Motion to authorize issuance of a task order not to exceed \$110,000 to the City Attorney, which includes the City Attorney subcontracting for external legal services with Arnold Law Firm not to exceed \$100,000, to support the Charter School application was made by Commissioner Clark, Seconded by Commissioner Marden.
