Title: Fort Mojave Telephone, Inc. Broadband Presentation by General Manager Michael Scully
Background: On May 13, 2022, Fort Mojave Telephone, Inc. (FMTI) applied for a Loan/Grant to serve the Needles, CA area. Today, FMTI announced its intent to build fiber to the premise with the potential to serve more than 2,100 locations in Needles, CA that currently lack sufficient access to broadband.
FMTI will construct 40 miles of fiber cable over approximately 7.5 square miles to offer services up to 10 Gbps symmetrical via its fiber-to-the-premise network to the proposed funded service area. The project will improve the quality of life for these consumers by offering voice, broadband, video, and enterprise solutions. FMTI was awarded a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)/Rural Utility Service (RUS) 50% Loan/50% Grant on July 28, 2022, that totals \$7,009,160. The Loan/Grant will allow FMTI to build a 100% new system for the entire Needles area. FMTI has been completing environmental reviews and various legal documents and is preparing permit applications in order to begin construction as soon as possible.

Resolution No. 03-28-2023-SARDA

Resolution of the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles, declaring pursuant to California Government Code § 54221 that the real property identified as APN 0186-222-10-0000 is designated as exempt surplus land and not necessary for the Successor Agency's use at this time, finding that such declaration is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act, and taking related actions.

Background: The attached Resolution concerns one (1) vacant parcel of real property identified as APN 0186-222-10-000 that is owned in fee by the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles (the "SARDA") consisting of approximately 1.34 acres (approximately 58,370 square feet), as more particularly described below (the "SARDA Land"). The SARDA Land is located near the intersection of I-40 and US-95, zoned C-2 (General Commercial), is identified as a remnant portion of Site No. 1 within the SARDA's Long-Range Property Management Plan (the "LRPMP"). Subject to certain approvals described below, the SARDA intends to transfer the SARDA Land to the Needles Public Utilities Authority (the "Authority") for essential Authority Power Substation governmental purposes.

Review and Approval Process: As a requirement to the California Surplus Land Act (the "SLA"), Government Code (the "GC") §§ 54220-54333 (the "Act"), as amended by AB 1486 (Chapter 664, Statutes of 2019; "AB 1486") and SLA Guidelines promulgated thereunder by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (the "HCD") dated as of April 2021 (the "SLA Guidelines"), in order for the Successor Agency to dispose of real property, it must first comply with the Act and the SLA Guidelines. The Act, as expounded upon by the SLA Guidelines, provides that prior to disposition, such land shall be declared either surplus land or exempt surplus land before the public entity may take action to dispose of it consistent with the public entity's policies or procedures.

Regarding surplus land (i.e., non-exempt land), such property must first be made available under a procedure set forth in the Act and expounded upon by the SLA Guidelines, which includes a process requiring that a notice be given calling for written notices of interest from local public agencies and housing sponsors after the public entity owner has designated such land as surplus by the taking of a formal action at a public meeting of such public entity. With respect to exempt surplus land, the public entity must first take a formal action at a public meeting of the public entity designating the affected land as exempt surplus land based on findings supporting such designation that are consistent with the definition of exempt surplus land as specified in GC § 54221 (f), specifically

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and in this case, a local agency to agency transfer wherein the receiving agency plans to use such exempt surplus land for a public purpose.

In accordance with the Act, land is necessary for a public entity's use if the land is being used, or is planned to be used pursuant to a written plan adopted by the public entity, for the public entity's work or operations. With respect to the SARDA Land, the SARDA may only transfer the SARDA Land to another party and may not retain it for any purpose and, therefore, the SARDA may not plan for or use it for any work or operations.

The Authority previously used the SARDA Land in connection with its sewer system operations, which specifically consisted of the northwest portion of one of the Authority's three (3) percolation ponds that are employed as tertiary treatment in the wastewater treatment process and are designed to detain secondary effluent that is generated from the Authority's Waste Water Sewer Plant located north of and up-gradient from the SARDA Land.

The Authority engaged Brooks Consulting, LLC (the "Brooks") to evaluate the: i) condition of the Authority's current electrical power distribution system; and ii) improvements needed to meet increasing demands for electrical power service. In its June 2022 final report (entitled Needles Growth Challenges to the 69kV System and Moabi 12 kV Supply Line), Brooks recommended several improvements to the Authority's electrical power distribution system including, but not limited to, the development of a new electrical power distribution substation in the vicinity of the intersection of I-40 and US-95 (the "Substation").

The Authority has identified the SARDA Land as an ideal location for the Substation that it intends to develop and use it for public purposes in perpetuity (the "Authority Power Substation"). If approved, the attached Resolution will confirm the SARDA's declaration that the SARDA Land is exempt surplus land and not necessary for the SARDA's use and will confirm that the transfer of the SARDA Land to the Authority for its use with respect to the Authority Power Substation is eligible for an exemption pursuant to GC § 54221 (f) (1) (D) (which provides that transfers between public entities for public purposes are exempt).

Consistent with Section 400 (e) of the SLA Guidelines, a copy of the adopted Resolution declaring the SARDA Land exempt surplus land is required to be provided to HCD no later than 30 days prior to the disposition of the SARDA Land to the Authority. As a further prerequisite to the transfer of the SARDA Land to the Authority, the SARDA will also comply with the applicable requirements of the California Health and Safety Code and the LRPMP, which will require separate approvals by: i) the SARDA; ii) the Authority; iii) the San Bernardino Countywide Oversight Board; and iv) the California Department of Finance; and

Pursuant to § 15060 (c) (3) of the California Environmental Quality Act (the "CEQA") Guidelines (i.e., California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, §§ 15000-15387) (the "CEQA Guidelines"), approval of the attached Resolution is exempt from CEQA because the actions described herein will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment and the actions described herein are not a "Project", as defined within § 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Subject to related separate approvals by: i) the Authority; ii) the HCD; iii) the **Fiscal Impact:** CWOB; and iv) the DOF, the SARDA Land will ultimately be transferred to the Authority at no cost. Other than administrative costs associated with preparing the necessary documents and processing/presenting them to the appropriate entities and any required follow-up, there are not any other fiscal impacts. Costs associated with the Authority Power Substation will be the responsibility of the Authority.

Recommended Action: Approve Resolution No. 03-28-2023-SARDA declaring pursuant to California Government Code § 54221 that the real property identified as APN 0186-222-10-0000 is designated as exempt surplus land and not necessary for the SARDA's use at this time, finding that such declaration is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act, and taking related actions.

RESOLUTION OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF NEEDLES, DECLARING PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE § 54221 THAT THE REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS APN 0186-222-10-0000 IS DESIGNATED AS EXEMPT SURPLUS LAND AND NOT NECESSARY FOR THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY'S USE AT THIS TIME, FINDING THAT SUCH DECLARATION IS EXEMPT FROM ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW UNDER THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT, AND TAKING RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, this Resolution concerns one (1) vacant parcel of real property identified as APN 0186-222-10-000 that is owned in fee by the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles (the "Successor Agency") consisting of approximately 1.34 acres (approximately 58,370 square feet), as more particularly depicted in Exhibit "A" to this Resolution (the "Successor Agency Land"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency Land is located near the intersection of I-40 and US-95, is zoned C-2 (General Commercial), is identified as a remnant portion of Site No. 1 within the Successor Agency's Long-Range Property Management Plan (the "LRPMP"); and

WHEREAS, as a requirement to the California Surplus Land Act (the "SLA"), Government Code (the "GC") §§ 54220-54333 (the "Act"), as amended by AB 1486 (Chapter 664, Statutes of 2019; "AB 1486") and SLA Guidelines promulgated thereunder by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (the "HCD") dated as of April 2021 (the "SLA Guidelines"), in order for the Successor Agency to dispose of real property, it must first comply with the Act and the SLA Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the Act, as expounded upon by the SLA Guidelines, provides that prior to disposition, such land shall be declared either surplus land or exempt surplus land before the public entity may take action to dispose of it consistent with the public entity's policies or procedures; and

WHEREAS, regarding surplus land (i.e., non-exempt land), such property must first be made available under a procedure set forth in the Act and expounded upon by the SLA Guidelines, which includes a process requiring that a notice be given calling for written notices of interest from local public agencies and housing sponsors after the public entity owner has designated such land as surplus by the taking of a formal action at a public meeting of such public entity; and

WHEREAS, with respect to exempt surplus land, the public entity must first take a formal action at a public meeting of the public entity designating the affected land as exempt surplus land based on findings supporting such designation that are consistent with the definition of exempt surplus land as specified in GC § 54221 (f), specifically and in this case, a local agency to agency transfer wherein the receiving agency plans to use such exempt surplus land for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Act, land is necessary for a public entity's use if the land is being used, or is planned to be used pursuant to a written plan adopted by the public entity, for the public entity's work or operations; and

WHEREAS, with respect to the Successor Agency Land, the Successor Agency may only transfer the Successor Agency Land to another party and may not retain it for any purpose and, therefore, the Successor Agency may not plan for or use it for any work or operations; and

- WHEREAS, the Needles Public Utilities Authority (the "Authority") previously used the Successor Agency Land in connection with its sewer system operations, which specifically consisted of the northwest portion of one of the Authority's three (3) percolation ponds that are employed as tertiary treatment in the wastewater treatment process and are designed to detain secondary effluent that is generated from the Authority's Waste Water Sewer Plant located north of and up-gradient from the Successor Agency Land; and
- WHEREAS, the Authority engaged Brooks Consulting, LLC (the "Brooks") to evaluate the: i) condition of the Authority's current electrical power distribution system; and ii) improvements needed to meet increasing demands for electrical power service; and
- WHEREAS, in its June 2022 final report (entitled Needles Growth Challenges to the 69kV System and Moabi 12 kV Supply Line), Brooks recommended several improvements to the Authority's electrical power distribution system including, but not limited to, the development of a new electrical power distribution substation in the vicinity of the intersection of I-40 and US-95 (the "Substation"); and
- WHEREAS, the Authority has identified the Successor Agency Land as an ideal location for the Substation and has requested that the Successor Agency Land be transferred to the Authority to be used for the Authority Power Substation (the "Authority Power Substation"); and
- WHEREAS, if approved, this Resolution will confirm the Successor Agency's declaration that the Successor Agency Land is exempt surplus land and not necessary for the Successor Agency's use and will confirm that the transfer of the Successor Agency Land to the Authority for its uses with respect to the Authority Power Substation, is eligible for an exemption pursuant to GC § 54221 (f) (1) (D) (which provides that transfers between public entities for public purposes are exempt); and
- WHEREAS, consistent with Section 400 (e) of the SLA Guidelines, a copy of the adopted Resolution declaring the Successor Agency Land exempt surplus land is required to be provided to HCD no later than 30 days prior to the disposition of the Successor Agency Land to the Authority; and
- WHEREAS, as a further prerequisite to the transfer of the Successor Agency Land to the Authority, the Successor Agency will also comply with the applicable requirements of the California Health and Safety Code and the LRPMP, which will require separate approvals by: i) the Successor Agency; ii) the Authority; iii) the San Bernardino Countywide Oversight Board; and iv) the California Department of Finance; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to § 15060 (c) (3) of the California Environmental Quality Act (the "CEQA") Guidelines (i.e., California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, §§ 15000-15387) (the "CEQA Guidelines"), approval of this Resolution is exempt from CEQA because the actions described herein will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment and the actions described herein are not a "Project", as defined within § 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines; and
- WHEREAS, all of the prerequisites with respect to the approval of this Resolution have been met.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles, as follows:
- **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are a substantive part of this Resolution.
- Section 2. The Successor Agency Land is exempt surplus land consistent with GC § 54221 (f) (1) (D).

- Section 3. The City/Successor Agency Staff, through the City Manager/Executive Director, or designee is authorized and directed to provide the HCD with a copy of the adopted Resolution declaring the Successor Agency Land exempt surplus land no later than 30 days prior to the disposition of the Successor Agency Land to the Authority.
- This Resolution has been reviewed with respect to the applicability of the CEQA (Public Resources Code § 21000 et seq.). City staff has determined that the designation of the Successor Agency Land as exempt surplus land does not have the potential for creating a significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from further review under CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines § 15060(c)(3) because it is not a project as defined by the CEQA Guidelines § 15378. Adoption of the Resolution does not have the potential for resulting in either a direct or indirect physical change in the environment.
- Section 5. The City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of Exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines § 15062.
- Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.





The Authority has requested that the SARDA Land be redesignated as a government use site for essential Authority Power Substation purposes, as described above, and transferred to the Authority consistent with the intent of HSC § 34181 (a) to remain in public use in perpetuity. In this instance, the transfer of the SARDA Land to the Authority is eligible for an exemption under the SLA Guidelines pursuant to GC § 54221 (f) (1) (D) (which provides that transfers between public entities for public purposes are exempt). The matter of confirming the exemption via resolution will be considered separately by the SARDA Board.

Pursuant to § 15060 (c) (3) of the California Environmental Quality Act (the "CEQA") Guidelines (i.e., California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, §§ 15000-15387) (the "CEQA Guidelines"), approval of the attached Resolution is exempt from CEQA because the actions

described herein will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment and the actions described herein are not a "Project", as defined within § 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Fiscal Impact: Subject to related separate approvals by: i) the SARDA; ii) the CWOB; and i) the DOF, the SARDA Land will ultimately be transferred to the Authority at no cost. Other than administrative costs associated with preparing the necessary documents and processing/presenting them to the appropriate entities and any required follow-up, there are not any other fiscal impacts. Costs associated with the Authority Power Substation will be the responsibility of the Authority.



RESOLUTION NO. 03-28-2023-NPUA

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSION OF THE NEEDLES PUBLIC UTILITIES AUTHORITY, AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE TRANSFER OF THE REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS APN 0186-222-10-0000, TO THE NEEDLES PUBLIC UTILITIES AUTHORITY FROM THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF NEEDLES FOR ESSENTIAL AUTHORITY POWER SUBSTATION GOVERNMENT PURPOSES, AND APPROVING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code (the "HSC") § 34172 (a) (1), the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles was dissolved on February 1, 2012; and
- WHEREAS, consistent with the provisions of the HSC, the City Council of the City of Needles previously elected to serve in the capacity of the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Needles (the "SARDA"); and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to HSC § 34179, the SARDA previously established the Needles Oversight Board to assist in the wind-down of the former redevelopment agency through June 30, 2018, at which time it was dissolved by operation of law; and
- WHEREAS, consistent with HSC § 34179 (j), on July 1, 2018 the San Bernardino Countywide Oversight Board (the "CWOB") was established to assist in winding-down the dissolved redevelopment agencies within the County of San Bernardino; and
- WHEREAS, on October 14, 2015, the Needles Oversight Board approved its Resolution No. 10-14-2015-OB-SARDA, approving the SARDA's Long-Range Property Management Plan (the "LRPMP"); and
- WHEREAS, the LRPMP included three (3) real property sites, all of which are designated to be sold (the "LRPMP Properties"); and
- WHEREAS, based on matters unrelated to the LRPMP, on December 31, 2015, the California Department of Finance ("DOF") did not approve the SARDA's LRPMP and directed the SARDA to dispose of its remaining real property assets consistent with the applicable provisions of the HSC; and
- WHEREAS, the lack of DOF approval of the LRPMP did not affect or change the procedure required for the disposition of the SARDA's real property assets; and
- WHEREAS, to date, the SARDA has sold all of the LRPMP Properties except for a remnant of LRPMP Site No.1, as further described herein; and
- WHEREAS, LRPMP Site No. 1 is located near the intersection of I-40 and US-95 and consists of two parcels identified as APN 0186-222-11-0000 (an approximately 26.85-acre vacant parcel) and APN 0186-222-10-0000 (an approximately 1.34-acre vacant parcel), both of which are zoned C-2 (General Commercial); and
 - WHEREAS, effective upon the December 29, 2022 close of escrow, the SARDA sold APN 0186-

- 222-11-0000 to EVC Partners, LLC, leaving APN 0186-222-10-0000 (the "Property") as the SARDA only remaining LRPMP Property as depicted (via parcel map and aerial view) within Exhibit "A" attached hereto; and
- WHEREAS, the Needles Public Utilities Authority (the "Authority"), a California Joint Powers Authority, was formed pursuant to the California Joint Exercise of Powers Act (as codified in California Government Code § 6500, et seq.); and
- WHEREAS, the Authority previously has used the Property in connection with its sewer system operations, which specifically consisted of the northwest portion of one of the Authority's three (3) percolation ponds that are employed as tertiary treatment in the wastewater treatment process and are designed to detain secondary effluent that is generated from the Authority's Waste Water Sewer Plant located north of and up-gradient from the Property; and
- WHEREAS, the Authority engaged Brooks Consulting, LLC (the "Brooks") to evaluate the: i) condition of the Authority's current electrical power distribution system; and ii) improvements needed to meet increasing demands for electrical power service; and
- WHEREAS, in its June 2022 final report (entitled Needles Growth Challenges to the 69kV System and Moabi 12 kV Supply Line), Brooks recommended several improvements to the Authority's electrical power distribution system including, but not limited to, the development of a new electrical power distribution substation in the vicinity of the intersection of I-40 and US-95 (the "Substation"); and
- WHEREAS, the Authority has identified the Property as an ideal location for the Substation that it intends to develop and use for public purposes in perpetuity (the "Authority Power Substation"); and
- WHEREAS, the Authority has requested that the Property be redesignated as a government use site for the purpose of developing the Authority Power Substation, as described above, and transferred to the Authority consistent with HSC § 34181 (a) to develop and use for public purposes in perpetuity; and
- WHEREAS, subject to separate approvals by the CWOB and DOF, adoption of this Resolution will authorize the acceptance of the transfer of the Property from the SARDA to the Authority, at no cost, for essential Authority Power Substation governmental purposes pursuant to a quitclaim deed, that includes a certificate of acceptance, the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B"; and
- WHEREAS, as a further prerequisite to the transfer of the Property to the Authority, the Successor Agency will also comply with the requirements to the California Surplus Land Act (the "SLA"), Government Code (the "GC") §§ 54220-54333 (the "Act"), as amended by AB 1486 (Chapter 664, Statutes of 2019; "AB 1486") and SLA Guidelines promulgated thereunder by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (the "HCD") dated as of April 2021 (the "SLA Guidelines"); and
- WHEREAS, in this instance, the transfer of the Property to the Authority is eligible for an exemption under the SLA Guidelines pursuant to GC § 54221 (f) (1) (D) (which provides that transfers between public entities for public purposes are exempt) and the matter of confirming the exemption via resolution will be considered separately by the SARDA Board; and

WHEREAS, subject to separate approvals by the Authority, CWOB, DOF and HCD, adoption of this Resolution will authorize the acceptance of the transfer of the Property from the SARDA to the Authority, at no cost, for essential Authority Power Substation governmental purposes pursuant to a quitclaim deed, the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution has been reviewed with respect to applicability of the California Environmental Quality Act (the "CEQA"), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, § 15000 et seq., hereafter the "CEQA Guidelines"), and the City's environmental guidelines; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution does not constitute a "project" for purposes of CEQA, as that term is defined by CEQA Guidelines § 15378, because this Resolution is an administrative activity that will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment, per § 15378 (b) (5) of the CEQA Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, all the prerequisites with respect to the approval of this Resolution have been met.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE NEEDLES PUBLIC UTILITIES AUTHORITY, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are a substantive part of this Resolution.
- Subject to the approvals by the SARDA, CWOB, HCD and DOF, the acceptance of the transfer of the portion of LRPMP Site No. 1 identified as APN 0186-222-10-0000 from the SARDA to the Authority at no cost via quitclaim deed is approved.
- Section 3. The City Manager of the City of Needles, in the capacity as Executive Director of the Authority, or designee, is authorized and directed to execute the certificate of acceptance, the form of which is included within the quitclaim deed that is attached hereto as Exhibit "B," and to take such other actions and execute such other documents as are necessary to effectuate and close the no cost transfer the Property and as may otherwise be required to fulfill the intent of this Resolution.
- This Resolution has been reviewed with respect to applicability of the California Environmental Quality Act (the "CEQA"), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, § 15000 et seq., hereafter the "CEQA Guidelines"), and the City's environmental guidelines. This Resolution does not constitute a "project" for purposes of CEQA, as that term is defined by CEQA Guidelines § 15378, because this Resolution is an administrative activity that will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment, per § 15378 (b) (5) of the CEQA Guidelines.
- Section 5. The City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of Exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines § 15062.
- **Section 6.** This Resolution shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.



ORDINANCE NUMBER 660-AC

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEEDLES, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE NEEDLES MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING ARTICLE IX. HOUSING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, as provided in California Housing Authorities Law, Health and Safety Code sections 34200 et seq., since 1951, there has been a housing authority in the City of Needles ("City") known as the Needles Housing Authority; and

WHEREAS, in 1952, the City by resolution, declared that there was a need for a housing authority in the City because (a) insanitary or unsafe inhabited dwelling accommodations existed in the City, and/or (b) there was a shortage of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations in the City available to persons of low income at rentals they could afford, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34242; and

WHEREAS, since in or about 1952, the City Council has appointed residents of the City to serve as commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34270; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(a) provides, "As an alternative to the appointment of commissioners of the authority, the governing body of any county or city, at the time of the adoption of a resolution pursuant to Section 34240 or at any time thereafter, may declare itself to be the commissioners of the authority, in which case, all the rights, powers, duties, privileges and immunities, vested by this chapter in the commissioners of an authority, except as otherwise provided in this article, shall be vested in the governing body;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(b) provides, "If the governing body of any county or city has declared itself to be the commissioners of the authority, the governing body shall also appoint two tenants of the authority as commissioners if the authority has tenants, or within one year after the authority first does have tenants...;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(c) provides, "As an alternative to appointment of tenants of the authority as commissioners of the authority pursuant to subdivision (b), if a housing commission is created as provided in Section 34291, the governing body may make tenant appointments pursuant to subdivision (b) to the commission rather than to the authority;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34292 provides, "A governing body of a county or city which has declared itself to be the commissioners of the authority pursuant to Section 34290 may, by ordinance, create a housing commission. The number of members thereof, their terms of office, their qualifications, and the method of their appointment and removal shall be as provided by ordinance;" and

WHEREAS, Article IX of the City Charter provides that the City Council may create by ordinance or resolution such boards or commissions as in its judgment are required and may grant to them such powers and duties as are consistent with the provisions of this Charter; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Needles finds that it is in the best interest of the community, at this time, for the City Council adopt an ordinance creating a Housing Commission; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing notice was published in the Needles Desert Star on March 15, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Needles does ordain as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals reflected above are true and correct and are incorporated by this reference herein as the cause and foundation for the action taken by the and through this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. CEQA. Pursuant to section 15060(c)(2) of the California CEQA Guidelines, adoption of the subject Ordinance will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment and therefore is not subject to CEQA. Additionally, pursuant to section 15060(c)(3) the activity is not a "project" as defined in section 15378 because it has no potential for resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly.

SECTION 3. The City Council HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES that facts do exist to approve an amendment to the Needles Municipal Code ("Needles Code").

SECTION 4. The City Council HEREBY APPROVES Ordinance 660-AC amending the Needles Code as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This action shall become final and effective thirty (30) days after this decision by the City Council as provided by the Needles Code.

SECTION 6. Severability. If any section or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, or contravened by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining sections and/or provisions of this Ordinance shall remain valid. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance, and each section or provision thereof, regardless of the fact that any one or more section(s) or provision(s) may be declared invalid or unconstitutional or contravened via legislation.

SECTION 7. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance.

2-40 Housing authority established.

As provided in California Housing Authorities Law ("Law"), Health and Safety Code sections 34200 et seq., since 1951, there has been a housing authority in the City of Needles ("City") known as the Needles Housing Authority ("Authority"). in 1952, the City by resolution, declared that there was a need for a housing authority in the City because (a) insanitary or unsafe inhabited dwelling accommodations existed in the City, and/or (b) there was a shortage of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations in the City available to persons of low income at rentals they could afford, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34242. Pursuant to resolution adopted on February 14, 2023, the City Council ("City Council") of the City declared itself to be the Commissioners of the Authority pursuant to the Law.

2-41 Housing commission, created.

Pursuant to section 34291 of the Law, a governing body of a city which has declared itself to be the commissioners of a housing authority may, by ordinance, create a housing commission. A housing commission is created and established. Such housing commission may be known and referred to as the "Needles Housing Commission" or the "Housing Commission."

2-42 Members.

The Housing Commission shall consist of five (5) members who shall be qualified electors of the City. Two (2) of the members shall be appointed as tenants of the Authority and one (1) of the tenant appointments shall be over sixty-two (62) years of age if the Authority has tenants over that age. If a tenant appointment to the Housing Commission ceases to be a tenant of the Authority, he or she shall be disqualified from being a member and another tenant of the Authority shall be appointed by the City Council to the remainder of the unexpired term. The successor to a tenant appointment shall be a tenant of the Authority.

2-43 Appointments.

The members of the Housing Commission shall be appointed by the Council pursuant to section 900 of the City Charter, as may be amended from time to time.

2-44 Term.

Each member of the Housing Commission shall serve a four (4) year term and shall otherwise be subject to the terms of membership pursuant to section 902 of the City Charter.

2-45 Vacancies.

Vacancies on the Housing Commission shall be filled by appointment by the City Council pursuant to section 905 of the City Charter.

2-46 Regular meetings.

Regular meeting days of the Housing Commission shall be determined by resolution of the Housing Commission, except that the Housing Commission shall meet at least once each month. As set forth in section 904 of the City Charter, all proceedings shall be open to the public.

2-47 Duties.

The Housing Commission shall have the power and be required to review and make recommendations on all matters to come before the Authority prior to Authority action, except emergency matters and matters which the Housing Commission, by resolution, excludes from the Housing Commission's review.

2-48 Procedures for review and recommendation—Further functions.

Before a matter is acted upon by the Authority, the matter shall be submitted to the Housing Commission for its review and recommendation. Within thirty (30) days after a matter is submitted to the Housing Commission for its review and recommendation, the Housing Commission shall make and file its report thereon with the Authority. If the Housing Commission does not report upon the matter within thirty(30) days after its submission by the Authority, the Housing Commission shall be deemed to have waived its review and recommendations concerning the matter and the Authority may thereafter approve the matter without the report of the Housing Commission. From time to time, the City Council may, by ordinance or resolution, amend the procedures set forth in this section or provide for additional procedures for review and recommendation, and for further functions of the Housing Commission.

2-49 Records.

Accurate and permanent records of the acts of the Housing Commission shall be kept, and such records shall have the same status as records of other administrative departments of the City.

2-50 Organization.

The Housing Commission shall elect one of its members as chairperson and such election shall be held as soon as practicable after each new term commences. The Housing Commission shall adopt such rules and regulations as it deems necessary to provide for its other officers and their method of selection, and for other matters relative to its work and administration. Minutes, resolutions and official records of the Housing Commission shall be filed with the City Clerk.

2-51 Compensation and reimbursement.

Members of The Housing Commission shall serve without compensation for their services as such, but may receive reimbursement for necessary traveling and other expenses incurred on official duty when such expenditures have received authorization by the City Council.

Dear Ms. Bavan,

On February 14, 2023, the City Council of the City of Needles approved Resolution No. 2023-12 (attached Exhibit "A") declaring itself to be the Board of Commissioners for the Housing Authority of the City of Needles (HACN). The former Board of Commissioners of the HACN has been removed and the City Council members have been appointed the sole Board of Commissioners of the HACN.

On February 24, 2023, the HACN was notified that it had been designated "Troubled" by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") based on failing the Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) with an overall score of 43 (of 100) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022.

Since February 15, 2023, the HACN has taken immediate action to assess and identify the sources of performance deficiencies and has developed the following plan to recover its performance for long-term sustainability:

Financial Assessment:

The HACN has failed to timely complete financial statements, bank reconciliations, HUD filings, and financial statement audits. HACN has also failed to regularly adopt an annual budget. The following steps have been taken:

Audit Status:

- The 20-21 unaudited financial statements have been submitted to and accepted by HUD. The audit for that period is underway and is expected to be completed by March 31, 2023.
- The 21-22 unaudited financial statements were submitted to HUD on March 3, 2023. We are still awaiting acceptance from HUD. The auditor has informed the HACN that they anticipate beginning the 21-22 audit in April 2023.

 The HACN anticipates that there will be some deficiencies noted in the audit for 20-21. We have already begun addressing issues identified in the audit.

Budget Adoption:

- The HACN has no adopted budget for this fiscal year, yet expenditures continue to occur. City staff is providing the HACN staff templates for the Annual Operating and Capital Improvements budgets and will assist in the development of the budget. A compliant Operating and Capital Budget will be presented to the Board of Commissioners of the HACN for their approval on April 11, 2023.
- In the future, the HACN will be on the same budget preparation schedule as the City.

Management Assessment:

- On February 14, 2023, the City Council of the City of Needles approved Resolution No. 2023-12 (attached Exhibit "A") declaring itself to be the Board of Commissioners of the HACN. It also, appointed Mayor Janet Jernigan, and Vice Mayor Kirsten Merritt, as the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the HACN, respectively. (Completed)
- The former Board of Commissioners of the HACN have been removed and the City Council members have been appointed the sole Board of Commissioners of the HACN. (Completed)
- The HACN has designated the City Manager as the Executive Director and Administrator. (Completed)
- The City was accepted into HUD's Distressed Cities and Persistent Poverty Technical Assistance (DTCA) Program which will assist the HACN with building capacity to effectively manage the PHA inhouse. (Completed)
- The City has utilized Health and Safety Code Section 34279 which allows the City Attorney's Office to be the direct legal counsel to the HACN for legal support. (Completed)
- The City Manager acting as the HACN Executive Director provides bi-monthly reports to the Board of Commissioners of the HACN (attached Exhibit "B"). (Ongoing)
- Proposed Ordinance No. 660-AC will amend the Needles Municipal Code to create a Housing Commission that shall consist of five (5) members who shall be qualified electors of the City. Two (2) of the appointed members shall be tenants of the HACN with one (1) of the tenant appointments being over sixty-two (62) years of age if

the HACN has tenants over that age. (Anticipated Effective May 11, 2023)

- The City Manager acting as the HACN Executive Director has been granted access to HUD's Secure Systems and is in the process of receiving eLOCCS authorization. (To be completed by March 24, 2023)
- The HACN Board of Commissioners, Executive Director, Finance Director, and Assistant City Manager are in the process of completing HUD's Lead the Way Training. (To be completed by April 30, 2023)
- The HACN will utilize the City's expertise to review its current information systems (hardware, software, and telecommunications), acquire operating grants, purchasing and personnel policies, and implement an Agenda Management program for board meetings. (To be completed by June 30, 2023)

Affordable housing is critical to the City's economic prosperity. The lack of affordable housing has resulted in 450 new workers employed in Needles to seek housing in Arizona, weakening the City's effort to bolster existing businesses and recruit new retail businesses such as a grocery store or other restaurants and services. The City is in dire need of affordable housing for seniors, veterans, young families, and existing residents.

For all of the reasons stated above, the Board of Commissioners for the HACN humbly requests that HUD accepts this proposed recovery plan and remove the "troubled" designation status subject to ongoing reviews and monthly progress reports. Thank you for your consideration of this request.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-12

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEEDLES DETERMINING THAT THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL SERVE AS THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE NEEDLES HOUSING AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, as provided in California Housing Authorities Law, Health and Safety Code sections 34200 et seq., since 1951, there has been a housing authority in the City of Needles ("City") known as the Needles Housing Authority; and

WHEREAS, in 1952, the City by resolution, declared that there was a need for a housing authority in the City because (a) insanitary or unsafe inhabited dwelling accommodations existed in the City, and/or (b) there was a shortage of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations in the City available to persons of low income at rentals they could afford, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34242; and

WHEREAS, since in or about 1952, the City Council has appointed residents of the City to serve as commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34270; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(a) provides, "As an alternative to the appointment of commissioners of the authority, the governing body of any county or city, at the time of the adoption of a resolution pursuant to Section 34240 or at any time thereafter, may declare itself to be the commissioners of the authority, in which case, all the rights, powers, duties, privileges and immunities, vested by this chapter in the commissioners of an authority, except as otherwise provided in this article, shall be vested in the governing body;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(b) provides, "If the governing body of any county or city has declared itself to be the commissioners of the authority, the governing body shall also appoint two tenants of the authority as commissioners if the authority has tenants, or within one year after the authority first does have tenants...;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34290(c) provides, "As an alternative to appointment of tenants of the authority as commissioners of the authority pursuant to subdivision (b), if a housing commission is created as provided in Section 34291, the governing body may make tenant appointments pursuant to subdivision (b) to the commission rather than to the authority...;" and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 34292 provides, "A governing body of a county or city which has declared itself to be the commissioners of the authority pursuant to Section 34290 may, by ordinance, create a housing commission. The number of members thereof, their terms of office, their qualifications, and the method of their appointment and removal shall be as provided by ordinance;"

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Needles finds that it is in the best interest of the community, at this time, for the City Council to serve as Commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34290, the City Council of the City of Needles, California hereby declares itself to be the Commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority and that all rights, powers, duties,

privileges, and immunities vested by the Housing Authorities Law in such Authority shall be and are vested in said Commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the City Council hereby appoints Janet Jernigan, the Mayor, and Kirsten Merritt, Vice Mayor, from among its members to be the Chairman and Vice Chairman, respectively, of the Needles Housing Authority.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the rules of order of the City Council, as adopted from time to time, shall be the rules for the conduct of the meetings of the Needles Housing Authority.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that said Needles Housing Authority shall regularly meet on the days and at the times as the City Council of the City of Needles or as determined by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the City Manager shall inform the former Commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority who had been appointed pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34270 that from the effective date of this Resolution, the City Council is and shall be the sole Board of Commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager or his designee is hereby delegated all authority necessary to implement this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Recitals set forth above are true and correct.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all portions of this Resolution are severable. Should any individual provision or portion of a provision of this resolution be adjudged to be invalid and unenforceable, the remaining provisions and portions of provisions shall be and continue to be fully effective, except as to the provision(s) and/or portion(s) of provisions that have been judged to be invalid.

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective on its adoption.

Background: The Needles Housing Authority (NHA) was formed in the late 1940's for the purpose of providing affordable housing for Needles residents. Their primary project is to manage affordable housing units on Bailey Avenue. The NHA also provides rental vouchers for qualified low- and moderate-income individuals and families that qualify under U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and California Housing and Community Development Department guidelines. The NHA Board of Commissioners is appointed by the City Council on staggered terms.

Affordable housing is critical to the City's economic prosperity. The lack of affordable housing has caused over 450 new workers in Needles to seek housing in AZ weakening the City's effort to bolster existing businesses and recruit new retail businesses such as a grocery store or other restaurants and services. The City is in dire need of affordable for seniors, veterans, young families, and existing homeowners. The State Department of Housing and Community Development and U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development have made available billions of dollars for affordable housing for low- and moderate-income individuals and families based on the following identified income levels:

The Needles median household income approximately \$42,000, up over \$10,500 since 2018. The vast majority of Needles residents could qualify for senior, veterans, or first-time homebuyers housing programs, housing rehabilitation for existing resident homeowners, thus ending the housing shortage within 5 years. The City's future housing need is based on population and employment growth projections over the 2021–2029 period. Based on these projections, HCD assigns each region in California a Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA), which requires regions to address housing issues and needs (California Government Code Section 65584). Table 32 from the Needles Adopted Housing element shows the RHNA target for the time period from 2021 to 2029

for each of the five household income groups for the City of Needles. The City has a total of 87 units for its RHNA (shown below).

William Rhodes, Deputy Director of the LA Field Office has notified the City and the NHA that the NHA is being recommended for listing as a "Troubled Agency". The NHA is considered a "Late Presumptive Failure" resulting in zero points for its Financial Condition. The NHA has not submitted federally mandated financial statements or third-party audits for the last two years. The NHA also scored zero points for Management Operations. Their overall HUD evaluation indicates a 43 of 100 points leading to the Troubled Agency designation. The City has repeatedly offered to help the NHA with no response. There were no public meetings of the NHA Board from March 2020 until September 2022.

State law requires the NHA to report their accomplishments to the City annually. No report has been made in the last 10 years.

While the City has taken great strides in meeting it's housing policy obligations and is one of a very few of the local governments in full compliance with state law, the Southern California News Group recently wrote a series of articles which indicate that "Most cities are falling behind in affordable housing mandate." In that article they assign Needles an F in Housing Implementation. The NHA is the City's housing implementation agency.

Section 34290(a) provides that "As an alternative to the appointment of Commissioners of the authority, the governing body of any county or city, at the time of adoption of a resolution or anytime thereafter, may declare itself to be the Commissioners of the authority".

Conclusion: The NHA is not functioning properly, nor has it been in at least a decade in meeting the housing and economic development needs of Needle's businesses and residents. (The NHA has recently appointed a new Executive Director who is doing her best and should not be held accountable for a decade of leadership non-performance.)

Fiscal Impact: Affordable housing creates more housing options for the jobs that are being created locally and increases local tax revenue for the City.

Recommended Action: Approve Resolution No. 2023-12, prepared by the City Attorney which does the following:

 Declares the City Council to be the Commissioners of the Needles Housing Authority pursuant to California Health and Section 34290,

 Direct staff to develop a subsequent ordinance for City Council consideration to create a housing commission, similar to the Planning and or the Parks and Recreation Commission

Appoint the Mayor and Vice Mayor to be the Chair and Vice Chair of the Authority

 Declare that the City Manager or his designee is hereby delegated all authority necessary to implement this Resolution including financial and personnel/labor matters and to report regularly to the City Council on progress..

Background: The U.S. Housing and Development Department (HUD) assessed the Needles Housing Authority (NHA) and determined that it was a "Troubled Agency". The NHA scored 0 points in both Financial and Management categories. Recent Communications with HUD provides the NHA with the opportunity to develop a "Recovery Plan, but it must be submitted by March 24.. Failure to comply will result in further sanctions including dissolution.

Below are the deficient areas that City and NHA staff have been addressing in the last two weeks:

- Audit Status The 20-21 financial statements have been submitted and accepted by HUD. The audit for that period is underway. The 21-22 financial statements have been submitted, but not yet accepted. It is expected what when it is the auditor will undertake that audit. While that is the process, staff remains concerned about what the audit of the substance of the financial statement will produce.
- Budget Preparation The NHA has no adopted budget for this fiscal year. Yet expenditures continue
 to occur. City staff is providing the NHA staff the City budget templates for the Annual Operating and
 Capital Improvements budgets. Until the budget is developed and approved by the City Council
 acting as the NHA Board of Commissioners decisions on personnel and purchasing can't be made
 with confidence. A compliant budget can be accomplished in about 10 days.
- Personnel Transfers to City employment are on hold until the budget is approved.
- Purchasing and Personnel Policies -
- Personnel PolicyCity staff is preparing to have the City and NPUA's policy framework, processes, and protocols appliced to the NHA to assure financial oversight and control
- Training needed to be accomplished Staff and Board members must complete the 8 module training program as provided by HUD
- Access to HUD Financial System The City Manager has been designated the Executive Director and Administrator of the NHA and have been certified to use the HUD financial system. City staff have been authorized as users of the system.
- HUD Technical Assistance has been approved by HUD to train staff on all things necessary to know about operating a HUD compliant Housing Authority. HUD has hired a management consultant to assist staff.
- Legal Support The City Attorney's Office is now the legal counsel to the NHA. Separate billings have been established with the City Attorney.
- Operations Fund Grant Schedule has been provided by HUD and operating grants wil be sought.
- NHA Information Technologies are being reviewed by City staff to establish consistency with general City specifications to assure a seamless data communications.
- Housing Commission Creation Ordinance has been developed and presented to the City Council
 to create a citizen's advisory opportunity similar to the City Planning Commission, Parks and
 Recreation Commmissions and other advisory boards.
- NHA Insurance policies are being reviewed for compliance with City policy to minimize any City risk.
- Council/Governing Board Agenda Management Procedures and protocols are being developed in concert with the NHA to be able to agendize NHA matters requiring City Council/Board of Commissioners review and approval.

+



All in all much has been accomplished during the first month of assuming control and responsibility for the NHA. Of primary concern is the audits, budget, and Recovery Plan.

Fiscal Impact: Being assessed now

Recommendation: The City Council acting as the NHA Board of Commissioners accept this status report and direct the City Manager finalize the audits for 20-21 and 21-22, develop the NHA budgets, develop and submit the Recovery Plan, and apply sufficient comprehensive fiscal controls consistent with the existing City purchasing and personnel policies.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NEEDLES AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT GROUP, INC. FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CONSULTING SERVICES

1. PARTIES AND DATE.

This THIRD AMENDMENT TO CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT is made and entered into March 28, 2023 ("Effective Date"), by and between the CITY OF NEEDLES, a California Charter City, (hereinafter referred to as the "City") and Development Management Group, Inc., a California corporation (hereinafter referred to as "DMG"). City and DMG are sometimes individually referred to as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

2. RECITALS.

City and DMG entered into that certain CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NEEDLES AND DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT GROUP, INC. FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CONSULTING SERVICES ("Agreement") dated December 1, 2013 with a term commencing December 1, 2013 and and end date of June 30, 2015;

City and DMG entered into a FIRST AMENDMENT TO CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT dated March 22, 2022 ("First Amendment") which among other things increased the authorized compensation to DMG in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00);

City and DMG entered into a SECOND AMENDMENT TO CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT dated April 26, 2022 ("Second Amendment") which amended the Agreement to supersede the compensation terms in the First Amendment to authorize payments previously made by City and to be made against invoices through March 22, 2023.

The parties wish to further amend the Agreement to increase the term and compensation to as follows:

3. AMENDMENT.

Section 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. COMPENSATION. The term of the Agreement is extended until June 30, 2023 and the compensation is increased accordingly by Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$15,400). CONSULTANT and CITY acknowledge and agree that compensation paid by CITY to CONSULTANTS under this Agreement, as amended, is based upon Consultant's written proposal dated March 14, 2023 for providing the services required hereunder, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof by this reference.

All other terms of the Agreement not specifically amended shall remain in full force and effect.
