6. Impact Fees Ordinance, Legislative Hearing and First Reading

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMISSION OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF CITY OF NEWBERRY. FLORIDA, REGARDING IMPACT FEES; CREATING A NEW CHAPTER 87 OF THE CITY OF NEWBERRY CODE OF ORDINANCES ENTITLED IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING GENERAL DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING RULES OF CONSTRUCTION AND GENERAL LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; PROVIDING ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE IMPOSITION, COLLECTION, AND USE OF IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTIONS, ALTERNATIVE IMPACT FEES, AND DEVELOPER CONTRIBUTION CREDITS; PROVIDING FOR IMPACT FEE REVIEW HEARINGS AND NOTICE REQUIREMENTS GOVERNING THE ADOPTION OF IMPACT FEES OR INCREASE OF IMPACT FEE RATES; PROVIDING FOR THE REVIEW OF IMPACT FEES AND FOR ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS AND LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS RELATED TO TRANSPORTATION IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION, COLLECTION, AND USE OF TRANSPORTATION IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS AND LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS RELATED TO PUBLIC BUILDING IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION, COLLECTION, AND USE OF PUBLIC BUILDING IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF IMPACT FEE RATES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Assistant City Manager/CFO Lee presented a PowerPoint on the Impact Fee Ordinance and the Impact Fee Study.

The Commission stated that Impact Fees will not be due on projects with approved subdivision plans before the Impact Fee Ordinance passes.

Motion made by Commissioner Farnsworth to approve the Ordinance 2023-14 on First Reading, at an 80% rate, with 10% per year increases until the 100% rate is reached, Seconded by Commissioner Coleman.

Legislative Public Hearing: Ordinance 2023-09/CPA 23-05, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by changing the future land use classification from Agriculture to Public on a site consisting of approximately 96 acres; identified by Alachua County Tax Parcel Numbers 02538-008-000 and 02538-009-001.

Attorney Ballou read Ordinance 2023-09 by title only.

Principal Planner Perez presented a PowerPoint of the staff report, and recommendation.

Motion made by Commissioner Mazon to approve Ordinance 2023-09, Seconded by Commissioner Farnsworth.

Legislative Public Hearing: Ordinance 2023-10/CPA 23-08, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by changing the Future Land Use classification from Agriculture to Public on a site consisting of approximately 2.5 acres; identified by Alachua County Tax Parcel Number 02538-004-000.

Attorney Ballou read Ordinance 2023-10 by title only.

Principal Planner Perez presented a PowerPoint of the staff report, and recommendation.

Motion made by Commissioner Mazon to approve Ordinance 2023-10, Seconded by Commissioner Farnsworth.

10. A request to rezone the existing municipal cemetery, wastewater treatment facility, and future environmental park from Agricultural (A) and Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) consisting of ±217 acres.

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Ordinance 2023-11/LDR 23-08, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Official Zoning Atlas of the City of Newberry by changing the zoning designation from Agricultural (A) and Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) on property generally located on the east side of County Road 337, between Southwest 15 Avenue and Southwest 30 Avenue, consisting of ±217 acres; identified by Alachua County Parcel Numbers: 02536-000-000, 02538-001-000, 02538-004-000, 02538-005-000, 02538-007-000, 02538-008-000, 02538-010-000, and 02538-009-001.

Mayor Marlowe read the quasi-judicial procedures and presentation order.

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Ordinance 2023-13/LDR 23-09, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Official Zoning Atlas of the City of Newberry by changing the zoning designation from Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) on property located at 120 Northwest 260 Street consisting of ±4.3 acres; identified by Alachua County Parcel Number: 02035-000-000.
