MINUTES

Mayor Bryan Ayres led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The November 18, 2025, Mountain View Town Council meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Bryan Ayres. Those present were council members, Jamy Ferrin, Tori Carter, Brittney Brunski-Deckert and Michael Tims, Clerk, Penny Robbins, Deputy Clerks, Tammy Murray and Amber Brunski, and Public Works Director, Jacob Porter, Chief of Police Mark Erramouspe and Attorney, Brandon Taylor.

Motion by Tori Carter, seconded by Michael Tims to approve the agenda, motion carried.

Motion by Jamy Ferrin, seconded by Tori Carter to approve the November 3, 2025 minutes, motion carried.

Motion by Michael Tims, second by Tori Carter to approve **RESOLUTION 2025-09 - A RESOLUTION APPOINTING BRITTNEY BRUNSKI-DECKERT TO FILL A VACANCY ON THE TOWN COUNCIL**, motion carried.

Brittney Brunski-Deckert took the oath of office to fill the vacancy and was welcomed to the council.

Willow Drive and Parking signs addressed: Chelsea Brunski, a resident, expressed concern about recently installed "No Parking" signs on Willow Drive. She stated affected residents were not given public notice or an opportunity for input before the decision. She asked whether any safety incidents warranted the change, noting no known issues during her nine years of residence. She said the restriction devalues properties and creates daily inconveniences, as some homes have limited driveway space. Justin Case, another resident, noted he has never been personally affected by the traffic and feels the restriction unfairly limits parking for his visitors. Waylon Willett explained this has been a four-year issue, originally raised with previous town staff, concerning traffic flow and child safety during school drop-off times. He noted the school had rerouted traffic, leading to the current situation. The council agreed the decision was made hastily and without proper resident notification. A decision was made to remove all related signs on Willow Drive for now. The council will continue discussions, notify all neighborhood residents of future meetings on the topic, and consider long-term solutions.

Motion by Jamy Ferrin, seconded by Michael Tims to approve **RESOLUTION 2025-08 — A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF MOUNTAIN VIEW, WYOMING AUTHORIZING THE COMPLETION AND SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION FOR A TOWN OF MOUNTAIN VIEW SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL GRANT THROUGH THE WYOMING SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL PLANNING TASK FORCE AND AUTHORIZING THE TOWN CLERK TO ADMINISTER THE SAME**, motion carried.

Motion by Jamy Ferrin, seconded by Michael Tims to approve **RESOLUTION 2025-06– A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THAT A CALENDAR YEAR END BONUS BE AWARDED TO TOWN EMPLOYEES; TOWN CLERK TO DISTRIBUTE SAID PAYMENT TO EMPLOYEES AS DIRECTED BY MAYOR**, motion carried.

Motion by Tori Carter, seconded by Jamy Ferrin to accept the Master Service Agreement with Union Wireless and authorize the Town Clerk to sign, motion carried.
