- a. Chapter 14 Buildings and Building Regulations, Article VI Dangerous Buildings and Hazardous Lands, Section 14-334 – Creating, keeping, maintaining, allowing the existence of dangerous buildings or hazardous lands, unlawful.
- b. Chapter 94 Traffic and Vehicles, Article V Abandoned Vehicles, Section 94-124 Wrecked or non-operating vehicles on private property No person in charge or control of any property within the city, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee, or otherwise, shall allow any partially dismantled, nonoperating, unregistered, wrecked, junked or discarded vehicle to remain on such property longer than 72 hours, and no person shall leave any such vehicle on any property within the city for longer time than 72 hours, except that this article shall not apply with regard to a vehicle in an enclosed building, a vehicle on the premises of a business enterprise operated in a lawful place and manner when necessary to the operation of such business enterprise, or a vehicle in an appropriate storage place or depository maintained in a lawful place and manner by the city.

Code Enforcement Officer, Greta Moreau presented a PowerPoint presentation with an overview of the violation.

The Respondents were not present at the meeting, nor was there anyone present on their behalf.

The Special Magistrate orders as follows:

- The Respondent is in violation. Magistrate Fugate ordered that the Respondent pay a fine of \$50.00 per day from the compliance date of December 17, 2025, (30 days from Special Magistrate's issuance of order). The fine will be imposed until violation is cured.
- 2. The Respondent will be responsible for the \$150.00 administrative cost of prosecution.

Stat. 162.09(3), the fines and costs imposed above shall become a lien upon the subject real property and upon any other real or personal property owned by the Respondent upon the recording of a certified copy of this order in the Official Records of Alachua County, Florida.

<u>Date set for Compliance</u>: By October 10, 2025 (45 days from Special Magistrate's issuance of order), the respondents were to cure the violation by removing the abandoned vehicles and placing a fence around the inground pool on the property, or a fine of \$50.00 per day will accrue until the violations are cured. The respondent is assessed \$150.00 to cover the cost of administering this code violation, and the full cost of prosecution will be assessed if the violation is not cured.

Code Enforcement Officer, Greta Moreau requested a continuance on the case to review recent information regarding a change in ownership of the property. Special Magistrate Fugate granted the continuance.

Respondent Ericka Solano (present) spoke on behalf of herself and her sister, Lizabeth Scala Thodde (not present). Ms. Solano spoke about her difficulty with obtaining an engineer for such a small job. She requested a reduction or recission of fines. Code Enforcement Officer, Greta Moreau informed Special Magistrate Fugate that the city agrees to a reduction of fines from \$8,250.00 to \$3,000.00 and \$150.00 in administrative cost. Special Magistrate Fugate recommended a reduction of fines to \$2,500.00 and \$150.00 in administrative cost, within 60 days of city commissioners final to for full payment and ordered his recommendation to go before the city commission for final ruling.
