u> (Patterson/Schwertner) H.B 471 would require cities to provide paid illness and injury leave for first responders for up to one year. The bill passed the House and has been voted out of the Senate Committee on Business and Commerce.
- <u>S.B. 767</u> (Parker) S.B. 767 requires a fee schedule of new and increased fees to be on the city's budget's cover page and for cities over 30,000 in population to establish and maintain an email notification service regarding new or increase fees. S.B. 767 passed the Senate and voted out of House Urban Affairs Committee.

Bills on the Move

Significant Floor Action

- H.B. 2127 (Burrows/Creighton), seeking to prevent cities and counties from adopting or enforcing local ordinances or orders related to any activity contained in several state codes. Passed the Senate.
- <u>H.B. 9</u> (Ashby/Huffman), creating the Broadband, Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program and the Broadband Infrastructure Fund. Passed the Senate.
- <u>H.B. 1132</u> (Spiller), increasing the threshold at which competitive bidding is required for city purchases from \$50,000 to \$100,000. Passed the House.
- **H.B.** 1191 (Cain), prohibiting a city from allowing six or fewer chickens in the boundaries of a city. Passed the House.
- **H.B.** 1750 (Burns/Perry), limiting city regulation of agricultural operations within city limits and ETJ. Passed the Senate.
- <u>H.B. 1819</u> (Cook/Hughes), repealing city juvenile curfew ordinances except for purposes of emergency management. Passed the Senate.
- **H.B. 3053** (**Dean/Paxton**), requiring election to be held November 7, 2023, on the question of disannexation of any area that was annexed by a city between March 3, 2015, and December 1, 2017. Applies to cities over 500,000 in population. Passed the Senate.
- **H.B. 3613** (Cain), requiring a city that is divided into districts, wards, or other areas to elect all councilmembers following each apportionment on the first uniform election date. Passed the House.
- <u>H.B. 4878</u> (Rogers), allowing an ESD to have exclusive authority to determine whether another person may provide services within the district that the ESD is authorized to provide, including when the ESD's territory overlaps with the territory of another political subdivision authorized to provide emergency services. Passed the House.
- <u>S.B. 3</u> (Bettencourt/Meyer), increasing the homestead exemption by a school district. The House committee substitute increases the homestead exemption from \$70,000 to \$100,000 and imposes a five percent appraisal cap. Passed to third reading.
- <u>S.B. 224</u> (Alvarado/Leach), increasing penalties and punishments for theft of a catalytic converter. Passed the House.
- <u>S.J.R. 3</u> (Bettencourt), increasing the homestead exemption by a school district. The House committee substitute increases the homestead exemption from \$70,000 to \$100,000 and imposes a five percent appraisal cap. Passed to third reading.

Significant Committee Action

- <u>H.B. 5</u> (Hunter/Schwertner), creating a new economic development program for tax abatement agreements between the owner of a new investment project and a school district. Left pending after hearing in Senate Business and Commerce.
- <u>H.B. 471</u> (Patterson/Schwertner), requiring cities to provide paid illness and injury leave for first responders for up to one year. Committee substitute voted from Senate Business & Commerce.
- <u>H.B. 2239</u> (**Troxclair/Flores**), providing a city may not prohibit the removal of Ashe Juniper trees located on residential property. Left pending after hearing in Senate Local Government.
- <u>H.B. 3492</u> (Stucky/Springer), prohibits cities from using the cost of constructing or improving public infrastructure as a factor in determining certain value-based fees related to engineering, inspection, and subdivision. Voted from in Senate Local Government.
- H.B. 3699 (Terry Wilson/Bettencourt), making numerous changes to the approval process for plats and plans, including limiting city authority regarding completeness checks for applications. Committee substitute, which would also prohibit a city from "directly or indirectly" regulating use and density of buildings in the ETJ, including a new prohibition on regulating minimum lot sizes in the ETJ, was voted from Senate Local Government.
- S.B. 369 (Campbell/Craddick), as filed, would provide that any area not receiving full municipal services is automatically disannexed as of December 31, 2023, unless the city is not required to provide full municipal services under an annexation service plan or has entered a written agreement. Senate floor amendments eliminated the automatic disannexation provision and set up a complaint process for a property owner to be disannexed. Left pending after hearing in House Land & Resource Management.
- <u>S.B. 560</u> (Springer), eliminating the ability of a city and building permit applicant from agreeing to a deadline for granting or denying a permit for residential construction beyond the 45-day building permit shot clock. Voted from House Land & Resource Management.
- <u>S.B. 1015</u> (**King**), relating to periodic rate adjustments by electric utilities. Committee substitute voted from House State Affairs. Placed on House Calendar for Saturday, May 20.
- **S.B.** 1117 (Hancock), defining video services to not include streaming for franchise fee purposes. Left pending after hearing in House State Affairs.
- <u>S.B. 1252</u> (**Bettencourt**), requiring certain language indicating a tax increase on ballot propositions. Committee substitute voted from House Ways & Means. Placed on House Calendar for Saturday, May 20.
- S.B. 1787 (Bettencourt), prohibiting a city from adopting or enforcing an ordinance that requires a residential lot to be larger than 1,400 square feet, wider than 20 feet, or deeper than 60 feet, or if regulating the density of dwelling units on a residential lot, a ratio of less than 31.1 homes per acre.

Applies to cities in counties with a population of 300,000 or more. Voted from House Land & Resource Management Committee.

S.B. 1999 (**Bettencourt**), defining "foregone revenue amount" as the voter-approval tax rate minus the actual tax rate multiplied by the preceding year's total value, and redefines "unused increment rate" as the sum of the preceding three years' foregone revenue amount divided by current value. Voted from House Ways & Means.

<u>S.B. 2018</u> (Flores), requiring a city to create a public camping complaint system and investigate every complaint. Left pending after hearing in House State Affairs.

S.B. 2035 (Bettencourt), prohibiting a city council from authorizing an anticipation note or certificate of obligation to pay a contractual obligation under certain circumstances, including if a bond proposition on the same project failed to be approved during the preceding five years. Voted from House Pensions, Investments and Financial Services.

S.B. 2037 (Bettencourt), prohibits cities from applying subdivision regulations and certain road and groundwater regulations in the ETJ. Voted from House Land & Resource Management.

S.B. 2350 (Bettencourt), defining "voter-approval tax rate" for the purpose of the unused increment rate calculation as a taxing unit's voter-approval tax rate in the applicable preceding tax year, as adopted by the taxing unit during the applicable preceding tax year, less the unused increment rate for that preceding tax year. Voted from House Ways & Means.

BDO Surveys for City and Resident Broadband Capabilities

The Texas Broadband Development Office (BDO) is in the process of developing the Texas Digital Opportunity Plan for achieving reliable and affordable broadband, device access, digital skills training, and cybersecurity awareness to expand digital opportunities for all Texans.

The BDO wants to hear from cities and their residents. To help facilitate such communication, the BDO has created two surveys: the <u>Digital Resources Mapping Tool Survey</u> (DRMT) and the <u>Digital Opportunity Public Survey</u> (DOPS).

The DRMT seeks information from cities about local broadband programs and services. The DRMT will take about 10 minutes to complete.

The DOPS seeks information from individual households about their experience with broadband internet accessibility, affordability, and adoption. The survey includes an optional speed test and is available in English, Spanish, Chinese, and Vietnamese. It is also audio-enabled to ensure that people with limited literacy, limited English proficiency, or visual impairments can hear the survey questions and answers. The BDO has also created the <u>Texas Digital Opportunity Public Survey Partner Toolkit</u> to help cities engage their residents and disseminate the DOPS. The toolkit includes the survey and provides public outreach suggestions and draft communication templates.

Federal Infrastructure Bill Update

In November 2021, the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. The IIJA is altogether a \$1.2 trillion bill that will invest in the nation's core infrastructure priorities including roads, bridges, rail, transit, airports, ports, energy transmission, water systems, and broadband.

The League will monitor state and federal agencies and work with the National League of Cities (NLC) to access the latest information relating to the IIJA. We will provide periodic updates in the Legislative Update on resources for Texas cities on how to access IIJA funding for local infrastructure projects.

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)

On April 19, the USDA began accepting applications for \$20 million in broadband technical assistance funding to support developing broadband cooperatives in rural communities. The Broadband Technical Assistance (BTA) program seeks to provide funding for rural communities through cooperative agreements with the USDA's Rural Utilities Service (RUS). The BTA defines rural communities as "any area not located in a city, town, or incorporated area with a population greater than 20,000 or an urbanized area next to a city, town, or incorporated area with a population greater than 50,000 people."

Eligible applicants include state and local governments. Eligible projects include:

- Identifying and planning for delivering broadband service to eligible rural areas.
- Identifying resources to finance rural broadband facilities.
- Preparing feasibility studies, financial forecasts, market surveys, environmental studies, and technical design information to support broadband services.
- Analyzing and improving broadband facilities operations.

Applications must be submitted by 10:59 PM CST on June 20, 2023. More information about the BTA program can be found here.

Reminder for Upcoming Deadlines

Applications for the Department of Transportation (DOT) Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program (CFI) for electric vehicle (EV) charging and alternative-fueling infrastructure projects are due by May 30, 2023. The CFI program will provide funding over five years to cities and other governmental entities to strategically deploy EV charging and other alternative vehicle-fueling infrastructure projects in publicly accessible locations in urban and rural communities across the county.
